## Special Notices

### Smoking Policy (Campus Smoking Policy - PM 91-01)

California State University, Dominguez Hills has a responsibility to its students and employees to provide a safe and healthful learning and working environment. As a result, the following policy will be enforced:

- Smoking is prohibited in all campus buildings, including offices, work areas, classrooms, lecture halls, laboratories, libraries, theatres, practice rooms, listening rooms, gymnasiums, the Student Union, meeting rooms, stairwells, elevators, eating areas and restrooms. Certain areas external to buildings which do not have adequate ventilation (e.g. patios, stairways and walkways) may also be designated as non-smoking areas by the director of Environmental Health and Safety.

- Smoking is also prohibited in all state automobiles, vans and trucks.

- The only exceptions are designated smoking areas.

**NOTE:** Advance Registration Fee Deadline Date **July 9, 1993**. Regular and Late Registration fee payments are due and payable on the date stated on **Schedule Confirmation and Account Statement**. If fees are not paid at designated times, students may be disenrolled from the University.

## General Registration Procedures

Each CSUDH student who is eligible to register for a given registration period will be mailed a preprinted **Registration Ticket**. The student must bring this completed form to the registration site (SCC J-127) during the priority hour indicated.

Prior to coming to the registration site (SCC J-127), the student must:

- Review the data preprinted on the front of the form. If inaccurate, file the appropriate form (i.e. **Change of Address**) to make corrections.
- If required, secure academic and/or ASAP advisor's written approval. See the front of the **Registration Ticket** for "advisor's signature" notation.
- Clear all holds indicated on the front of the **Registration Ticket**.
- Complete **Program Planning Sheet** on the back of the **Registration Ticket**; complete and have authorizations for both the preferred and alternate course selections.
- Secure appropriate authorization for classes requiring special permission. Check the *Class Schedule* footnotes for courses requiring special authorization. Students who do not have appropriate authorization for designated courses will be asked to leave the registration site to secure such approval.

- If you are an undergraduate student, obtain EPT/ELM approval on the **Registration Ticket**. Early EPT/ELM advising and approval will be available for continuing students in the University Advisement Center (SCC M110).
- If you are registering for over 15 units, you must secure an advisor's written approval to authorize the unit load. If you are registering for over 21 units, you must additionally secure the signature of your school dean.

- After the **Registration Ticket** has been processed, each student will receive a **Schedule Confirmation and Account Statement**.
- Students with financial aid awards will have the awards credited on their account statement. **This does not complete the registration process.** Students whose fees will be paid from their financial aid awards must comply with the instructions sent to them by the Financial Aid Office. Failure to do so will result in the student being disenrolled.
- Fees can be paid by cash, check, money order, VISA or MASTERCARD. Payment of the "Total Due" reflected on the Account Statement must be received in the Cashier's Office by the stated due date. Students who fail to satisfy this requirement will be disenrolled.



## Late Registration Procedures

Continuing and new students who do not take advantage of advance or regular registration may register late beginning Monday, August 30, 1993. Students may begin late registration on the first day the class meets (not necessarily the first day of classes). Students should use their mailed **Registration Ticket** for late registration processing. Late registration will take place in the Office of the Registrar. New students may not register until they have been formally admitted to the University or issued a "Conditional Registration Contract."

Students must report to the late registration area if they fall into one of the following categories:

**Eligible Continuing and New Students** who did not register during the advance or regular registration periods must bring their **Registration Ticket** to the Office of the Registrar.

**Students who registered** during advance or regular registration but were disenrolled because they failed to pay fees must report to the late registration area.

**New Students who were admitted too late** for the regular registration must bring the completed **Registration Ticket** sent to them at the time of admission.

**Contract Registration Students** who signed a contract for Conditional Registration must bring the completed **Registration Ticket** and a copy of the contract.

Each student will be given instructions on procedures to follow to register for classes. Students must complete the late registration process by September 17; payment of the "Total Due" reflected on the **Account Statement** must be received in the Cashier's Office by the stated due date. Students who fail to satisfy this requirement will be disenrolled. All students registering late will be charged a \$25 non-refundable late registration fee.

