OVERVIEW OF DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Statewide Nursing Program (SNP) began in Spring of 1981 with two major commitments: to make quality higher education in nursing more accessible to employed registered nurses and to ultimately improve health care in California. Movement toward these goals is occurring through our BSN and MSN programs. Both of these programs were funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and by contributions from individuals and health care organizations.

The curricula are responsive to the needs of adult learners whose time, lifestyles, or work schedules make it impossible to complete a traditional course of study in residence at a campus. The program provides nursing professionals with varying interests and backgrounds with unique advantages such as:

- · Classes designed to meet the needs of the adult learner.
- · Opportunities to meet students with similar goals.
- Opportunities to study with CSU and other highly qualified adjunct faculty.
- Courses offered at geographically convenient locations.
 Credit and course work transferable statewide.

ORIENTATION SESSIONS

All prospective students are expected to attend an orientation session prior to enrolling. The faculty is strongly committed to the position that registered nurses should have access to complete SNP program information as well as information about other traditional and nontraditional routes to bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing, so that an informed decision can be made regarding further professional education. The most effective means of sharing this information is through a group orientation. Please plan to attend one of the sessions as listed in this schedule or contact the Faculty Coordinator in your area for further assistance.

PROGRAM FEATURES

Modules

All courses are divided into one and two unit "mini courses" called modules. A one unit module has two or three seminar meetings with assignments due before and after each seminar, and takes six to eight weeks to complete. Many students take two or more modules concurrently. Students must pre-register for each unit and obtain required course materials in order to prepare for the first class seminar. See details under the BSN and MSN sections of this schedule for materials needed and the course registration procedure. The BSN section also outlines an assessment option whereby credit for selected undergraduate courses may be earned by passing standardized challenge examinations.

Learning Resources

In addition to the 19 libraries of the California State University system and the general and specialized libraries of the University of California system, students also utilize SNP Learning Resources Centers located in community college libraries or medical center hospital libraries. These centers are a joint endeavor of the SNP and a collaborating health care or educational institution. The centers house audio-visual hardware, audio tapes, videotapes, and computer programs which complement SNP coursework.

Individual Counseling

An advisor is assigned to each degree student upon admission. The advisor provides individualized student advisement throughout matriculation.

Preceptorships

Students are able to participate in performance courses (clinical laboratory/field experience) with the assistance of a preceptor as well as an instructor.

Self-Directed Learning Materials

Workbooks as well as videotapes, audiotapes, and/or computer programs are an integral part of every SNP course. Audiovisual materials are available for use at Learning Resource Centers. Required workbooks are available from Statewide Technical Books. (See SNP Book Order form included with this publication.) Proof of purchase cards, included with each workbook, will be collected by the instructor at the first class meeting. Course enrollment is not complete until this requirement is met.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

In any educational program, student participation in the non-classroom aspects of the program is essential. In fact, accrediting bodies such as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the National League for Nursing specifically look for such involvement.

There are several standing committees of the SNP faculty whose membership includes student representatives from the BSN and MSN programs as well as faculty. These committees meet once a month at CSU Dominguez Hills. Since our budget cannot support such student travel, transportation and lodging expenses must be borne by the student. The committees are Curriculum, Faculty Affairs, Student Affairs, Research and Evaluation and Ad Hoc Committees, as established. If traveling to CSU Dominguez Hills is not possible, you may also consider serving as a student representative in your area. Each of the Faculty Coordinators will seek a student representative for the area council.

Students are also needed in each area to gather information for the program's newsletter which will be published two to four times annually. You do not need to be an expert newswriter. Just be enthusiastic.

Other opportunities to participate will arise from time to time. Graduation ceremonies, alumni gatherings, honors and awards, convocations, and accreditation visits are some upcoming activities that need student involvement.

Please let your Faculty Coordinator know if you are interested in service to the SNP, or to the University as a whole. Your commitment to your educational program beyond the classroom is most important to the vitality of university life. Your ideas are MOST welcome.

CONTINUING EDUCATION (C.E.) CREDIT

All BSN and MSN courses are approved for C.E.. credit by the Board of Registered Nursing at the rate of 15 contact hours per unit of theory. (BRN Provider Number 03594). Although the Board of Registered Nursing does not approve individual continuing education courses, providers are required by law to be approved by the Board. Complaints regarding continuing education providers or continuing education courses should be addressed to the Board. Your transcript is your certificate of completion.

For RN's not seeking a degree, refer to OPEN UNIVERSITY for procedure and REGISTRATION in Table of Contents.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- All students admitted to the major must be actively licensed as registered nurses. It is the student's responsibility to immediately report in writing any change in licensure status to the Program Director.
- All students must maintain proof of personal professional liability insurance coverage. Coverage is verified at the beginning of each performance course.
- Students are responsible for obtaining any necessary health exams, immunizations, etc., required by the University or an affiliating clinical agency.
- Client confidentiality and other professional ethics must be respected.
- Students must purchase their own copy of the BSN workbook or MSN syllabi required for a particular course/module.
- The nursing curriculum must be completed in the order prescribed and all students must earn a C or better in each module in that course. Failure to meet course/module prerequisites will adversely affect student progress.
- Students must adhere to the highest standards of academic integrity.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the BSN program, the graduate will be able to:

- · Provide professional nursing care throughout the life cycle of clients and families, and to communities of diverse cultural backgrounds through the applications of critical thinking skills within the framework of the nursing process
- · Develop collaborative professional relationships as a member or leader of a health care team, which ensures the professional practice of nursing in planning, implementing and evaluating the health care needs of clients, and with consideration for the legal, ethical and moral constraints that affect nursing practice.
- · Synthesize knowledge from the physical and behavioral sciences, nursing sciences and humanities to form a basis for professional practice; and contribute to the expansion of nursing knowledge through critical analysis of nursing literature and the application of beginning research skills.

Graduates are eligible for certification by the State of California as Public Health nurses (PHN).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Minimum of 56 semester units of transferable college credit with a grade point average of at least 2.0 (C) or better in all transferable course work (non-residents, 2.4), and have satisfied any high school subject deficiency in English and mathematics by equivalent course work (the maximum transferable credit accepted from a two-year college is 70 semester units).
- 2. Current RN licensure in the United States or an RN interim permit. (Demonstrated clinical competence, validated through work history or by a clinical examination, RN licensure, and personal professional liability insurance are required prior to enrolling in a nursing performance course.)

Diploma Nurse Applicants. Diploma R.N.s who have not met the 56 unit entrance requirement may be considered for admission through the Undergraduate Preparatory Program. See Table of Contents reference for details and meet with local coordinator.

Program Structure

The baccalaureate program comprises classes and/or examinations that include content essential for professional nursing practice. Three options are open to the student:

- 1. A series of classes. Classes are offered in one- and two-unit modules. The student will take course work and be graded after each course module
- 2. A series of written and performance assessments which may be taken in lieu of selected courses. The student receives a study packet and takes the examination. Students who successfully pass the examination MUST enroll in and challenge the corresponding SNP course. See procedures under "Assessment Option" in this class schedule.
- 3. A combination of classes and assessments

HOW TO BEGIN

1. Attend group orientation/review program materials.

- Submit Admission Application fee and a photostat of your R.N. 2 license. (Request a CSU Application packet from the SNP Admissions and Records Office at 800 352-7517.) 3. Request transcripts are indicated in the Admission Application.
- Have transcripts sent directly to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you. All documents must be in by the end of the third month of the term.
- 4. Submit paid registration for BSN 310 at least 2 weeks prior to the first class meeting. Consult with Faculty Coordinator if unable to meet this time frame.
- With your first registration, add \$4.00 to your total fee. The \$4.00 is a 5 ONE TIME fee to cover costs and handling of your ID/Library card.

- 6. Obtain SNP workbook and texts for BSN 310 (See BSN book order form in this schedule).
- Review workbook; complete pre-assignment before first class.
- 8. Attend first class meeting.
- 9. You must take at least one unit in the term for which you applied.
- 10. While the Admissions and Records Office performs an evaluation of your prior college work you may continue to take classes during the term while waiting formal notice. All transcripts must be received by the admissions deadline or disenrollment from classes will result. 11. When you are notified of formal admission, meet with your advisor to
- develop a Program of Study for degree completion. See Faculty Coordinator/Associate for special arrangements if course or times are in conflict with goals to begin studies.

TELEVISED COURSES

The Statewide Nursing Program televises and videotapes selected undergraduate courses. The studio section of the course is taught at CSUDH in the television studio and videotaped for later scheduled showings at various learning sites throughout the state. Students in the telecourse interact with the instructor during the scheduled videotape showings by a toll-free number. Students register for the studio or vid-eotaped course in the same manner as for other courses and must be prepared for class by purchasing textbooks and workbooks and by completing pre-easignments before the first scheduled class. ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better in all courses taken to satisfy the requirements for the degree is required. A student will be placed on probation if, in any term, he or she has failed to earn a

grade point average of 2.0 or higher for the work taken that term. During the subsequent probationary term the student must achieve a grade point average of 2.0 or better. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the program.


All nursing major and nursing support courses/modules must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. A course/module may be repeated only once according to University policy.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Statewide Nursing Program offers a certificate program in public health nursing. Current regulations for public health nurse certification require that the nurse be a BSN graduate of a NLN accredited nursing program. Recognizing the fact that other groups of nurses should be eligible, the Statewide Nursing Program and the State of California, Department of Health Services, have jointly developed the persuite and the statewide of the persuite and the statewide of the services. the program described herein.

To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must: (1) hold a current R.N. license from the California Board of Registered Nursing and (2) hold a bachelor's degree under one of the following conditions

- BSN graduate from a non-N.L.N. accredited program offered by an accredited U.S. institution.
- b. Baccalaureate graduate with a degree from an accredited institution.
- c. Graduate of a BSN program from an accredited foreign institu-tion. Foreign transcripts will be sent directly to an International Evaluation Service. The program will then perform transfer unit evaluate transfer credits and general education courses. More information will be sent regarding this process upon receipt of the application.

Registered Nurses interested in applying must attend a certificate workshop <u>PRIOR</u> to applying to the Public Health Nurse Program. The workshops are held at various sites. Students must bring a copy of all of their transcripts the workshop. Each applicant is required to attend one morning workshop of counseling/advisement where previous coursework will be assessed for possible substitution. In addition, an orientation to the Statewide Nursing Program and its certificate program will be given. At the workshop you will be advised regarding the formal admissions process. Official admission into the program will depend upon the evalua-tion of your transcripts and verification of your bachelor's degree by the Statewide Nursing Program Admissions and Records Office. Attending the workshop does not constitute official acceptance into the program.

Following the workshop, persons interested in applying to the certifi-cate program must complete the following steps to initiate admission consideration for the program: (1) submit a completed admission application with fee; check the box labeled CERTIFICATE under program objective; (2) attach a photocopy of your current California Registered Nurse license; (3) arrange for your previous college(s) to send your official transcripts directly to the SNP Admissions and Decorte Office Records Office.

If you have foreign transcripts, which have not yet been analyzed by an approved international evaluation agency you must allow at least four months (one term) for these documents to arrive at the SNP Admissions and Records Office and be evaluated by the internation-al evaluation agency. Contact the SNP Admissions and Records Office for procedures and fees. APPLY AT LEAST ONE TERM PRIOR FOR ADMISSION INTO THE PHN CERTIFICATE PRO-GBAM if you have foreign documents. GRAM if you have foreign documents.

Once you have been admitted to the program, you must take at least one unit to be a matriculated student. If you do not take a course, your admission will be void and it will be necessary for you to reapply to the program for the next term. In this case, attendance at a second workshop is not necessary.

Potential applicants must attend the morning certificate workshop. An afternoon, same-day workshop is required for those RNs selecting the PHN certificate-only option. The cost of each workshop is \$45. Enrollment in the first required course is permitted when eligibility has been determined and the workshop requirement has been met.

BSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BSN 310 EXPANDING PROFESSIONAL NURSING HORIZONS (2). Prerequisites: Admission to undergraduate program. The increasing complexity and changes in professional nursing demand constant evaluation and planning for formal and informal education. This course presents a systematic problem-solving approach which will help nurses assess their own roles and options, establish career goals, and identify resources which can guide them on a path toward fulfilling their own personal and professional aspirations.

