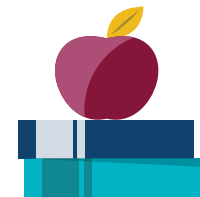

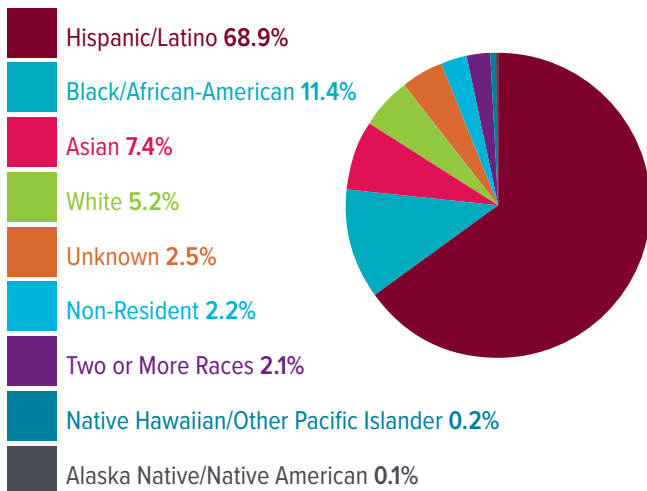

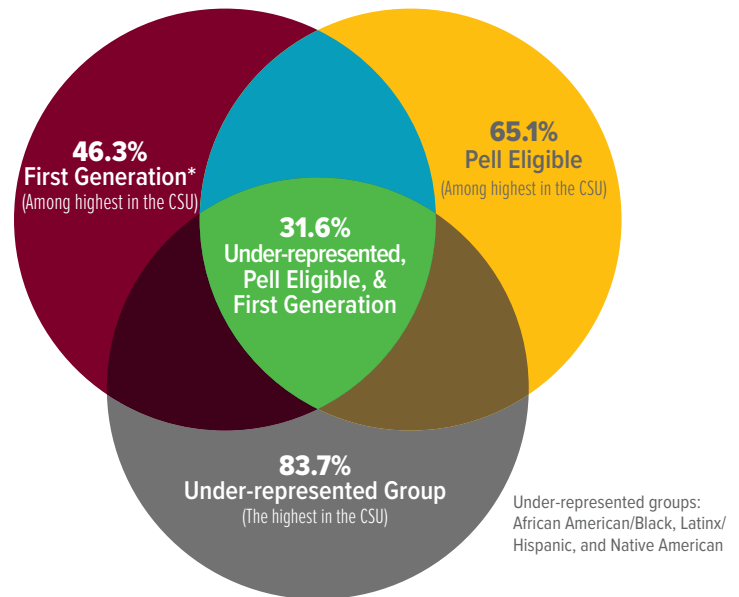

UNDERGRADUATE POPULATION

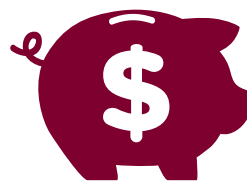

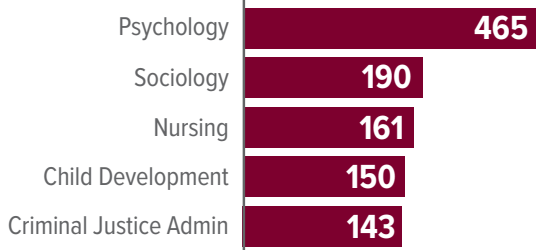

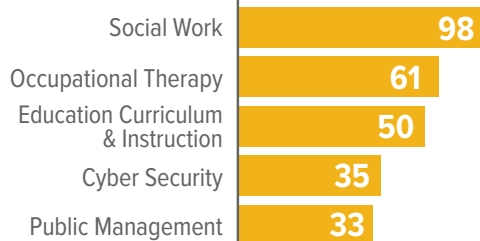