Students who are registering late must obtain proper signatures on the **Registration Ticket**. *Signatures obtained on a "Change of Program" form will not be accepted.*

## Student Registration Eligibility

### CONTINUING STUDENTS

If you attended CSU Dominguez Hills as a regular non-extension student this past fall or spring, you should receive registration materials in the mail.

*You are a continuing student if:*

- 1) You were enrolled last fall or spring, *and*
- 2) You have not attended another academic institution since last attending CSU Dominguez Hills, *and*
- 3) You have not graduated from CSU Dominguez Hills or applied to graduate for a term prior to Fall 1992.

If you are an eligible continuing student and have not received your registration ticket or a letter regarding ineligibility one week before the registration period, please call the Registration Unit at 516-3601.

### NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS

Students admitted by the published deadline for the term are notified of eligibility by mail and sent materials for regular registration. The CSU System requires all new students born after January 1, 1957 to either submit proof of immunity to measles and rubella or to be immunized against these diseases. Students can get a combined measles/rubella vaccination free of charge at the Student Health Center.

*You are a returning student if:*

- 1) You attended another academic institution since last attending CSU Dominguez Hills, *or*
- 2) You graduated from CSU Dominguez Hills and you wish to begin post-baccalaureate studies.

Returning students must reapply for admission.

### CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

Students from other CSU campuses enrolling through concurrent enrollment will be issued a **Registration Ticket** with an appointment time for regular registration. Consult the *University Catalog* and contact the Registration and Records Office for procedures and deadlines.

A student enrolled at the University may enroll concurrently at another institution by filing a **Petition for Concurrent Enrollment** or the **Intra System Concurrent Enrollment Form** for enrollment in a CSU system campus with the Office of the Registrar after securing written approval by the academic advisor. Permission will not be granted when the schedule for the proposed combined program exceeds the units authorized at this University for full-time study.

Students planning to apply for Concurrent Enrollment at another campus are urged to register and pay fees at CSU Dominguez Hills during Advance Registration to facilitate early application and registration at the host campus.

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

All international students must clear their "registration hold" to validate their health insurance coverage and full-time enrollment. To do so, contact Dan A. Joseffini, international student advisor, in SCC N126.

International Students must provide proof of health coverage prior to registration. This proof must be a membership card or official letter indicating the expiration date and amount of coverage for personal policy.

If students have not made prior insurance arrangements and do not have proof of insurance on the day of registration, they will be required to take out and pay for the Renaissance Insurance Plan, in order to register. This plan is the only health insurance plan available to international students on campus. The term of coverage must be for *August 31, 1993 through August 31, 1994*. If there are any questions, please call 516-4215 to make an appointment with the international student advisor.

A non-resident student who is a citizen and resident of a foreign country and not a citizen of the United States, may pay the required non-resident tuition fee on an installment basis. This is limited to three equal payments established at the time of registration. Prior arrangements must be made.



## OPEN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

Individuals 18 years of age or older may apply to the Division of Extended Education to enroll in courses without being officially admitted to the University. Matriculated students who are eligible to enroll as regular students may not enroll partially or completely in courses through Open University.

### Required Approvals for Registration

#### ADVISOR'S SIGNATURE

An advisor's signature indicates that the student has met with an advisor who has given approval for the courses listed on the **Registration Ticket**. Such approval denotes that the student has met course prerequisites, is prepared for this coursework, and that the courses are appropriate for the student's goals. Furthermore, the signature attests that the number of units is suitable for the student's circumstances and that special consent (see below), if required, has been obtained.