BSN 315 LIFE CYCLE (4). Prerequisite: BSN 310. The course explores the biological, psychological, cognitive, and social aspects of human development throughout each state of the life cycle. While the first three modules are organized around the growth of the individual within the context of the family, the fourth examines the developmental aspects of adults who are temporarily or permanently living an alternative lifestyle.

BSN 325 CULTURE AND HEALTH (4). Prerequisite: BSN 310. This course explores the relationship between the various components of culture and the dynamics of health and illness. Basic anthropological concepts are used to interpret varying conceptions of health and illness and significant dimensions of cultural variations are analyzed in relationship to health attitudes. Basic tools for cross-cultural health studies are applied to specific problems in health. Human institutions and their connection to health and illness are examined from a cross-cultural perspective. Alternative health care delivery systems are compared and a transcultural approach to health care is presented.

BSN 335 BIOCHEMISTRY (4). Prerequisite: BSN 310. This course explores the principles underlying the chemistry of living systems, including the molecular basis by which the human organism meets the vital needs of materials, energy and information. It provides an introduction to the chemistry of bioenergetics, metabolism, biosynthesis, and molecular physiology. By translating the unique language of biochemistry into understandable terms, this course will enable the health professional to apply the vocabulary and concepts of biochemistry to everyday practice.

BSN 340 PROFESSIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN NURSING PRAC-TICE (3). Prerequisite: BSN 310. This course explores professional interaction including the significance of personal awareness, beliefs, and values. Communication theory and styles are defined and the essential elements of a therapeutic relationship are analyzed. Attention is given to crisis intervention techniques. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting apply theoretical knowledge in communicating effectively with health team members, clients and families.

BSN 345 PATHOPHYSIOLOGY (4). Prerequisite: BNS 335 or consent of faculty coordinator. This course explores the response of the human body to illness and injury with respect to common disorders of the major systems. Clinical correlations are provided to assist the health professional in applying this knowledge toward more effective patient care.

BSN 360 PROFESSIONAL ISSUES IN NURSING (4). Prerequisite: BSN 310. This course explores the foundations of professional nursing from historical, philosophical, ethical, political and legal perspectives. Significant issues are analyzed and strategies presented to foster excellence in nursing practice. The relationship between theory, research, and nursing process is discussed in-depth and related to problem solving in the profession. The health care delivery system is examined, as are the diverse roles and settings for nursing practice.

BSN 370 HEALTH TEACHING (2). Pre-requisite: BNS 315 and BNS 325. This course is designed to assist the professional nurse in addressing the learning needs of clients. In addition to enhancing his or her skills as a health teacher, the student will develop an understanding of the philosophical and scientific foundations of patient education as well as professional and social issues which confront those individuals who provide such services.

BSN 380 HEALTH ASSESSMENT (4). Prerequisite: BSN 340, BSN 345, BSN 360, and BSN 370. This course provides an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills required to perform a complete health assessment. In addition to history-taking and physical examination techniques, emphasis is also given to the analysis and synthesis of the date collected in order to identify health care problems and develop a management plan within the context of the nursing process. An integrated performances module provides the opportunity for application of knowledge and skills in the oractice setting.

BSN 405 STATISTICS (3). Prerequisite: Fulfillment of the ELM requirement. Satisfies the Quantitative Reasoning requirement. Includes development and application of the following topics: Descriptive and Inferential Statistics, Mathematics of Finance, Linear Programming and Graph Theory.

BSN 410 HEALTH MANAGEMENT (5). Prerequisite: BSN 380. This course investigates how the community health nurse promotes the health of individuals and families in the community. The theoretical foundations and methodology of community health nursing practice are explored as well as the health barriers which the community health nurse seeks to overcome. Family theory and the family nursing process are analyzed. The course also examines how a community health nurse working in a home health care agency addresses the nursing care problems of specific client populations. The course also includes a performance component where students in a field-experience setting apply the theoretical constructs of concurrently with the BSN 420 performance component directly following completion of all BSN 410 and 420 theory modules.

BSN 420 HEALTH MANAGEMENT II (5). Prerequisites: BSN 410 and BSN 460 or consent of faculty coordinator. This course explores the field of community health nursing from an epidemiological perspective and focuses on the personal and environmental health of the total population. Attention is to group process and change agentry. Methods of epidemiology are examined and related to appropriate nursing interventions at each level of prevention. Epidemiological principles are applied to situations that community health nurses commonly encounter in their work with official health departments. The course also includes a performance component where students in a field experience setting apply the theoretical constructs of community health nursing to health care situations encountered in the official department.

BSN 460 RESEARCH IN NURSING PRACTICE (3). Prerequisite: BSN 405. This course examines the evolution of contemporary nursing research and its relationship to nursing science, theory, and practice. From the perspective of the investigative role of the professional nurse, knowledge of the research process will be developed and applied to skillful and systematic analysis of research studies and findings. The process of developing a research proposal, derived from a practice issue or question will be examined.

BSN 480 LEADERSHIP IN NURSING PRACTICE (3). Prerequisite: BSN 420 and BSN 460. This course explores effective and ineffective leadership styles and the role of leader is emphasized. Change agentry processes are discussed and factors affecting assignment-making and evaluation of personnel are identified. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting practice professional nursing leadership for a nursing team, including team conferences, patient assignments, problem-solving, written communications within an institution, and performance appraisals of nursing personnel.

BSN 490 MANAGEMENT IN NURSING PRACTICE (3). Prerequisites: BSN 420 and BSN 460. This course explores contemporary management theories, issues of power sharing, labor relations management, patient care evaluation, standards development and the emergence of computers as a management tool for nursing. The course includes an integrated performance component where students in a field experience setting practice systems analysis, flow charting, performance evaluation, nursing policy development, nursing quality evaluation and financial evaluation of a segment of a nursing system.

BSN 494 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3). A course of study designed cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the Program Director, to accomplish individualized learning objectives that are appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students should contact their advisor prior to enrolling to determine the appropriateness of this course for degree completion.)

BSN 495 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3). This course offers student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

SPECIAL TOPICS COURSES

BSN 495: CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT (1)

This one unit course was developed to meet the Department of Health Services Public Health Nurse Certification requirement for training in child abuse and neglect prevention. In addition to fulfilling the PHN training mandate, this course presents a comprehensive update on the incidence of all forms of child the prevention of the prevention of the prevention. abuse and neglect with special emphasis on state-of-the-art nursing process skills in assessment and intervention. Case management approaches, multidisciplinary resources and prac-tical strategies for establishing and sustaining therapeutic relationships with high-risk families will be examined.

If you care for emerging and childbearing families and are interested in improving child health and development outcomes, this special topics course, offered in one day workshop format and accompanied by a complete syllabus, will provide you with new knowledge and tools for practice. The syllabus guides you through specified pre-assignments, which must be completed prior to the course meeting. Use the book order form to obtain the required syllabus.

BSN 495: HEALTH ASSESSMENT OF INFANT AND PRESCHOOL CHILD (1)

If you are responsible for the health management of infants and children, whether in the acute care setting or the community, this special topics course, offered in a one-day workshop format and accompanied by a complete syllabus, will provide you with new knowledge and tools for practice.

ELM PREPARATORY WORKSHOP

The California State University and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's need for adequate preparation in mathematics for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education. The CSU requires all freshmen and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level mathematics skills through passing of the ELM (Entry Level Mathematics) test. This test is prerequisite to enrolling in courses designated as meeting the General Education mathematics requirement. All new and readmitted undergraduate nursing students will be expected to meet the requirements unless exempted (see your official transcript evaluation).

The ELM should be taken in the junior year during the first full term you are in the program. This timeframe accommodates students who are poorly prepared or unsure of their basic mathematics skills, allowing time to review and take advantage of various learning materials and workshops. If you do not pass the ELM, you may still register for courses **other** than G.E. math (BSN 405). Students will not be allowed to register for a third term if they have not taken the ELM.

If you do not score at least 480 on the ELM, sign up for the self-directed ELM Preparation Program to prepare to retake the test. In addition to written materials and videotapes, an optional workshop is offered in a four hour format. The \$45.00 fee for the workshop includes a packet of practice materials. Pre-registration, using the form below, is required.

Additional written materials are available through the Statewide Technical Bookstore. The official CSU ELM information packet is available by request from the SNP Admissions and Records office. Your advisor can also assist you.

You may take these exams ei-ther to receive certifiction of having met the State requirements or to receive this certification and three units of credit for challenging the courses HIS 101 or Pol. 101. The exam must be taken in the first week of the term if unit credit is desired. Certifiction exams (no unit credit) may be scheduled throughout the term. Conscientious preparation is highly recommended. Texts are listed on SNP Book Order Form. If you are interested, complete the form and instructions will be mailed to you. Graduate Writing Assessment Require-ment Exam (GWAR)

To meet the CSU writing requirement, you may take the approved writing test (GWAR) through CSUDH and also through most CSU campus testing centers or you may take coursework spec-ified by the offering CSU campuses as meeting the writing requirement. Undergraduate students should complete this requirement during their junior year. Graduate students should complete it during their first term in the program. The writing requirement may be met prior to admission.

The CSUDH graduate writing examination consists of an essay exam and one hour is allowed for completion. Two hours are allowed for those students with English as a second language. The test is graded by CSUDH faculty and you will receive notice of your results approximately six weeks after taking the test.

If you wish to register for the writing exam, please complete the form attach a check for \$16.00, and mail to the designated address. Enroliment will be limited to first 200 applicants. Early registration is advised. A confirmation, map and test prepartion materials will be sent to you. The last date to register is two weeks prior to exam date.

The exam will begin promptly at stated time so arrange to arrive 15 minutes early to secure location and prepare for test taking.

Bring cash for purchasing bluebook. Also bring a #2 pencil and two pens.

Credit/No Credit Policy

An undergraduate student may elect to be graded CR/NC in particular courses, subject to the following conditions:

Course Limitations

- 1. Courses used to satisfy a major (both upper and lower divisions), or which are prerequisite to it, must be taken for a letter grade except when such courses are graded solely on a CR/NC basis. A student is permitted to enroll in up to 50% of the units required by a minor on a credit/no credit basis, unless otherwise specified elsewhere in the catalog under specific requirements for a minor.
- 2. No more than 24 units graded CR/NC, whether taken at this or another institution, may be offered in satisfac-tion of the total units required for a bachelor's degree. If 24 units graded CR/NC are accepted in transfer, no additional courses graded CR/NC may be used to satisfy degree requirements, except when a required course is graded solely on a CR/NC basis. (All credits earned in the CLEP testing program may count even if they make the cumulative total of all CR/NC units at that time over 24.)

THE PROGRAM

The graduate program prepares professional nurses for advanced and specialized practice. The curriculum is organized around the role of the nurse in societal institutions with emphasis on the application of nursing theory through excellence in professional practice and the advancement of the profession through research, leadership, and scholarship for the ultimate benefit of the health care needs of society.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the program graduates will be able to:

- Analyze nursing phenomena (human responses to actual or potential health problems) utilizing the research process and initiate and evaluate therapeutic action in professional practice.
- Contribute to the advancement of nursing education, practice, and research through analysis, synthesis, application, and expansion of nursing models and theories.
- Demonstrate professional performance in advanced practice, through leadership roles and as participants in the sociotechnical based health care delivery system to benefit clients and society at large.

ROLE EMPHASIS OPTIONS

The curriculum offers the student a choice of role emphasis options of nurse educator, nurse administrator or clinical specialist in parent-child nursing or gerontology nursing. Through a personalized Program of Study the curriculum is individualized and reflective of the student's learning needs and professional goals.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please refer to the section on Admission. In addition, please note the following special requirements for admission to the MSN program:

- Completion of a baccalaureate degree program from a regionally accredited institution with an upper division major in nursing (BSN) and NLN accredited nursing program or the equivalent as determined by the Graduate Student Affairs Committee.
- Overall grade point average of 2.5 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the faculty, following the appeal process.

(Registered nurse applicants who have already earned a bachelor's or master's degree in a major other than nursing should contact the Graduate Coordinator for preadmission advisement.)