An advisor's signature of approval is required on the **Registration Ticket** on at least three occasions and/or if a student is on academic probation:

- Upon entering the University
- At the completion of 60 semester units
- At the completion of 90 semester units

However, students may be required to obtain written approval on a more frequent basis. Use the following guidelines:

- Declared Majors**  
Since some departments require written approval every semester, check with your major department to determine its policy.
- Undeclared Majors**  
Students must obtain an advisor's written approval from the University Advisement Center each semester.
- Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)**  
Students must obtain written approval from an EOP academic advisor.
- Admission Exceptions (Special Admits)**  
For their first year on campus, Special Admits must obtain an advisor's written approval at the University Advisement Center.
- Unclassified Post-Baccalaureate Students**  
An advisor's signature of approval may be obtained at the Graduate Studies Office or the University Advisement Center once course consent has been acquired from the appropriate department.
- All other Post-Baccalaureate and Graduate Students**  
Obtain required written approval at department or program offices.

#### INSTRUCTOR'S SIGNATURE FOR DESIGNATED COURSES

Certain courses are listed in the *Class Schedule* as requiring instructor and/or department authorization. Students should obtain such consent prior to registering. The required stamp or signature must appear in the "Authorization" column on the **Registration Ticket**. An advisor's signature does not substitute for the required course authorizations.

#### INSTRUCTOR'S SIGNATURE FOR AUDITING CLASSES

Auditors must pay the same fees that would be charged if the course were being taken for credit. Instructor approval is required. Obtain an "Approval for Audit" form from the Registration and Records Office. Consult the *University Catalog* for specific requirements and instructions.

#### PERMISSION TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES WITH A TIME CONFLICT

Students are not allowed to enroll in two classes that meet at the same time, without specific approval on the **Petition for Permission to Register for Courses with a Time Conflict**. A student found to be enrolled in conflicting courses without the form on file will be required to resolve the conflict. The petition form is available at the Registration and Records Office and must be approved and be on file at the office by the census date.

#### PERMISSION TO REGISTER FOR MORE THAN 15 UNITS

All students enrolling in 16-21 units are required to have an advisor's signature approving the unit load. Students enrolling in more than 21 units must also obtain the approval of the dean of the school in which the student is majoring. Undeclared majors must obtain the approval of the director of the University Advisement Center.

#### INSTRUCTOR'S SIGNATURE FOR LATE REGISTRATION

An instructor's signature is required to enroll in each class during late registration.

## Refunds

All refunds are made in accordance with Title V of the *California Administrative Code*.

Not all fees are refundable.

Refunds are not automatic. Students need to obtain a "Refund Application" form from the Records and Registration Office.

Last day to apply for student registration fee refund is September 17, 1993.

\$10 is retained by the University to cover processing and non-refundable portion of State University Fee.

Where applicable, the percentage of the refund is determined by the date the "Refund Application" is received in the Records and Registration Office.

A total or partial refund dependent upon the unit reduction, is less \$10. (No refunds after September 17, 1993)

Students whose unit load drops from 6.1 or more units to 6.0 or fewer units may apply for a refund of the difference between the higher and lower fees.

# Schedule for Change of Program, Add & Drop, and Late Registration

Note: Students are responsible for initiating action and completing the process for change of program by the deadlines below. Students are responsible for initiating any change of program. All forms are available from and must be personally returned to the Records and Registration Office for processing. Students are not automatically dropped. It is the student's responsibility to officially drop a class; non-attendance without properly dropping can lead to the issuance of a "U" grade. However, in some cases, faculty may initiate a formal drop of students who have not attended the first two class meetings (or the first meeting if a class meets only once a week), and have not notified the faculty member that the absence is temporary.

## Change of Program

- A change of program is any change that is made in a student's official schedule. Such a change includes: dropping a class, adding a class, changing the number of semester units for a class in which the student is registered, changing the section of the same course. It is the student's responsibility to verify the classes listed on the Schedule Confirmation.
- ID Card or receipt required for all changes and withdrawals.
- All change of program forms, CR/NC, audit, and withdrawal forms are obtained from and must be returned in person (no mailing) to the Records and Registration Office during office hours.
- Department chair approval is required to drop MAT 003, MAT 005, MAT009, ENG 088 and ENG 099.



# Academic Skills and General Studies Requirements for Undergraduate Students

Note: Consult the *University Catalog* and select an advisor for your academic program. If you have a declared major/minor, consult the appropriate department. If your major is undeclared, contact the University Advisement Center (SCC-M110, 516-3538) for an appointment. Students should consult an advisor upon entry to the university and every semester thereafter.