3. Current licensure in the United States.

As indicated in the Admission Application, have transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

All students complete 19 units of core courses before beginning emphasis courses.

Students may select role preparation as:

- Nurse educator with advanced clinical focus
- Nurse administrator
- Parent-child clinical specialist
- Gerongology clinical specialist

Within the role emphasis option subspecialization may occur. The student focuses on a specific nursing practice area. For example, quality assurance, the depressed elderly, parenting, or client education/teaching.

FEDERAL TRAINEESHIPS

A Professional Nurse Traineeship grant has been awarded to the SNP by the Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service Act. The grant monies are designated for registration fees and other expenses for selected students who are pursuing graduate study in nursing and meet the eligibility criteria established by those awarding the grant and CSUDH/SNP.



MSN PATHWAY FOR RNs WITH NON-NURSING BACCALAUREATE: BA/BS to MSN

The Statewide Nursing Program offers a pathway to facilitate a master's degree in nursing program for those nurses who presently hold a bachelor's degree in another discipline.

Graduate study in nursing builds on a foundation of undergraduate professional nursing knowledge. Following an analysis of your previous coursework, the Graduate Student Affairs Committee will recommend a Program of Study which includes undergraduate nursing and related coursework or assessments to prepare you for MSN coursework. If you meet the usual University requirements for graduate study and concur with the recommended Program of Study, you will be admitted to the graduate program on a conditional basis. Once the undergraduate course content requirements are successfully met, the conditional status is removed and you may proceed with completing the graduate curriculum. See MSN degree section for more details on graduate curriculum enrollment and completion requirements.

QUALITY ASSURANCE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Statewide Nursing Program offers a certificate program in quality assurance for BSN prepared nurses who want to develop graduate level knowledge and skill in implementing an institutional quality assurance pro-gram. Included in this course of study is utilization review, assessment and measurement of the level of care provided to clients and the utilization of resources. The certificate program is administered by Dr. Judith Chodil Chair, Graduate Studies.

To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must: (1) hold a current R.N. license (2) hold a BSN degree from an accredited US institution, (Graduates of foreign institutions will need to have their transcripts evaluated by an international evaluation service. More information will be sent regarding point average of 2.5 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 guarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the Nursing faculty, following the appeal process (4) As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.

Persons interested in applying to this certificate program must complete the following steps to initiate entry into the program: (1) Submit a complete Admissions Application and check the box labeled CERTIFICATE under Program Objective; (2) Attach a photocopy of your current California R.N. license; and (3) Arrange for your previous college(s) to send your transcripts directly to the Admissions and Records Office. (Ask for a second set to be sent to your home if you do not already have your own copy.

Students who are admitted in the MSN degree program and want to add the Quality Assurance (QA) certificate program **must file a revised program of study form** with the SNP Admissions and Records Office.

Applicants must take MSN 500 as the first required course. Certain courses for the Quality Assurance (QA) Certificate require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the program. These are:

· upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent introductory research course or equivalent


Courses required by the certificate program may be met by SNP coursework or by substitution approved by graduate program coordinator with timely graduate level transferable course from other collegiate programs. Please note: if you eventually want to earn a MSN degree, any courses taken to meet certificate requirements may apply to the degree but may not be more than five years old at the time of degree completion.

The certificate program can be completed in 15 months or less, depending on your personal preference and availability of courses. Courses and modules must be completed in the approved sequence with a grade of C or better and an overall B average for the program.

A certificate completion check must be completed by the Admissions and Records Office one term prior to the term you plan to complete the QA certificate program. The certificate application form may be requested from Admissions and Records.

MSN 555 Quality Assurance in Health Care

This three unit course examines the historical evaluation of quality assurance programs in health care, including the political and fiscal aspects. Meth-odologies for implementing an institutional quality assurance program and strategies for identifying and making needed improvements are explored along with mechanisms for evaluating the total program.

Grade averages are calculated each semester by University Admissions and Records. A "B" average is required to maintain acceptable standing in the QA Certificate Program.

MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MSN 500 ADVANCED PRACTICE PERSPECTIVES (1). Prerequisite: Application to the graduate program in nursing or the Quality Assurance Certificate Program. An exploration of issues related to preparation for advanced nursing practice including role options in various practice settings. Strategies for success in nontraditional graduate nursing education are explored including adult learning theory, literature search skills, scholarly writing and the use of computers.

MSN 510 THEORY DEVELOPMENT (3). Prerequisite: MSN 500. This course examines the evolution of contemporary nursing models, theories and the process of theory development. The process of critical analysis of existing nursing and related theories as well as the actual construction of theoretical models is emphasized.

MSN 520 ADVANCED NURSING ROLE IN SOCIETAL IN-STITUTIONS (3). Prerequisite: MSN 500. Examination of the advanced role of the nurse in societal institutions from the perspective of the health care delivery system and of selected advanced and expert nursing roles. Organizational theory and strategies for nursing leadership are analyzed.

MSN 521 SOCIETAL INSTITUTIONS: NURSE EDUCATOR (4). Prerequisite: MSN 540. This course examines the role of the nurse educator within societal institutions, beginning with an historical overview as an antecedent to the current status of nursing education. The theory and process of curriculum development is analyzed, with particular emphasis on contemporary issues and accreditation realities. Students will develop specific knowledge and skill in transforming a curricular framework into an instructional design which reflects contemporary theories of teaching and learning. Finally, students have the opportunity to focus on strategies for teaching client care to students of nursing.

MSN 522 SOCIETAL INSTITUTIONS: NURSE ADMINISTRA-TOR (4). Prerequisite: MSN 540. This course examines the evolution and contemporary status of the role of the nursing service administrator within complex systems. Particular emphasis will be placed upon the management of primary organizational, financial and human resources. The utilization of information science and technology will be applied to key managerial functions. Selected conceptual tools will be analyzed for application to leadership roles in nursing care system management.

MSN 523 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: PARENT CHILD (6). Prerequisite: MSN 540 and 550. Focuses on the childbearing family from conception through early childbearing, emphasizing psycho-socio-developmental aspects of individual, family and parent growth, and complex family relationships. Nursing assessment, diagnosis, intervention and evaluation in common alterations in health, and to high-risk actual or potential health problems examined. Advanced role of the nurse in the planning, development, implementation, and evaluation of programs for special populations will be emphasized.

MSN 524 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: GERONTOLOGY (6). Prerequisite: MSN 540 and 550. Theoretical perspectives on aging and normative aging processes within the context of the family and society. Nursing assessment, diagnosis, intervention and evaluation will be applied to common alterations in health as well as to high-risk human responses health problems associated with aging. The advanced nursing role in promoting, maintaining and advocating health for senior adults is emphasized as well as programs which foster self-care in the senior population.

MSN 530 SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY IN NURSING (3). Prerequisite: BSN 460 or equivalent and MSN 500. Examination of the emergence of nursing science and the investigative role of nursing. Presentation of qualitative and quantitative research methods in advanced nursing role and the principles and processes of critical thinking. MSN 531 SIMULATION SEMINAR (2). Prerequisite: MSN 521 or 522. The simulation seminar provides an opportunity for the application of role emphasis theory through participation in a prescribed scenario which requires a synthesis and creative application of knowledge. In addition, the simulations provides the student with interactional opportunities to develop experience in collegial leadership, decision making and collaborative problem solving. Contemporary issues, which impact nursing and health care and create ethical dilemmas, provide additional substance for the simulation.

MSN 540 FAMILY HEALTH NURSING (4). Prerequisite: MSN 510 and 530. This course examines the theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced clinical nursing practice in the diagnosis and treatment of human responses to actual and potential health problems within family groups. Students will focus on a selected phase of the family life cycle and the advanced nursing strategies required to provide quality, cost effective care.

MSN 550 ROLE PERFORMANCE: FAMILY HEALTH NURS-ING (2). Prerequisite: BSN 380 or equivalent and MSN 540. This course provides an opportunity for the student to synthesize and apply a selected conceptual model of nursing and appropriate family theories in the care of clients/family groups requiring health problems under the supervision of an instructor and preceptor. Nursing implemented and evaluated.

MSN 551 TEACHING STRATEGIES: NURSE EDUCATOR (2). Prerequisites: MSN 521 and MSN 531 and 2 units from either MSN 523 or MSN 524. A previously selected nursing clinical focus provides the basis for implementing the nurse educator role in an educational institution or health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will apply and evaluate didactic and clinical teaching concepts and strategies.

MSN 552 CHANGE THEORY ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE ADMINISTRATOR (2). Prerequisites MSN 522 and MSN 531. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected heath care setting, focusing on a change project. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will formulate, implement and evaluate a change plan based on a conceptual nursing model.

MSN 553 CHILDBEARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 523. An opportunity for the student to implement the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the childbearing family. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

MSN 554 GERONTOLOGY CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST ROLE PERFORMANCE (2). Prerequisite: MSN 524. An opportunity for the student to implement the gerontological nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, concepts influencing legislative regulatory and economic policy will be applied to clinical nursing practice.

MSN 555 QUALITY ASSURANCE IN HEALTH CARE (3). Prerequisite: MSN 500. This course examines the historical evolution of quality assurance programs in health care, including the political and fiscal aspects. Methodologies for implementing an institutional quality assurance program and strategies for identifying and making needed improvements are explored along with mechanisms for evaluating the total program.

MSN 561 ADVANCED CLINICAL ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE EDUCATOR (2). Prerequisite: MSN 551. Under the supervision of an instructor and preceptor, the student demonstrates advanced clinical knowledge and competency with a selected client population. Opportunity is provided to apply clinical knowledge and skill to a teaching situation.

MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS, (cont'd)

MSN 562 EVALUATION ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE ADMIN-ISTRATOR (2). Prerequisite: MSN 552. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on forces shaping the role of a nurse administrator in departmental and institutional governance. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will apply valid and reliable measures of performance evaluation to nurse administrator performance and organizational performance.

MSN 563 EMERGING FAMILY ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 553. An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the emerging family. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

MSN 564 COMMUNITY SERVICES ROLE PERFORMANCE: GERONTOLOGY CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 554. An opportunity for the student to explore community-based programs providing service to the senior adult. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor the student will provide comprehensive nursing care to clients in a selected care setting with emphasis on alternatives for long-term care.

MSN 571 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE EDU-CATOR (2). Prerequisite: MSN 561. An opportunity for the student to synthesize knowledge and skill from previous graduate theory and clinical coursework toward the full realization of the nurse educator role in a selected educational institution or health care setting, including participation in governance.

MSN 572 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: NURSE AD-MINISTRATOR (2). Prerequisite: MSN 562. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on professional and regulatory requirements. Under the supervision of an instructor and a preceptor, the student will formulate a nursing service plan for integrating quality measures with cost control and case management practice.

MSN 573 EARLY CHILDREARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PAR-ENT-CHILD CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 563. An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the early childrearing family. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

MSN 574 THERAPEUTIC STRATEGIES ROLE PERFORMANCE GERONTOLOGY CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 564. An opportunity for the student to develop clinical expertise for com-

mon health alterations experienced by the senior adult. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student will provide comprehensive nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team.

MSN 583 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 573. An opportunity for the student to select a field setting and operationalize a comprehensive CNS role in a narrowly focused clinical specialty.

MSN 584 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: GERONTOL-OGY CNS (2). Prerequisite: MSN 574. An opportunity for the student to perform the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting. Under the supervision of an instructor and clinical preceptor, the student applies case management skills in proving care to senior adult clients and their families.

MSN 590 ADVANCED NURSING RESEARCH (3). Prerequisite: BSN 405 and 460 or equivalent and MSN 530. This course focuses on research processes, methods and comparative research design. Emphasis will be placed on critical analysis of nursing studies and interpretation of nursing research findings. Models for clinical practice innovation through utilization of nursing research will be examined. MSN 594 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3). A course of study designed

cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the Program Director, to accomplish individualized learning objectives that are appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students should contact their advisor prior to enrolling to determine the appropriateness of this course for degree completion.)

MSN 595 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3). This course offers student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

MSN 599 DIRECTED PROJECT (3). Prerequisite: Advancement to Candidacy, MSN 590 and permission of the Graduate Program Coordinator. The goal of all students enrolled in this course is to complete a project under the guidance of an assigned instructor. It is the culminating learning experience of a performance-based curriculum which emphasizes the role and function of advanced nursing practice in health care organizations. To meet the standards established by the faculty the project must demonstrate a rigorous scientific approach, use a clearly documented theoretical framework, and have practical application to the student's selected role emphasis.

MSN 600 PROJECT CONTINUATION COURSE (0). Students who have not completed their MSN 599 Directed Project by the end of the term may enroll in the following term in the Project Continuation Course for one additional term.

The Statewide Nursing Program offers additional opportunities for you to earn elective credits. All colloquia are open to undergraduate and graduate students. Register for this course per usual instructions in Schedule of Classes. Registration of continuing students must be received no later than three weeks prior to the colloquium. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For the Bachelor's Degree

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Undergraduate Transfer Students

You will qualify for admission as a transfer student if you have a grade point average of 2.0(C) or better in all transferable units attempted, are in good standing at the last college or university attended:

1. You will meet the freshman admission requirements in effect for the term in which you are applying:

a.High School Graduates and/or in continuous attendance in an accredited college.

b.Have a qualifiable eligibility index for an American College Test (ACT) score or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

c.Have a "C" or better in the courses of college preparatory subject requirements.

2.Students with an RN license number and less than 56 transferable semester units must be eligible according to these first-time freshman requirements, he/she may be considered for admission under the Undergraduate Preparatory Program (UPP). (See UPP Section)

3.Students who have completed at least 56 transferable semester (84 quarter) units and have made up any missing college preparatory subject requirements. Nonresidents must have a 2.4 grade point average or better.

For this section, transferable courses are those designated for that purpose by the college or university offering the courses.

MAKING UP MISSING COLLEGE PREPARATORY SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate applicants who did not complete the subject requirements while in high school may make up missing subjects by any of the following ways:

- Complete appropriate courses with a C or better in adult school or high school summer sessions.
- 2. Complete appropriate college courses with a C or better.
- 3. Earn acceptable scores on specified examinations.

- 4. 1987 or earlier high school graduates with 56 or more semester units may complete with a C or better in each course for the CSU general education requirements in communication in English language (at least 9 semester units) and mathematics (usually 3 semester units).
- In good standing at the last institution attended.
- Current R.N. licensure or interim permit is required for enrollment in degree objective. Interim permit allows enrollment in BSN 310 and support courses only.

Diploma School Graduates see Undergraduate Preparatory Program. THE MAXIMUM TRANSFERABLE CREDIT FROM A TWO-YEAR COLLEGE IS 70 SEMESTER UNITS.

For the Master's Degree*/QA Certificate

- Completion of a bachelor's degree in nursing from an accredited institution.
- A grade point average of 2.5 or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted.
- In good standing at the last institution attended.
- · Current R.N. licensure.
- Non BSN baccalaureate graduates see MSN pathway.
- Please note that beginning fall 1985 lower division courses and extension courses completed after the bachelor's degree will be excluded from the GPA calculation. Upper division course work taken through OPEN UNIVERSITY will be included in the GPA calculation.

For the PHN Public Health Certificate

- Completion of a non-NLN BSN degree, foreign BSN degree, or a BA/BS related degree
- · Copy of the R.N. license
- · All previous transcripts

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

To apply for admission:

- Request an admissions packet from the admissions office. Complete the CSU Admission Application.
- Send it to the Admissions and Records Office with a \$55.00 check or money order (this fee is nonrefundable).
- Contact the college(s) and/or university(s) you have attended in the past and have official transcripts sent to the Admissions and Records Office. (For transcripts to be considered official, they must be received **directly** from the institution in a sealed envelope.)

It is also recommended that you have a second set of transcripts sent to you for your personal portfolio for use by yourself and your advisor in developing a program of study.

APPLICATION FILING

Admission applicatins must be submitted at least two weeks prior to registration for the first course. Having submitted the Application, students must register for courses during the term for which they have applied while waiting for notice of formal admission. Students may not continue to register for classes in subsequent terms until their admission status has been validated.

ADMISSION VALIDATION

In order to validate your admission status, **all application materials** must be in the Admissions and Records Office one month **prior** to the end of the term for which you are applying. <u>Failure to file</u> complete, accurate and authentic application documents may result in denial of admission, cancellation of academic credit, <u>suspension or expulsion</u> (Section 41301, Article 1.1, Title 5, California Administrative Code). Students will receive notification of admission status from the Admissions and Records Office.

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION (cont'd)

Admissions applications are processed as they are received by the Admissions and Records Office. Apply as soon as possible to facilitate transcript evaluation procedure.

Please note that an application for admission is valid for only one term. If all materials are not received by the prescribed deadlines the application will be inactivated and students will need to re-apply for admission.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Formal residence status for SNP students admitted prior to Fall 1988 will be determined during the 1988/89 academic year. There may be additional fees due if a student is classified as a non-resident.

If you were admitted to CSU Dominguez Hills as a Non-Resident student you should be aware of the following:

Chapter 102 of the 1981 Statutes of California requires that the financial independence of a student must be considered when a non-resident student is requesting reclassification as a resident of California. If you are seeking reclassification as a resident, you are required to complete and file new residency forms with the Admissions office. The completed forms will be reviewed and a determination made. If you are eligible for residency status, you will be informed and your registration will be changed to reflect your new status. The appropriate forms are available by calling SNP Admissions & Records Office at 1-800-352-7517.

The residence questionnaires by which your status may be changed must be submitted to the Admissions office at least two weeks prior to registration.

UNDERGRADUATE PREPARATORY PROGRAM

The UP Program: Something Special for Diploma School Graduates

Since the Statewide Nursing Program's BSN curriculum is at the upper division level, junior standing is required for admission to the major. The **Undergraduate Preparatory Program** is a pathway for students who have earned less than the required 56 college units:

- 1. At least 25 years of age.
- 2. High School diploma or transcript must be on file
- Not enrolled as a full-time student (12 units) for more than one academic term within the last 5 years. Must have a 2.0 GPA.
- Recommendation by the Faculty Coordinator indicating the basis for determining probability of equivalent academic success.
- 5. Make up missing college prep subject requirements.
- Verification of taking and/or passing the EPT and ELM tests.
- 7. RN license number or interim permit number.

This program permits students to take—in combination—general education courses and/or prerequisites for the major through a community college, a CSU campus or other higher education institution. Students may also enroll for Statewide Nursing Program support and introductory courses and assessment options, with the exception of courses/tests offered at the upper division level in the major. Upon completion of 56 units, the student will be admitted to the major, assuming other requirements for admission are met.

Faculty Coordinators are available to assist you with this option. Each Faculty Coordinator's telephone number is listed at the beginning of this class schedule.

STUDENTS WITH FOREIGN DOCUMENTS

The initial evaluation of foreign transcripts must be handled by an international evaluation agency. Applications must be submitted one term in advance of planned attendance.

Deadline dates for applicants with foreign documents:

 Spring 1991 Term
 September 1, 1990

If you have already applied for admission and have sent in your transcripts, we can make arrangements to forward your foreign transcripts to the recommended agency.

This service will provide:

- Evaluation of High School level, Post Secondary through Graduate level, employment and skill recertification.
- 2. Reconstruction of education studies.
- 3. Certified translation of documents.
- 4. Career development and counseling.
- 5. Authenticity verification.

There is a fee of \$50-\$150 depending on the complexity of the evaluation. The evaluation fee covers subject breakdown, equivalence statements, detailed analysis and a narrative evaluation if needed. This includes one original evaluation sent to the designated agency or institution and one copy to the applicant.

The Admissions and Records Office will evaluate the transfer units allowed as well as the general education breadth requirements from the original analysis of the international evaluation service. The SNP office of Admissions and Records has final authority for assessing the transferability of credit. Please refer to:

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS — International students are reguired to have a 2.4 GPA on all units attempted from college.

All students, regardless of citizenship, who have not attended school at the secondary level for at least three years or beyond where English is the principal language of instruction, are required to earn a minimum score of 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

All newly-admitted international students must attend the International Student Orientation Program on Aug. 8, 1990 from 9 a.m. to 12 noon in the University Center. This orientation program is specially designed to review INS Regulations and introduce foreign students to the University.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Applicants are required to include their Social Security account number in designated places on applications for admission and registration form pursuant to the authority contained in Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 41201. The Social Security account number is used as a means of identifying records pertaining to the student as well as identifying the student for purposes of financial aid eligibility and disbursement and the repayment of financial aid and other debts payable to the institution.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

MINIMUM DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

FOR THE BSN DEGREE

- 1. Completion of 132 semester units with a 2.0 GPA
- 2. Completion of the General Education program (48 semester units)
- Satisfaction of the American Institutions requirement in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution and California State and Local Government.
- Satisfaction of Graduation Writing Competency requirement (by exam or course).
- Satisfaction of the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) requirement or exemption.
- 6. Complete the residence requirement of 30 semester units earned through CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted SNP student. The term, residence units, applies to those units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted student in a degree program. Fees must be paid through the regular registration process. Residence requirements for a bachelors degree include a minimum of 30 semester units in residence of which 24 units must be in upper division courses and 12 upper division units must be earned in residence. The maximum credit that may be taken in Extension (Open University) and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 quarter) units at the undergraduate level and 9 semester (13 quarter) units at the graduate level. Resident extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.
- Complete at least 12 units in the major (integrated nursing courses) through CSU Dominguez Hills.
- FOR THE MASTERS DEGREE
- Completion of 36 semester units with a 3.0 GPA average in a directed project which must be filed with the library two weeks prior to the end of the term.
- Satisfaction by the examination or course of the Graduation Writing Competency requirements.
- Complete the residence requirement of at least 21 semester units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted SNP student.

APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION-DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

All degree candidates must file an *Application for Graduation* with the Office of the Registrar in accordance with the following schedule:

A final Program of Study must accompany the Application for Graduation signed by the Faculty Coordinator (BSN) or Associate Director, Graduate Program (MSN) (QA) or Associate Director Undergraduate Program (PHN) if not filed previously. Students will receive a "grad check" from the Admissions and Records Office which indicates any remaining academic work, outstanding fees or obligations which must be resolved before approval for graduation is granted.

If you do not qualify for graduation at the end of the semester for which you applied, you must <u>submit a Change of Graduation Date card and fee</u> of \$10 to the Graduation Unit. Failing to do so will place a hold on your undergraduate registration packet for the next regular semester. You must reapply for the Grad application until your degree requirements are completed. Completion of degree requirements is the student's responsibility and, therefore, each student must be thoroughly familiar with the procedures and information about graduation. If you have questions, please consult the Admissions & Records Office.

COMMENCEMENT

Ceremonies at CSUDH are open to all SNP graduates. If the student wishes to participate in graduation ceremonies at a local CSU campus they should so indicate on the application for graduation. Your name will be sent to the appropriate CSU campus for the ceremonies.

GRADUATION WITH HONORS POLICY

Effective with the 1978-79 academic year, to graduate with honors, an undergraduate student must complete 36 units in residence and receive a minimum of 3.40 on all units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills, with the overall grade point average determined on transferable undergraduate work. The Honor categories are as follows based on cumulative grade point average.

Cum Laude	(3.40-3.59)
Magna Cum Laude	(3.60-3.79)
Summa Cum Laude	(3.80-4.00)

Summa Cum Laude (3.80-4.00) All students graduating under the 1978-79 or earlier catalogs will be evaluated for graduation using the new criteria. If they meet the new criteria, they will be designated as graduating cum laude, magna cum laude or summa cum laude. If they do not meet the new criteria, they will be evaluated as graduating with honors as stipulated in earlier catalogs. Graduation with honors is available only to undergraduate students earning a first baccalaureate degree.

Candidates for graduation with honors will be listed in the commencement program based on grades earned through the previous fall semester. Official placement in one of the honors categories will be based on all grades earned including the final term. Therefore, it is possible to be listed as a candidate in the commencement program, but not graduate with honors after all grades have been calculated. Students who graduate with honors will have the appropriate designation inscribed on their diplomas.