## Academic Skills Assessment Plan (ASAP)

The California State University (CSU) system and California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSU Dominguez Hills) recognize each student's need for adequate preparation in mathematics, English, reading and critical thinking for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education.

The CSU system requires all freshmen and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level skills in two areas: English composition and mathematics. To ensure that students who need additional work in one or more of the basic skills receive this preparation early in their college career, CSU Dominguez Hills implemented the Academic Skills Assessment Plan (ASAP) in fall, 1984, for newly admitted freshmen and transfer students. All new and returning undergraduate students admitted fall 1986 or later must meet these requirements.

The Academic Skills Assessment Plan has three skill levels:

1. Entry Level Skills
2. Basic Skills
3. Graduation Writing Skills

## COMPLETION OF THE ENTRY LEVEL SKILLS REQUIREMENT

The CSU requires new non-exempt and returning students to take the English Placement Test (EPT) and the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) Test after they are admitted. Students might be exempted from one or both of the tests if they have scored well on other specified tests or completed appropriate courses. For a list of exemptions, consult the *University Catalog*. Unless exempt, students must take the EPT and ELM no later than their first semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills. Non-exempt students who do **not attempt** these tests by the end of their first semester of enrollment will receive special advisement and will be required to enroll in the appropriate college preparatory English and/or mathematics course until they have fulfilled the EPT and/or ELM requirements. Non-exempt students who have not taken these tests by the end of two semesters will be ASAP disqualified and may not enroll in subsequent terms.

Students who must take appropriate developmental English and/or mathematics coursework must complete it in a timely manner. If they have not passed the coursework, they will be placed on probation after two semesters and disqualified after four semesters. Students will not be allowed to drop any developmental class (even during the first three weeks) without the department chair approval of either the Mathematics Department (for MAT 003, MAT 005, MAT 009) or the English Department (for ENG 088, ENG 099).

## COMPLETION OF THE BASIC SKILLS REQUIREMENTS

Students who have not completed their Basic Skills requirements in English composition and mathematics by the end of their fourth semester (total) of enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills will be placed on ASAP probation and receive special advisement.

Students who have not completed their Basic Skills requirements in English composition and mathematics within six semester (total) of enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills will be ASAP disqualified (ref. Executive Order No. 393, V. Administrative-Academic Disqualification) and will not be readmitted to CSU Dominguez Hills until those requirements have been completed.

## COMPLETION OF THE GRADUATION WRITING SKILLS

All students subject to degree requirements in the 1979-80 and subsequent general catalogs must demonstrate competency in writing skills as a requirement for graduation through one of the options listed under the entry for the Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR) in the *University Catalog*.

### Completion of the GWAR

Students who do not meet this requirement within two (2) semesters after completing the English Composition section of the Basic Skills requirements (or 90 semester units total, whichever comes last) will receive special advisement. In addition, they will be required to enroll in ENG 350 or another approved upper division course until they successfully complete the requirement.

## VOLUNTARY TESTING

A test, for which a fee will be charged (Graduation Writing Examination, GWE) is available to students at regularly scheduled intervals. Students wishing to pursue this option are encouraged to take the test early in their junior year, if they are undergraduate students, or upon entrance to a graduate program if they are graduate students. Students are allowed to take the test only twice. The voluntary test is administered each semester. Information on test date and procedures for sign-up are available in the Information Center.



## General Studies

### STATUTORY REQUIREMENT

In addition to the General Studies/General Education requirements, students also must satisfy the requirements in U. S. history and government by completing the following:

HISTORY 101 or examination  
and  
POLITICAL SCIENCE 101 or examination

### CERTIFICATION

Accredited community colleges and public four-year colleges may sanction (certify) that all or part of general education requirements (post 1980) have been met. Transfer students with complete certification of California State University General Education breadth requirements or Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) requirements are not required to complete additional lower division courses in general education. However, all students are required to take 9 units of upper division general education. Transfer students should request that their college "certify" their general education.

### DOUBLE COUNTING GENERAL STUDIES COURSES

Lower division General Studies courses may be double counted. Under certain conditions and within specific majors, upper division General Studies courses may be double counted. Consult the *University Catalog* and/or an academic advisor.

### The Current General Studies Program

The General Studies program is divided into three components and requires 52-59 semester units:

Basic Skills ..... 14-17 units

General Education:

Natural Sciences ..... 9 units  
Humanities ..... 9 units  
Social Sciences ..... 9 units  
The Whole Person ..... 2-3 units

Upper Division Integrative Studies: ..... 9 units

Continuing Dominguez Hills students prior to fall 1980 and transfer students in continuous enrollment at a California Community College or a CSU campus since 1980-1981 may have the option of choosing the former General Education program. If you are uncertain about which program applies to you, consult an advisor at the University Advisement Center.

In addition, students must take a course emphasizing cultural pluralism (0-3), which can satisfy General Studies or other graduation requirements as well. All students must take three upper division courses in General Studies, and all students must take three General Studies courses at CSU Dominguez Hills. The statutory requirement in American Institutions (HIS 101 or examination and POL 101 or examinations) is NOT part of the General Studies program, but is a graduation requirement.

The current General Studies program is required of all students who enter CSU Dominguez Hills or a California Community College as first-time freshmen beginning fall 1986.

# Testing Information

The Testing Office and some departments offer tests throughout the academic year. It is important to meet with an advisor to review which test you should take. Separate fees are charged for each test.

## Credit-by-Examination

Some courses may be taken by Credit-by-Examination. Only registered students may apply for credit by examination. It is important to read the conditions and restrictions in the current *University Catalog*. A **Petition for Credit-by-Examination** must be filed by the dates designated by the Registrar. Forms may be obtained from the Records and Registration Office.

### CREDIT BY EXAMINATION FOR HEA 300: HEALTH IN PUBLIC EDUCATION

To be admitted to the testing room, a student must do the following:

- A. Register for the course.
- B. Attend all class sessions prior to the written examination. Students failing to attend class will be dropped from the roster.
- C. Bring the completed **Credit-by-Examination** petition to the Health Science office located in the Student Health center *no later than September 7, 1993*.

The two-part Credit-by-Examination is as follows:

**Part I:** A *written examination* to be given on Thursday, September 9, 1993 in a room to be announced. To pass the written part of the exam, a student must earn a "C" or better. *If the student passes the written examination and completes CPR certification (see Part II), the letter grade received on the written examination will be assigned for the course.*

**Part II:** Proof of current CPR certification by one of the following ways:

- a. Presentation of current CPR certification that meets the standards of the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross.
- or*
- b. Certification by passing special CPR training offered on the CSUDH campus by certified personnel during the third week of the semester. There will be a nominal fee for the training.

To receive a passing grade in HEA 300 Credit-by-Examination, both parts must be passed by the end of the third week of the semester. *If the student fails the examination, the student has two options:*

- A. Remain enrolled in the course and complete it for a letter grade.
- B. Officially drop the course before the deadline to drop a course.

### CREDIT BY EXAMINATION FOR ENGLISH 110, 111, 350 AND 352

Students wishing to earn credit by examination for English 110, English 111, English 350 or English 352 must take an examination at 10:00 a.m. on **Saturday, September 11, 1993**.

Students taking the Graduate Exercise or examinations in English 350 or 352 are asked to report to SBS B-140. Students taking examinations in English 110 and 111 are asked to report to SBS B-131.

*To be admitted to the testing room, each student must:*

1. Register for the course.
2. Fill out a petition to take the test. Petition forms are available in the English Department Office, HFA E-315 and must be on file in the English Department Office (HFA E-315) before noon, **Thursday, September 9, 1993;**  
*and*
3. Provide verification of satisfactory performance on tests or in courses. Verification in the form of letters of notification, scores reported by testing agencies, grade slips, or transcripts will be checked before the petition forms are accepted by the English Department Office.
4. Present an official picture ID such as a CSUDH Student Identification Card or a driver's license to the test administrator.