GRADUATION WRITING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT

UNDERGRADUATES

All new and returning undergraduate students admitted for fall 1983 or subsequent terms must meet the upper division Graduate Writing requirement (GWAR). Those students who have rights to a catalog prior to 1983 will be held to the graduation requirements stated therein. Every CSU campus offers the mans for meeting this requirement, either through a test or coursework, or a combination of the former categories. Check the appropriate CSU catalog for the particulars. The CSUDH writing test may be available to SNP students around the slate. A schedule of these test dates will be publicized. If the test is available, a testing fee will be charged. Students are encouraged to meet this requirement by some appropriate means prior to their senior year.

GRADUATES

All graduate students entering in the fall of 1983 and thereafter are required to meet the above requirement at the graduate level (which may mean a higher grade on a certifying test, or a higher grade in a certifying course than is required of undergraduates). Consult the appropriate CSU catalog for particulars.

VERIFICATION OF PASSING EITHER THE TEST OR AN APPROVED COURSE FROM A CSU MUST BE FORWARDED TO THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR IN SNP ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS BY THE END OF THE SECOND SEMESTER OF CONTINUOUS ATTENDANCE.

GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

Each candidate for a baccalaureate must complete general education coursework as prescribed by the Board of Trustees in Title 5 of the Administrative Code, Sections 40405 through 40405.4. The program consists of 48 semester units of courses approved for this purpose, including nine semester units taken during the junior and senior years and approved as upper division G.E. courses. At least nine of the required 48 units must be completed in residence.

Since the Statewide Nursing Program offers primarily upper division and graduate courses, most general education work will be completed prior to enrollment in the program or by referral to another institution after matriculation. A student may satisfy the General Education requirements in any one or a combination of the following ways:

Prior to matriculation:

- Completion of courses or examinations that are approved as meeting particular requirements by CSU campuses, California community colleges, or other participating campuses.
- Completion of courses at other institutions determined to meet particular requirements.

After matriculation:

- Completion of approved courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university, (Students should consult with their advisor for information on the course substitution process prior to enrolling in any course which is intended to satisfy a General Education requirement.)
- Completion of designated courses or examinations approved for General Education purposes.

REQUIRED PATTERN OF STATUTORY COURSES

A. Communication In English (9 semester units)

- 1. Oral communication-an introductory course in speech.
- Written communication—a standard course in freshman composition.
- Critical thinking—a course in logic, argumentation, or critical thinking.
- B. Science and Mathematics (12 semester units)
- A general introductory course in astronomy, chemistry, geology, physical science, or physics.
- A general introductory course in biology, botany, or zoology. At least one course in either category 1 or 2 above must include a laboratory; however, it is recommended that two laboratory courses be taken.
- A mathematics, or other quantitative course equivalent to advanced algebra. This course should have a prerequisite of at least two years of college preparatory mathematics.

C. Humanities (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: art, drama, language, literature, music, and philosophy. No more than six semester units may be activity or performance courses.

D. Social and Behavioral Sciences (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology. Certain courses which meet these requirements may also be applied to the requirements described in section F below. At least one course either in area C or in area D above must involve study of the non-Western world. A course dealing with ethnic or other minorities in America is highly recommended. In choosing courses from areas C and D, avoid highly specialized courses. Try to choose courses which seek to integrate two or more areas.

E. Lifelong Understanding (3 semester units)

See advisor for list of approved courses if this requirement has not been met.

F. Requirements in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution, and Principles of California Sate and Local Government.

Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 40404, requires that each student demonstrate competency in these areas to qualify for graduation. Students who have not met these requirements at the time of admission may do so by completing appropriate courses or by passing comprehensive examinations prepared and administered by most CSU campuses. Courses used to meet this requirement may also be applied to the requirements in section D.

Students beginning undergraduate study in September, 1981 or thereafter are responsible for meeting these requirements. Students enrolling for an additional bachelor's degree must meet any difference between these and any previous requirements that may have been completed.

ACADEMIC POLICIES/PROCEDURES

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT & REGULATIONS

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

Academic advisement is an essential component of student services. A personal relationship between students and their advisor begins upon admission to their degree program. The advisor will assist the student in completing a Program of Study following a discussion of her/his educational goals and previous experience. This initial planning meeting will form the basis for an ongoing counseling relationship through graduation. The guiding principle for the interaction between the student and advisor is the creation of a plan for degree completion that is compatible with the student's available time, fiscal, and academic resources. Students who are unaware of the identity of their advisor are encouraged to contact the Central Office.

ACADEMIC SKILLS ASSESSMENT PLAN

The California State University (CSU) and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's needs for adequate preparation in mathematics. English, reading and critical thinking for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education.

The CSU now requires all freshman and those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level skills in two areas: English and mathematics. To better ensure that students, who are poorly prepared in one or more of the basic skills, receive this preparation early in their college career, CSU Dominguez Hills began implementation of an Academic Skills Assessment Plan (ASAP) in Fall 1984, starting with new freshmen. Beginning Fall 1988 all SNP new and readmitted undergraduate students will be expected to meet the requirements of the plan.

The Academic Skills Assessment Plan has four stages which may affect you:

Stages 1 and 2 are detailed below. Stages 3 and 4, in their detailed form, may be round in the CSU Dominguez Hills Catalog.

Stage 1. Assessment of Entry Level Skills

Assessment of entry level competencies in reading, compose mathematics.

- Unless exempt, students must take the English Placement Test (EPT) and Entry Level Mathematics test (ELM) no later than their first semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills. (See entry describing EPT and ELM in the Admissions section of the University catalog.) If exempt, the student will be notified when admitted.
- Entry Level English Skills If students score T150 or below on the EPT, they must enroll in ENG 099 Basic Writing Workshop or IDS 006 Intensive Writing Skills Workshop at CSU Dominguez Hills or SIMILAR COURSE WORK AT A CSU INSTITUTION or community college. If their score is T141 or lower on the EPT, they also must enroll in ENG 088 Developmental Reading or a SIMILAR COURSE AT A CSU INSTITUTION or community college.

Both ENG 088 and 099 or SMC 006 are prerequisites to ENG 110 Freshman Composition I, and may be taken concurrently prior to ENG 110. (CSUDH course).

 Entry Level Mathematics Skills — If students scaore 470 or below on the ELM, they should register for MAT 003 and/or MAT 005 at CSU Dominguez Hills or SIMILAR COURSE WORK AT A CSU INSTITUTION or community college. If students are not exempt, they must pass the ELM before taking any higher level math course (BSN 405 Statistics). NO COURSES SATISFY THIS REQUIREMENT.

Stage 2. Completion of Entry Level Skills

Students will not be allowed to register for a third term if they have not at least taken the ELM and/or EPT. If you do not pass the ELM, you may still register for courses other than GE Math. You must pass the ELM prior to registering for an approved GE Math course at any CSU or community college.

ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST-(EPT)

All students wishing to enroll in Freshman Composition must take the English Placement test unless they meet one of the exemptions listed in the current catalog. Verification of exemptions in the form of letters of notification or scores reported by testing agencies is required at the time of registration for the course.

Additionally, students who are bound by the EPT requirement must take the test in their first semester in SNP whether they plan to take Freshman Composition that semester or not.

The test dates for the EPT at CSU Dominguez Hills are:

ENTRY-LEVEL MATHEMATICS (ELM)

All students who entered CSU Dominguez Hills in Fall 1983 or later must demonstrate basic competence in mathematics. New freshmen must demonstrate competence by successful completion of the CSU Entry-Level Mathematics (ELM) Examination. Transfer students who are subject to requirements in the 1983-84 CSU Dominguez Hills Catalog must take the ELM, unless they have successfully completed (grade of C or better) a mathematics course certified for General Education-Quantitative Reasoning (advanced algebra or above) at the time of transfer. Satisfactory performance on any of several alternative examinations may exempt students from taking this examination. For more information, contact the Admissions Office.

Students required to take this examination should do so as soon as possible after admission. Failure to take the examination before the end of the first term may lead to probation and disqualification.

HEALTH EXAMINATION

A medical history form, sent to students upon admission should be filed with the student health center before registration.

Measles and Rubella Immunizations Health Screening Provisions

All new and readmitted students born after January, 1957 will be notified of the requirement to present proof of measles and rubella immunizations. This is not an Admissions requirement, but shall be required of students by the beginning of the next term in the CSU. Proof of measles and rubella immunizations also shall be required for certain groups of enrolled students who have increased exposure to these diseases.

Persons Subject To These Health Screening Provisions Include: • New students enrolling Fall 1986 or later

- · Readmitted students re-enrolling Fall 1986 or later
- Students who reside in campus residence halls
- Students who obtained their primary and secondary schooling outside the United States.

INTRASYSTEM VISITOR STATUS AND INTRASYSTEM CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Students from one CSU campus may enroll as visitors on another campus or concurrently enroll on another campus. Please see the CSUDH catalog for detailed information regarding procedures for each category.

each category. Visitor Enrollment is used when a student will not be taking a course with the Statewide Nursing Program but will take a course only from a CSU (host) campus in that term. Student must adhere to host campus registration deadlines. The fees will be paid to the host campus.

Concurrent Enrollment means that a student will be taking a course with the Statewide Nursing Program and a course from another CSU (host) campus. The fees will be paid to CSU, Dominguez Hills (home).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Undergraduate - student has completed at least one term at the home campus as a matriculated student and earned at least 12 units there. Student has attained a GPA of 2.0 in all work completed at the home campus and is in good standing at that campus. Student is eligible to register under continuing status at the home campus.

Graduate - student completed at least one term at the home campus as a matriculated student. Student has been admitted to or is enrolled in an authorized graduate program at the home campus. Student was in good standing at the last institution attended.

CHANGE OF GRADE PROCEDURES

If a grade change is necessary the instructor completes the form and forwards it to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. The student will then be notified of the change of grade. Change of name must be documented by legal verification.

CHANGE OF NAME OR ADDRESS

If you have made a change of name, address or phone which has not been reported to the university, please send in change of name/ address to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. It is important that the university be informed of any change so that you will receive all mailings.

CREDIT FOR OPEN UNIVERSITY, EXTENSION AND CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

The University allows transfer credit for appropriate college-level courses completed in Extension, including Open University, or by correspondence from accredited colleges or universities and the United States Armed Forces Institute. A maximum of 24 semester (36 quarter) units earned through Extension, completed at CSU Dominguez Hills or elsewhere, through correspondence, and USAF may be accepted toward a bachelor's degree. For graduate level students, a maximum of nine semester (13 quarter) units or extension work may be applied to a degree. <u>Please note that these credits do not satisfy CSU Dominguez Hills residence requirements for the degree.</u> For more detailed information, please refer to the current University catalog.

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974

All student records of the California State University, including Statewide Nursing Program of CSU Dominguez Hills, are kept in accordance with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Students may request access to those campus records that personally identify the student. The student may challenge the accuracy of the record or the appropriateness of its retention in the campus records. Student consent is needed for the release of records covered by the Act to outside parties (e.g. prospective employers) except for those agencies entitled to access under the provisions of the Act (e.g., campus officials, other schools, federal officers, and requests in connection with the application or receipt of financial aid). A student may request a copy of a record that he/she has requested for release. Students must pay a charge for copies of records for which such a charge has been established. Copies of the full text of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 are available at the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs (ERC C532) or the campus library. Particular questions with respect to a student's prerogatives under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 should be directed to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs.

If a student wishes to restrict the release of directory information, a request may be made at the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs. The request is valid from the semester requested through the end of the academic year. Requests for restriction or release of information for a subsequent academic year requires a new form.

FIRST CLASS MEETING

Students who register for a course but do not attend the first class meeting must drop the course at least 10 working days prior to the first class meeting. Students who are in doubt regarding their drop status should call the Business Office at SNP Admissions and Records.

FULL TIME STATUS

UNDERGRADUATE

Undergraduates are considered to be full-time students during any semester when they are enrolled in 12 units or more. GRADUATE

Graduate-students enrolled in eight or more graduate level (500 level) units are considered to be full-time.

Notes:

Master's Degree candidates are reminded that a "B" (3.0) average is required in the master's degree program and for all courses (related and unrelated; lower division, upper division and graduate) taken concurrent with the master's degree program.