*Each student petitioning to take:*

- English 110** is required to have an English Placement Test (EPT) score of: T-155 and E-8 or higher. A student exempted from the EPT on the basis of a satisfactory score on the EEE, AP, SAT-Verbal, ACT, or College Board Achievement Test in English Composition with **essay** may attempt to earn credit by examination. (Only test scores will be used to determine the eligibility of a student.); **English 111** must have completed English 110, or its equivalent, with a grade of "B" or better. Eligible students may apply for credit by examination for both English 110 and 111 at the same time.
- English 350** is required to have completed English 110 and 111 or their equivalents **with an average grade of "B" or better;**
- English 352** must show a passing score of at least eight (8) on the graduation competency in writing examination or have successfully completed English 350, Advanced Composition, or the equivalent with a grade of "B" or better. They also must have completed English 110 and 111 or their equivalents.

Students who are unsuccessful in their attempts to earn credit by examination may remain in the class, complete the work, and be awarded credit at the end of the semester. Students who pass the examination may NOT remain in the class



to earn grades better than those earned on the examination. They may, however, retake the course in a later semester to improve grades lower than "C" in accordance with the Repeat and Cancel Policy.

More information on earning credit by examination appears in the current *University Catalog*.

All students should bring an 8-1/2 x 11" blue book to the examination.

## GRADUATE EXERCISE IN ENGLISH

Graduate students in the English Department are required to pass the Graduate Exercise. Students are expected to fulfill this requirement at the start of their graduate work.

The exercise, scheduled for Saturday, September 11, 1993, at 10:00 a.m. in SBS B140, will consist of analyzing a short poem. Students may bring a dictionary.

## BUY BACK POLICY

Used books are bought by the bookstore at all times. Fifty percent of current list prices will be paid for the books in good resalable condition, if they are useable at CSU Dominguez Hills again as texts the following semester and quantities do not exceed estimated enrollments.

National market value will be paid for books in good resalable condition that are not to be used at CSU Dominguez Hills again the following semester, but are current elsewhere. National market value usually is approximately 10-25% of the new book price for hardbound books and 10 cents on the dollar for paperbacks. This national market value payment is offered only as a service to students who want to dispose of unwanted textbook without a complete loss. The bookstore realizes no profit in the exchange.

## Graduation, Application for

All degree candidates must file an "Application for Graduation" with the Office of the Registrar in accordance with the following schedule:

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

All newly admitted international students must attend a *mandatory* International Student Orientation Program on Monday, August 23, 1993 from 10:00 a.m. - noon in SCC E153. Registration cards will be available at this program.

## Parking

All vehicles that park on campus must display a valid parking permit (Section 21113a CVC). Semester permits are purchased at the Cashier's Office (SCC B-135). Daily parking permits are purchased from the dispensing machines located at: Lot 1, Information Booth, Lot 3a, Lot 3, and Lot 4. Vehicles are to park head-in, using marked stalls only.

Daily parking permits must be displayed on the dashboard. Semester parking permits are displayed inside the front windshield on the driver's side. Permits must be in plain sight at all times (car covers are not recommended).

Motorcycles and scooters have special areas for parking. They are located at: southwest corners of Lot 2, southeast corner of Lot 3, and northwest corner of Lot 4. There are also motorcycle parking areas in Lot 5 at Student Housing.

Visitor parking areas are located in front of the Small College Complex, outside of Lot 3a on the perimeter road, and the Gymnasium Lot. These stalls are free for 30 minutes.\*

Loading zone areas are located adjacent to major campus buildings. No permit is required for 30 minutes or less.\*

*\* Overtime parking permits may be granted by calling the University Police at 516-3639.*

Those who receive parking citations are reminded that pursuant to sections 40202 and 40500 CVC, these citations **cannot be canceled or rescinded by the University Police**. Should there be a significant error on the part of an officer or campus official, the issuing officer will request the court to rescind the citation. Failure to resolve a parking citation will result in difficulty with renewing the vehicle's registration.