Undergraduate students are reminded that, in order to graduate with a baccalaureate degree, a "C" (2.0) average is required for all courses taken elsewhere, all courses taken at CSU Dominguez Hills and for all courses in the declared major(s).

Courses and modules must be successfully completed (grade of C or better) in the order indicated by the curricular progression flowchart. Certain modules within a course may be sequenced. Any deviation from meeting the course prerequisites or sequence is subject to prior written approval by the Faculty Coordinator.

ACADEMIC POLICIES/PROCEDURES (cont'd)

Alternative Grading Policy

In departmentally designated courses in basic skills (composition, quantitative reasoning, logic [critical reasoning]) and departmentally designated upper division composition courses, the A-F grading system is replaced by an A-C/NC system. Therefore, SNP curriculum honors the alternate A-F grading system.

Incomplete Grade

A grade of incomplete may be assigned if a student is unable, for an unforeseen reason, to complete a definable portion of course work. An incomplete indicates that there is still a possibility of credit upon completion of future work. The student must arrange with the instructor for completion of the required work. For each incomplete grade assigned, the instructor will complete a form in triplicate on which he/she will indicate:

- 1. The reason for granting the incomplete;
- 2. The amount or nature of the work to be completed;
- The date by which the student must make up the work—a date as early as possible, but in any case within one calendar year.

Application For Incomplete ("I") Grade

An approval form, signed by the instructor, must be completed by the last scheduled meeting date of the course.

An incomplete grade may not be submitted without the Request for Incomplete form. A definitive grade for the term is recorded when the work has been completed. An incomplete grade cannot be removed by repeating the course. The grade will be automatically recorded as F or NC if the work is not completed within the time specified or the Request for Incomplete form.

Change of Grade forms must be signed by the instructor and Faculty Coordinator and returned to the Registrar's office within the time period allowed.

Unauthorized Incomplete

The symbol "U" indicates that an enrolled students did not withdraw from the course but failed to complete course requirements. It is used when, in the opinion of the instructor, completed assignments or course activities or both were insufficient to make normal evaluation of academic performance possible. For purposes of grade point average computation this symbol is equivalent to an "F".

Official Withdrawal from the University (w)

Official withdrawal is necessary if a student leaves the university any time after registration and does not intend to complete the semester. A drop form may be obtained from the schedule of classes or call A&R office.

A student who does not officially withdraw shall receive an "F", "U" or "NC" grade for the registered courses.

CR/NC (CREDIT/NO CREDIT GRADES)

Undergraduate

An undergraduate student may elect to be graded CR/NC in particular courses, subject to the following conditions:

Course Limitations

- Courses used to satisfy a major (both upper and lower divisions), or which are prerequisite to it, must be taken for a letter grade except when such courses are graded solely on a CR/NC basis. A student is permitted to enroll in up to 50% of the units required by a minor on a credit/no credit basis, unless otherwise specified elsewhere in the catalog under specific requirements for a minor.
- 2. No more than 24 units graded CR/NC, whether taken at this or another institution, may be offered in satisfaction of the total units required for a bachelor's degree. If 24 units graded CR/NC are accepted in transfer, no additional courses graded CR/NC may be used to satisfy degree requirements, except when a required course is graded solely on a CR/NC basis. (All credits earned in the CLEP testing program may count even if they make the cumulative total of all CR/NC units at that time over 24.)

Grade Equivalences and Records

- 1. Both Credit (CR) and No Credit (NC) grades are recorded on student transcripts.
- In accordance with current policies of the Board of Trustees, at the undergraduate level the Credit grade is the equivalent of an A, B, or C; and the No Credit grade is the equivalent of a D, or F.
- 3. CR/NC grades are not computed in overall or semester GPA's.

Graduate

- Graduate courses graded on a CR/NC basis are limited to courses specifically designated in the catalog for non-traditional grading and to certain 400 and 500 level courses in the School of Education.
- 2. At the graduate level, CR is the equivalent of an A or B; and NC is the equivalent of C, D, or F.
- At least 24 of the units used to fulfill the requirements for a Master's degree shall be graded on a traditional basis. The remaining units may be graded CR/NC, if the course is offered only on that basis.
- Graduate level students are allowed to elect to receive credit/no credit grades in courses numbered below 500 that will not be used to satisfy the requirements of a graduate degree program.

Repeat And Cancel Policy

The Repeat and Cancel policy has been amended effective fall semester 1986. The following procedures are applicable to all CSU Dominguez Hills students:

- 1. The Repeat and Cancel policy may be used by students working toward a baccalaureate degree.
- The Repeat and Cancel policy may not be used by graduate/postbaccalaureate students working on master's degrees, graduate certifications, teaching credentials, or by "undeclared" graduate students, even when they might take undergraduate courses.
- 3. In the case of a repeated course, the subsequent grade is substituted for the earlier in the computation of units attempted and grade point average (GPA). The previous course grade(s) remain(s) on the record, but is annotated as being discounted from GPA calculations.
- Repeat and Cancel may be used on courses taken and repeated at CSU Dominguez Hills and other CSU campuses during summer sessions or as a CSU visitor/concurrent student.
- Repeat and Cancel may be used for no more than eighteen (18) semester units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills.
- Repeat and Cancel may be used only on grades of U,F or D,D+,C-.

DESCRIPTION OF ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES

*REGULAR ADMISSION — A new student applying for admission to a degree or certificate program should complete the regular CSU application should be returned to SNP Admissions and Records Office along with the \$55 application fee.

*CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT—Admitted students who are taking SNP/CSUDH courses this term may also take courses at another CSU campus through concurrent enrollment. Concurrent enrollment forms are available at any CSU campus or by calling (800) 352-7517. Be sure to pay attention to the registration deadlines and registration procedures at the particular CSU institution you have selected. Your registration fee is paid to CSUDH and is based on your total units load.

*INTRASYSTEM VISITOR ENROLLMENT — A means by which students who are not taking a SNP/CSUDH course may enroll in designated courses at another CSU. Fees are paid to the host campus.

ACADEMIC POLICIES/PROCEDURES (con't)

- Students who obtained their primary and secondary schooling outside the United States.
- Students enrolled in clinical science and practicum, student teaching or field work involving preschool-age children, school-age children, field work taking place in a hospital or health care setting.

RESIDENCE CREDIT REQUIREMENT

Undergraduate

Students must earn the equivalent of 30 semester units of credit through SNP to meet residence requirements for a bachelor's degree. At least 12 semester units must be in the major and 24 semester units must be upper division level courses.

Graduate

Twenty-one semester units of work must be completed in residence through the SNP.

 The maximum credit that may be taken in extension and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 qtr) units at the undergraduate level and nine semester (13 qtr.) units at the graduate level. Resident extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.

Definition of courses that meet the residence credit requirement: Any regularly scheduled CSUDH/SNP course taken after admission.

- Any successfully completed assessment which is approved to meet a major course requirement that was taken after admission.
- Any course taken for academic credit at one of the CSU campuses after admission, which had prior written approval by the Faculty Coordinator taken for academic credit after admission to meet the degree requirement.

MAINTAINING CONTINUING STUDENT STATUS FOR UNDERGRADUATES AND GRADUATES

Procedure

Students may elect to be absent for one semester without losing eligibility for re-registration, subject to the following conditions:

- A permit to register will not be released to students who were scholastically disqualified following their most recent semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills.
- Students who attend another college or university during an absence from CSU Dominguez Hills must file a Leave of Absence form if they will be absent for more than one term from SNP.
- Undergraduate students who graduate from CSU Dominguez Hills and wish to continue as graduate students must file a new application for admission. An application fee of \$55 is required.

PLANNED EDUCATIONAL LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A Planned Educational Leave is defined as a planned interruption or temporary cessation of a student's formal education in which the student voluntarily and temporarily ceases enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills while pursuing other educationally related activities to enrich his/her academic program or to clarify educational goals. The Leave may be used for any number of educationally related activities including travel, independent study, work study or attendance at another institution. The intent of the program is to make it possible for a student to suspend academic work, leave the campus and later resume studies with a minimum of procedural difficulty. Petitions are available at the Office of the Registrar, SNP Admissions and Records Office.

Eligibility

Any registered student, undergraduate or classified graduate, in good academic standing, is eligible for the Plann d Student Leave Program.

Application Procedures

- A registered student may request an educational leave. The petition shall include an explanation of the student's reasons for seeking an educational leave and when he/she intends to resume academic work.
- The request shall be initiated by the student and reviewed by the Office of the Registrar. If the request is approved, the registrar shall take steps to insure the student's reentry and retention of registration priority, and the appropriate entry in the student's academic record.
- The request shall be approved only after contractual agreements (e.g. financial aids) have been satisfactorily terminated or renegotiated.
- A registered student may file a petition for a Planned Educational Leave at any time; however, the leave must commence at the beginning of the following semester.
- Permission for a Planned Educational Leave must be requested and approved in advance of the term the leave is to begin; a leave will not be granted retroactively.
- Students whose planned leaves will take them out of California are advised to consult the Office of the Registrar regarding residency requirements.

Duration of Leave

The minimum leave shall be two full semesters; the maximum, two calendar years. Graduate students may not extend the time limited allowed by regulations for completion of degree requirements.

Fees

Students returning upon conclusion of approved planned leaves shall be required to submit an application for readmission, but shall not be required to pay another application fee.

Availability of Services

A student on Planned Educational Leave shall be expected to devote his/her leave period to off-campus activities. The student shall be classified as "on leave" and shall not be considered a regularly enrolled student. Therefore, the student is not entitled to the campus services normally provided to enrolled students, except that the student may confer with his/her academic advisor and others regarding leave activity and plans for re-enrollment.

Resumption of Formal Education

A student shall be guaranteed re-entry and retention of registration priority at the conclusion of his/her Planned Educational Leave. Every effort shall be made to facilitate and simplify the return. For purposes of election of graduation requirements, the approved leave shall not constitute an interruption of attendance provided the student registers in the same major. Students who fail to resume studies at the pre-arranged time shall forfeit the advantages of the Planned Educational Leave Program.

Student Record Entry

Each student enrolled in the program will have an entry made on his/her permanent record card indicating that the student is on leave. The dates of the beginning and conclusion of the leave also will be recorded.

Academic Credit

Students must obtain prior approval of the Office of Admissions to re-enroll for credit at another institution of higher education. Any credit earned will be treated as transfer credit to be evaluated and entered in student records in the customary manner.

Compliance

Any student on planned leave who does not comply with all provisions of this policy and the conditions of the leave is subject to forfeiture of the advantages of this program.

REGISTRATION & FEES

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Under state support, decisions to offer or cancel classes are based on the numbers of students enrolled in a particular location. All continuing students are required to pay the semester fee and submit a course request form for all courses they plan to take that term, prior to the beginning of the term. New students Fall 1990 may register and pay the semester fees as soon as an application for admission is received in the Admissions and **Records** Office

Registration Process - Fall Term 1990 Continuing Students

- 1. Complete the registration form. Be sure to include the correct schedule number, course number and title, time and location for each course/ module you plan to take either by coursework or by challenge/assessment.
- 2. Attach your Registration Ticket to your registration form. Note any corrections directly on front. On the back of the RT, list your alternative courses
- 3. Classes not paid for will not be recorded on your transcript. You may not register for a subsequent semester if there are any outstanding University fees
- 4. Make your check payable to CSU Dominguez Hills. Include your charge card number and expiration date if you use VISA or MasterCard, Fees are not considered paid until your check or charge has cleared the bank
- 5. If your fees are being paid by a sponsoring agency or company which prefers to pay the CSU fees directly, you must secure a purchase order from the sponsor. The purchase order must be complete and accurate and addressed to Statewide Nursing Program, CSU Dominguez Hills. Submit the purchase order at the same time that you register for classes
- 6. All Fall 1990 registrations must be submitted by continuing students between July 1 and August 31.
- 7. You may not attend a class without submitting the Registration Form ahead of time. You may not late register for a unit or begin a class after the first class meeting has occurred.
- 8. Class size is limited. Seats go to eligible students as registrations are received.

ALTERNATIVES FOR CLOSED COURSES

If a course you desired is not available, an alternate course, as identified on your Registration Ticket (RT), or an added section of the same course (though perhaps not on the same night or same location) will be confirmed. Every effort will be made to reach you by telephone regarding the change. A confirmation will also be sent. If your personal schedule does not permit you to attend, you have the option of dropping the alternate course by completing the usual add/drop form. Please call if you have any questions.

ADD-DROP PROCESS FALL TERM 1990

While some adding and dropping of courses can be accommodated, the program can best serve you by scheduling courses based on what students originally plan to take at the beginning of the term. If you find it necessary to deviate from your original registration plan, you may add or drop a course without penalty if the program is notified at least 10 working days prior to the first class meeting date.

To add or drop a class please send an add/drop form to SNP A&R Office at least 10 working days prior to the first class session to reserve a seat in class. Be sure to complete the add/drop form with all the specific information or the form cannot be processed and it will be returned to the student. YOUR REGISTRATION FEES FOR THE FALL 1990 TERM MUST BE PAID IN ORDER TO ADD A CLASS

LATE ADDS/DROPS

Students who do not meet the deadline time of the 10 working days: May add the class only with the Instructor's permission. NOTE: THERE MAY NOT BE SEATING AVAILABILITY.

- 2. You may NOT ADD AFTER THE FIRST CLASS SESSION HAS STARTED. You must send in the add/drop form immediately after the first class 3.
- session in order to have your name listed on a final grade roster 4. Your registration fees for the Fall '90 term must be paid in order to add a class

PENALTY-If you do not send in the add/drop form, you will receive an unauthorized withdrawal "U" on your transcript. This form must be received one week after the first class session.

Please promote the program's abbility to continue to serve its many locations in the state by projecting your courses as accurately as possible and following through on your plans. Your intentions at the beginning of the term are the basis for many program decisions and allocation of resources. If it is necessary to cancel a class or to make any changes in the scheduled class, every effort will be made to notify you by telephone at least five working days prior to the first meeting of that class. If a course is overenrolled and it is possible to add another section, you will be notifed at least five days prior to the first meeting of the added class section concerning its location and possibly a new date and time depending on instructor availability

Withdrawal from all Courses

Continuing students who find that they will be unable to take any courses during the term are eligible for a refund of CSU fees if the course was never attended. Students must request an application for refund from the University cashier's office. A completed add-drop form, indicating total withdrawal must be received in the Admissions and Records office by the date of the first class session for which the student registers

If a student completes even a portion of one unit, a refund or portion of refund of CSU fees is not possible.

FEE PAYMENT

All students pay the regular fees shown below. Auditors pay the same fee as students registered for credit. ALL FEES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY

Fees for each semester are part of the registration process and are payable at the time of registration.

In addition to these fees, non-residents of the state of California are charged tuition.

CARD. IF THE CHARGE CARD IS DECLINED OR THE CHECK IS NSF, THE REGISTRATION CANNOT BE PROCESSED AND WILL BE RE-TURNED TO THE STUDENT. A CASHIER'S CHECK OR MONEY ORDER WILL BE REQUESTED.

STUDENT SERVICES

FINANCIAL AID

GUARANTEED STUDENT LOAN (GSL)

The Guaranteed Student Loan Program provides an opportunity for eligible students to obtain educational loans through participating banks, credit unions or other lending institutions. The federal government will pay the interest on the cumulative amount borrowed as long as the student is enrolled at least half-time at an eligible school.

According to federal regulations, the student may apply for the Guaranteed Student Loan providing the student;

- is enrolled in and in good standing or has been accepted for enrollment at an eligible school;
- is enrolled minimally, as a half-time student (six units or more) with the program;
- is a citizen of the United States or is in the United States for other than a temporary purpose.

This program provides long-term, low-interest (seven to nine percent) loans available through participating lending agencies. Upper division undergraduate students may borrow up to \$4,000 per year, and graduate students may borrow up to \$7,500 per year.

California Loans to Assist Students (CLAS): Students who are ineligible for a GSL or who wish to supplement their GSL may apply for a CLAS loan. CLAS loans enable borrowers to obtain up to \$4,000 per year (\$20,000 aggregate) to help pay for education. CLAS loans are guaranteed by the participating lenders. This guarantee, backed by federal reinsurance, allows the loans to be made without security or collateral.

Unlike the Guaranteed Student Loan (GSL), a CLAS loan goes into repayment 60 days after the loan is made. However, the favorable interest rate (varies from 9 to 12%, depending on the annual average rate of 91-day Treasury Bills) makes CLAS an attractive alternative for parents and students faced with financing postsecondary education. CLAS loans can be used in addition to Guaranteed Student Loans.

Parent and less than full-time student borrowers must begin repayment of principal and interest 60 days after the loan is made.

Full-time student borrowers may defer (postpone) principal and interest repayment until their enrollment status changes.

Application Procedures:

Step One—File a Student Aid Application for California (SAAC). All SAAC forms and appropriate fee, must be mailed to: College Scholarship Service, Box 70, Berkeley, CA 94701-0070. This may take up to four weeks so plan accordingly. The GSL or CLAS application cannot be certified until the SAAC is received.

All undergraduate students are required to apply for a Pell Grant. This may be accomplished by answering yes to SAAC question number 43. The Pell Grant determination is called the Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR will be mailed directly to your home and then submitted to the Financial Aid Office. In addition, you may be required to provide a copy of your/your parents tax return(s) and Financial Aid Transcripts from any schools previously attended.

Step Two—Complete the GSL or CLAS loan application and questionnaire. To obtain these forms write or call:

Since processing the GSL/CLAS application normally takes one to two weeks after we have received all the above forms (total of six to eight Weeks), it is recommended you apply early for a given term. All fees are expected to be paid at the time due, regardless of your loan application status.

Step Three A personal interview is necessary before final approval/ release of loan monies can occur. Applicants will be informed of the process for completing an informational computer software program prior to arranging for the interview.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF STUDENTS RECEIVING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- All Financial Aid recipients agree to carry and complete the number of units specified each term showing at least half-time status, report graduation or wlthdrawal, and notify the Financial Aid Office of any changes in their financial status, marital status, or unit load.
- Students must use the funds only to meet education costs. Any other use of the funds is prohibited by law.
- Satisfactory academic progress must be maintained. A student is considered to be in good standing and maintaining satisfactory progress when enrolled in and successfully completing at least a half-time credit hour load.

VETERANS CERTIFICATION

New students who are veterans should be approved by the Veterans Administration to receive benefits and should obtain form 1995 (Change of Institution Form) or form 1990 (Veteran's Application for VA Benefits Form) from the SNP Admissions and Records Office, the VA, the Campus Veterans Office, VA Hospital, or other appropriate agency. The form should be completed by the student and sent to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. The A&R Office will submit the form to the appropriate office along with form 1999 (Certification of Enrollment Form). The student must notify the Admissions and Records Office at once upon withdrawal from a course or upon adding a course.

Concurrent Enrollment: If a student attends another school at the same time, a VA form must be sent from the other school to the Admissions and Records Office verifying enrollment.

Prior to each term, new and continuing students should contact the SNP Admissions and Records Office indicating the courses to be taken that term. In addition, students applying for VA benefits for both the Fall and Spring terms should estimate the number of units to be taken in Spring. Summer benefits must be applied for separately. Any other questions regarding VA benefits should be directed to the SNP Admissions and Records Office.

LIBRARY SERVICES/IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Library identification cards are available from the Statewide Nursing Program Admissions and Records Office and are mailed to the student approximately 4 weeks after receipt of the student's Registration, the card permits the student access to the student services and full library privileges at any of the nineteen California State University campuses. The student must return the I.D./library card at once upon complete withdrawal fro the program. For each I.D./library card along with your class confirmation form. Please contact the Admissions and Records Office If you do not receive your identification/library card.

STUDENT HANDBOOK EXCERPTS

The following information is excerpted from the CSUDH Student Handbook and adapted to the needs of distance education students. The Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook is available for review at faculty coordinator offices and at your Learning Resource Center or you may request a personal copy by calling (213) 516-3596 if you live in the (213) or (818) area codes or 1-800-344-5484 in other areas of California.

Your comments on the usefulness of information included in this excerpt for distance education students are most appreciated. If there are topics which should be added, expanded or deleted, please submit them, in writing, to the Chair, Student Affairs Committee, Statewide Nursing Program.

HISTORY

Since you have chosen to pursue a university degree with California State University, Dominguez Hills, it is only appropriate that you know more about the University. CSU Dominguez Hills is one of the 19 campuses in the California State University system. The 346-acre campus was opened in 1965 on a land area which was then called Rancho San Pedro. The Rancho was the first Spanish land grant and, in 1910, the site of the first air show held in the United States. The campus opened in 1965, with a student population of fifty. Today, the student population totals over 8,000. California State University, Dominguez Hills' student body is diverse in every sense of the word. The campus can be considered a cultural gold mine. Students represent almost every age group, culture, ethnicity and socio-economic background found in our society.

The University is fully accredited by the Western Association for Schools and Colleges and by several other professional associations. Thirty-seven different undergraduate majors, 17 graduate programs, nine credential programs in education, and one external degree program are available.

THE CATALOG

The aim of the catalog is best expressed by the phrase, "If you do not know where you are going, you probably will not get there." The various degrees, credentials and certificates we offer all have specific requirements. If you do not satisfactorily fulfill all of these requirements, you will not receive the degree, credential or certificate. The catalog is the only place where ALL the requirements are brought together. By carefully checking the catalog, you will know what courses and other requirements you must complete. The University normally issues a new catalog every year. The one that applies to you is the one that was in effect during the year in which you graduate. If you are a transfer student from a California community college, or one of the other CSU campuses, you may have other options. You should contact your advisor to find out what they are.

In addition, all of the programs and all of the courses that we offer are listed in the catalog with a brief description of what will be covered in the course. "Prerequisites," those courses or other requirements that need to be taken or met before you can attempt a particular course, are also included. Knowledge about prerequisites is necessary when planning your program. Don't wait until the week before graduation to check your program; do it now. You can buy the catalog through the bookstore.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Issued each semester, the schedule of classes lists regulations for payment of fees, registration instructions, refund policy, withdrawal procedures and general campus information as well as the academic calendar and class offerings for the term. This publication includes a course registration form.

FEES

Fees are paid at the time of registration. Registration is not complete without payment of fees. You can use check, VISA, or Mastercard to pay the fees. Also, students receiving financial aid will have their fees paid from their financial aid funds. If you are paying by check, make sure you have sufficient funds in your account. If your check bounces, the University will charge you a fee and no longer accept your checks. Tuition is charged to non-resident students, in addition to the basic fees.

Book and other supplies needed for school are not included in the fees. Any additional costs are the responsibility of the student.

IDENTIFICATION CARD

New students will receive an ID/Library card. The same ID card will be used the entire time that you are at CSU Dominguez Hills. Each semester you enroll, it will be "validated" for that semester. Attach the validation sticker in the space indicated on the card.

PARKING PERMIT

A permit can be purchased for the whole year or just the semester. Go to the University cashier located at SMC B-135 to purchase a permit. If you are only occasionally on campus, you may purchase a permit from the vending machines in the parking lots. The fee is \$1.50.

Academic Advising

A good, consistent relationship with an academic advisor can assist you greatly in achieving your educational, career and personal goals, and in taking maximum advantage of the resources this University has to offer. It is in your own best interest to meet with your advisor on a regular basis. The faculty coordinator or associate coordinator in your geographic area is your advisor.

Academic Policies and Requirements

You need a C average in order to maintain good standing as an undergraduate. Grades less than C must be balanced by higher grades in other courses. You should note that some majors require that you have at least a C in each course taken for the major, not just a C average. Also, all graduate students should be aware that a C average isn't good enough. Graduate students must maintain a B average. Check the catalog.

Academic Probation

Whenever you fall below a C average, you will be placed on academic probation. Undergraduates have three stages of probation:

1. On Probation.

This can occur in three different ways:

- a. If your semester G.P.A. falls below 2.0, you will be placed on academic probation even if your overall G.P.A. is above 2.0. You will be removed from probation if your G.P.A. the next semester is sufficiently above 2.0.
- b. If your overall G.P.A. at CSU Dominguez Hills falls below a 2.0, you will be placed on academic probation. In this case, you will not be removed from probation until you have obtained grades which will bring your entire G.P.A. above the 2.0 level.
- c. Students who are admitted to CSU Dominguez Hills, and who already have a G.P.A. falling below 2.0, will remain on probation until they have obtained sufficient credits at CSU Dominguez Hills to balance the previous deficiency.

2. Continued on Probation.

This indicates that, in the previous semester, you were on probation and in the next semester your grades were not sufficient to bring your overall G.P.A. to above the 2.0 level.

If your grades continue to be less than a C grade, then you may become "Subject to Disqualification."

3. Subject to Disqualification.

This is the most serious of the stages of probation, and if the deficiency is not removed, you will eventually be disqualified from attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills. The deficiency allowed is determined by system policy, and is not defined by G.P.A., but rather by grade points.

The maximum deficiency you may have depends upon your status, whether you are a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior or Senior. If your grade point deficiency is more than allowed, you will be disqualified unless you are able to remove the deficiency. The deficiency levels at

which disqualification occurs are outlined in the catalog.

If your grades slip shows "Subject to Disqualification," you should contact your Faculty Coordinator or Associate Coordinator to find out what steps you should take to remove the deficiency.

If you are placed on probation, you may be having trouble either with studying or time pressures due to multiple responsibilities. Help is available; you're not alone. Go see your academic advisor who can direct you to the help you need before you are disqualified. Tutoring and help with study skills is available in the Learning Assistance Center for most study areas. Order No. 148. The grade will not be cancelled and will be computed in the grade point average.

Disgualification

If you have the status "Subject to Disqualification" and are unable to remove the deficiency through Repeat and Cancel or higher grades in other courses, you may not be allowed to continue taking classes as a regular student at CSU Dominguez Hills. This is known as "Academic Disqualification." You will receive written notice of this action as it is taken, and you will not receive any further registration materials.

If you are disqualified, you must generally wait at least one semester before seeking reinstatement. After one semester has passed, you may petition the Registrar for reinstatement as a regular student. The Registrar will need to see evidence indicating that you will be likely to obtain better grades and be able to remove the deficiency that caused your disqualification before approving the reinstatement.

The evidence required is usually a transcript showing satisfactory performance (grades higher than a C) at a community college for the one semester that you did not attend CSU Dominguez Hills through the Open University.

If you are disqualified, you should meet with your advisor prior to taking any courses elsewhere so that you will know specifically what courses you should take and the grades needed to be reinstated.

Withdrawing From CSU Dominguez Hills

Withdrawing means dropping all of your classes for a particular semester. To withdraw from the University, you should contact the SNP Admissions and Records Office at (213)516-4060 or 1-800-352-7517. An official Notice of Withdrawal and instructions will be provided. If you just quit coming to school and don't fill out the forms, you'll get F's or U's in all the classes in which you were enrolled. Take the time to let the people in the SNP Admissions and Records Office help you. Withdrawal after the first class requires "serious and compelling reasons," and authorized signatures.

"Sitting Out" A Semester

You may miss one semester and still be considered a continuing student unless you attend another institution in the absence from CSU Dominguez Hills. If you do not attend for more than one semester, or you attend another institution in the interval, you must submit a new application and fee. (Summer Session is not counted in this determination.) If you have a valid educational reason for "sitting out," contact the Admissions and Records Office about an Educational Leave of Absence. This could save you money and protect your catalog rights. Call (213) 516-4060 or 1-800-352-7517.

FINANCIAL AID

All students interested in applying for financial aid should take the following steps:

- Complete the Student Aid Application for California (SAAC). For priority consideration, the completed form must be submitted to the College Scholarship Services, Berkeley, CA., prior to March 1 of the school year. Applications after that date will be processed as long as funds are available.
- The submission of various supporting documents is required for all financial aid applicants. Documents required include, but are not limited to, the following:

VETERANS' AFFAIRS INFORMATION

Veterans who need assistance with Veterans' benefits related matters should stop by the Office of Off-Campus Housing and Veterans' Affairs in SMC A-130, or call (213) 516-3643. Information and support are available for admission advisement, V.A. benefits, tutorial assistance, employment, academic advisement and community services referral.

INFORMATION AND SERVICE CENTER

The Information and Service Center is the one-stop center for campuswide services, providing information regarding activities and programs of the University. Information on campus resources as well as brochures, maps, directories and other materials are available to students and visitors. Basic admission information and advising are also located in the Center. The Center is located in Room SMC A-130, and the phone number is (213) 516-3696.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Throughout the year, the Financial Aid Office receives announcements on scholarships offered by various organizations in the area. The amounts and qualifications vary with each scholarship. A listing of available scholarships can be found in the CSU Dominguez Hills Catalog. Information is also available in the Financial Aid Office and, for scholarships for women, the Women's Center.

CASHIER

All University fees for registration, parking, transcript requests, petitions, etc., are paid at this office. The Cashier's Office is located near the front of the campus at SMC B-135. If you have questions regarding fees call (213) 516-3812.

THE CLASSROOM

The University does not discriminate on the basis of sex, disability, race or color.

Rights and Responsibilities

- The students are entitled to instructors who refrain from acts or conditions listed in Section 24306 of the Education Code, e.g., unprofessional or immoral conduct, dishonesty, incompetence, etc. Such acts or conditions may cause the University to take disciplinary action against the instructor.
- 2. The individual instructor controls the order and direction of a class and the scope and treatment of the subject matter, and the class must be free of distraction or disruption. Each student must respect the rights of others in the maintenance of classroom order and in the observance of basic courtesy. A student may be ordered to leave a class for cheating or when her/his behavior obstructs the regular activity of the class. The instructor, however, may not officially disenroll a student for a course as discipline without following the student disciplinary procedures.

Plagiarism

At the heart of any university are its efforts to encourage critical reading skills, effective communication, and, above all, intellectual honesty among its students. Thus, all academic work submitted by a student as his or her own should be i his or her own unique style, words, and form. When work is submitted that appears to be original, but actually is not, the student has committed plagiarism.

Plagiarism is considered a gross violation of the University's academic and disciplinary standards. Plagiarism includes the following: copying of one person's work by another and claiming it as his or her own, false presentation of one's self as the author or creator of work, falsely taking credit for another person's unique method of treatment or expression, falsely representing one's self as the source of ideas or expression, or the presentation of someone else's language, ideas, or works without giving that person due credit. It is not limited to written works. For example, one can plagiarize music compositions, photographs, works of art, choreography, computer programs, or any other unique creative effort.

Plagiarism is cause for formal University discipline and is justification for an instructor to assign a lower grade or a failing grade in the course in which the plagiarism is committed. In addition, the University may impose its own disciplinary measures.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT EXPECTED OF STUDENTS

A. Main Causes for Disciplinary Action

Title 5, California Administrative Code, specifies conduct which is cause for disciplinary action. It reads, in part, as follows: Any student of a State University may be expelled, suspended, placed on probation or given a lesser sanction for one or more of the following causes which must be State University related.

- cheating or plagiarism in connection with an academic program at a State University;
- forgery, alteration or misuse of State University documents, records or identification or knowingly furnishing false information to a State University;
- misrepresentation of oneself or of an organization to be an agent of a State University;
- obstruction of disruption, on or off campus property, "of the State University educational process, or other University function;
- physical abuse, on or off campus property, of the person or property of any member of the University community or of members of her/his family or the threat of such physical abuse;
- theft of, or non-accidental damage to, State University property, or property in the possession of, or owned by, a member of the University community;
- unauthorized entry into, unauthorized use of, or misuse of State University property;
- on State University property, the sale or knowing possession of dangerous drugs, restricted dangerous drugs, or narcotics as those terms are used in California statutes, except when lawfully prescribed pursuant to medical or dental care, or when lawfully permitted for the purpose of research, instruction or analysis;
- knowing possession or use of explosives, dangerous chemicals or deadly weapons on State University property or at a State University function without prior authorization of the State University President;
- engaging in lewd, indecent, or obscene behavior State University property or at a State University function;
- abusive behavior directed toward or hazing of, a member of the University community;
- 12. violation of any order of a State University President, notice of which had been given prior to such violation and during the academic term in which the violation occurs, either by publication in the campus newspaper, or by posting on an official bulletin board designated for this purpose, and which order is not inconsistent with any of the other provisions of this section; and/or
- Soliciting or assisting another to do any act which would subject a student to expulsion, suspension or probation pursuant to this section.

For information on the procedures for handling cases of student conduct requiring disciplinary action, see the Vice President for Student Affairs or the Director of Student Development, or read the pertinent sections of the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook.

The section of the Handbook on Standards of Conduct also contains policies and regulations on: student protest and dissent, gambling and lotteries, hazing, firearms, parking, bicycles, animals at large on campus, smoking, debts owed to the University, and alcohol.

STUDENT GRIEVANCES AND GRADE APPEALS PROCEDURES A.Introduction

Grades at the University are reported in a manner to assure that they come from the instructor of record. The grades are written on the roster, and the roster is signed by the instructor. The grades are submitted to the Office of the Registrar, where they are processed and forwarded to the Computer Center.

Changes of grade are submitted by instructors under several circumstances, including removal of an incomplete grade, submission of a final grade for which an SP (Satisfactory Progress) had been previously submitted, submission of a final grade to replace an RD (Report Delayed) symbol which resulted from no grade or an incorrect grade being submitted when grades were due, change of a letter grade based upon clerical error in reporting of original grade or upon recomputation of a grade because of additional work submitted.

These changes are reported either on the Change of Grade form or by memo from the instructor. A number of grades, usually involving a change from U to F to W, are changed by petition. This process generally involves requests based upon extenuating circumstances, such as physical inability to appear on campus to properly withdraw, or mistaken assumptions of the students regarding drop or withdrawal procedures. The petition requires recommendation of the instructor involved and of the appropriate School Dean. A final action is taken by the Registrar based upon the recommendations provided. Information about changes of grades are referred back to the instructors to verify that the change requests are legitimate.

If an instructor fails to assign a grade to a student, the Department Chair will work with qualified faculty members and cause the appropriate grade to be assigned. The School Dean, Chair of the Academic Senate, and University President will be informed when a Department Chair has had to take such action.

These appeals procedures are not to be used to review a University student disciplinary decision under Executive Order No. 148. For example, if a student was found in the disciplinary process to have cheated in a course and, among other things, a grade of F was ordered for that course, these appeal procedures could not be used to challenge that F grade.

A grade appeal is permitted when a student can show clear evidence that a grade was clearly unfair, prejudiced, capricious, or the result of clerical error. The presumption is that the grades assigned are correct until there is a clear demonstration otherwise. The burden of proof is heavy and it rests with the student who is appealing.

Any student or faculty member involved in a grade appeals dispute who thinks that this appeals procedure has not been properly followed should state in writing his or her complaint and reasons to the University President with a copy to the Chair of the Academic Senate. The University President, or designee, will give a decision in writing within seven days about the procedural issue.

These appeal procedures may be revised from time to time by the Academic Senate with the concurrence of the President. Changes will be immediately posted in official copies of the procedures in the offices of the Academic Senate, University President, Dean of faculty Affairs, Vice President of Student Affairs, and the Associated Students. Periodically, revisions will be sent to all faculty for inclusion into their copies of the Faculty Handbook.

The Vice President of Student Affairs will insure that students are aware that these appeals procedures exist.

B. Student Grievances and Grade Appeals Board

Information on the Student Grievance and Grade Appeals Board, its purpose, membership, election and organization is contained in PM 87-01 and also in the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook.

C. Grievance Procedures


 A student who thinks he or she has a basis for a grievance or grade appeal will first seek to resolve the matter informally with the instructor of record for the course or the appropriate individual in other matters. For a student to be able to proceed with a grievance or grade appeal, the student must have met with the faculty member within one regular semester session of the time the student knew or should have known of the problem or dispute unless there is a prior agreement for extension between the grievant and the Chair of the Board.

If the matter is not worked out informally within five classroom days to the satisfaction of the parties, the student or his/her representative may send the formal grievance or grade appeal in writing to the Dean of the school. The student's written statement will contain the following: Refer to the student rights and responsibilities handbook for further information on the: Hearing; Preliminary Investigation; Initial Determination by the Board; Board