## **Repeat and Cancel**

**Undergraduate Degree Objective.** Repeat and cancel may be used by students working toward a baccalaureate degree. A student must have received a grade of "U," "F," "D," "D+," or "C-" to be eligible to file for a repeat and cancel. A **Notice of Repeated Course** form must be obtained from and returned to the Registration and Records Office. Students are encouraged to read the Repeat and Cancel Policy in the current *University Catalog*.

**Graduate Students.** All courses used to fulfill the requirements for the master's degree must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. Any course in the graduate program may be repeated and the two grades averaged when computing the grade point average. However, any course in which a grade lower than "C" is earned *must* be repeated for a grade of "C" or better and the two grades averaged. An overall grade point average of 3.0 (B) or better is required in the courses taken to satisfy the master's degree requirements. Graduate students, unlike undergraduates, may not repeat a course and cancel the lowest grade.

## **Student Support Services**

Numerous support services are available to students. For easy reference, refer to the section "Answers to Your Questions" for a specific department. The *University Catalog* provides more detailed information on services available to students. Below is a partial list of support organizations and services offered.

- Alumni Relations** provides students with information on membership in the Alumni Association, scholarship assistance and alumni activities. For information, call 516-4237.
- Associated Students** is the organization to which your student activity fees are paid at the beginning of each semester. Nearly 50 student volunteers are selected from the Associated Students to serve on many university committees. Visit the office in the Loker Student Union.
- Athletics** conducts the intercollegiate athletic program that competes within the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), Division II. Also, athletic facilities are available for student use. Contact the Athletics Office in the Field House.
- Child Care Services** for students are provided by the Child Development Center. For information, call 327-2880.
- Disabled Student Services** are available for students with temporary and permanent disabilities, located in SHC A-106. For information, call 516-3660.

- Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)** is a special academic support program for students who need and are qualified for supplemental instructional and advising services. Visit SCC-C127 for more information.
- Financial Aid** provides financial assistance to students through grants, loans, scholarships and work opportunities. Part-time job opportunities both on and off campus are also listed in the Financial Aid Office, SCC C-138E.
- Outreach and Information Services** provides an information center for the University and comprehensive recruitment activities, located in SCC A-130.
- Student Activities** coordinates and schedules events and programs throughout the year, located in the Loker Student Union.
- Student Development** lists full-time job opportunities. Also, the staff provides a variety of workshops on career issues, including the Job Search Workshop, in which students can learn how to find hard-to-locate jobs. Each semester Student Development brings employers to campus to interview students for a variety of jobs. Visit the Student Development Office for more information, SCC C-128. Psychological counseling is provided confidentially on a limited short-term basis by Student Development and by Health Programs and Psychological Counseling (located in the Student Health Center). Each unit also provides a variety of workshops and groups that assist students in their personal growth and development. Call the individual offices for more information.
- Student Health Center (SHC)** located adjacent to Parking Lot 3 has a professional staff and provides medical treatment in the event of illness or injury. All currently enrolled students are eligible for basic SHC services including immunizations, screening tests and family planning. Health care services not related to illness or injury (e.g. pre-employment physical, chest x-ray or TB screening) are provided at nominal cost. These health fee charges are posted in the SHC. Students may be seen by appointment or on a walk-in basis.
- Student Housing Office** provides information for on-campus apartments and also maintains listings of local apartments and rooms for rent.
- Student Union** houses food services, bookstore, game and television rooms, meeting and conference rooms, Associated Students Offices and numerous student support service offices.

## Special Sessions

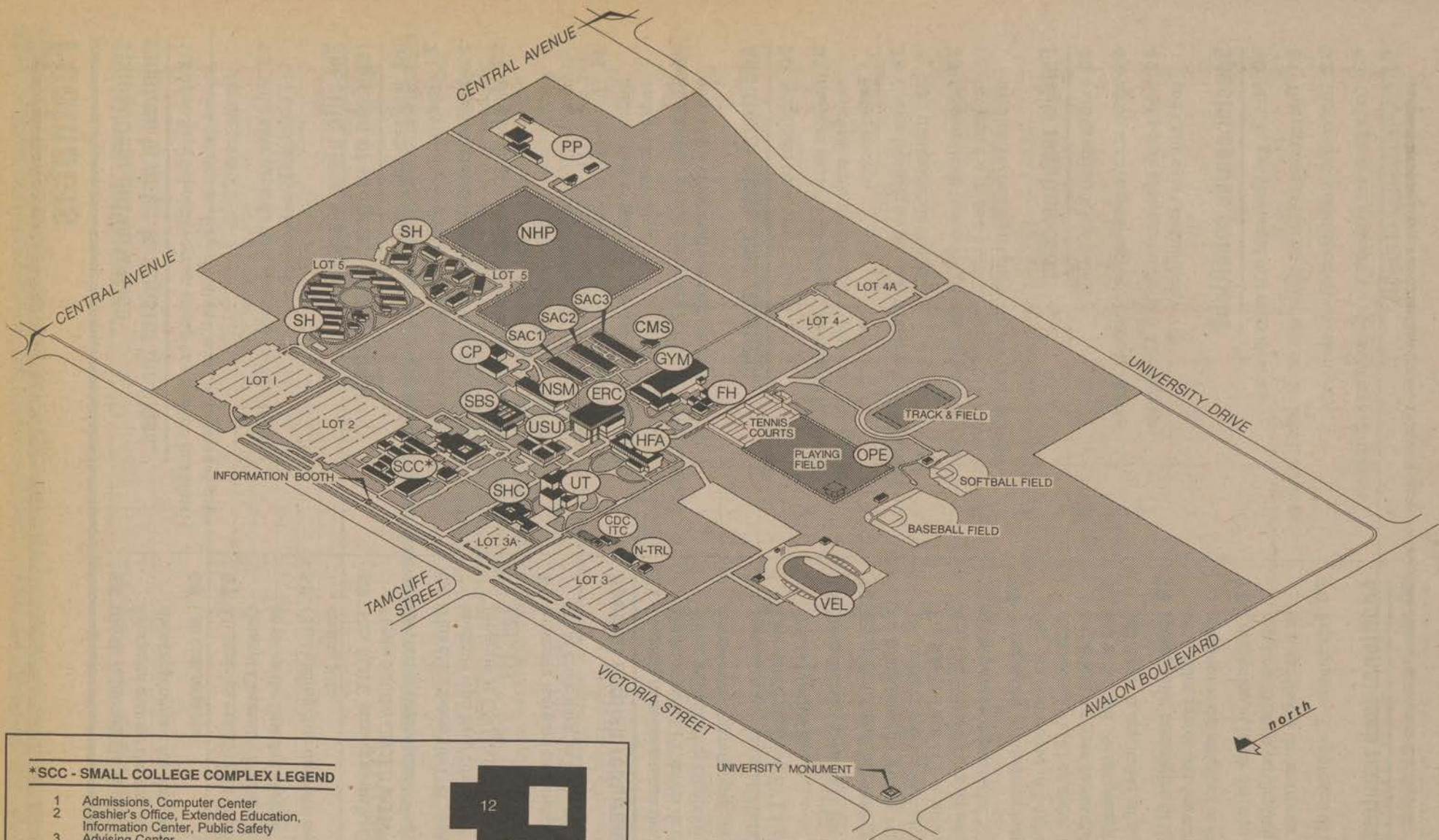

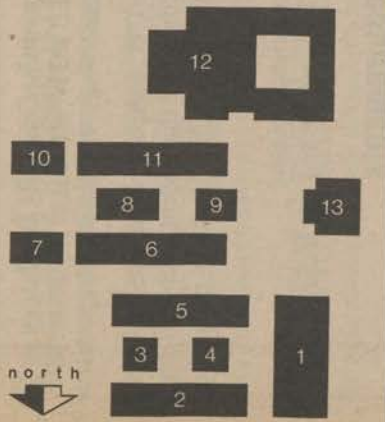
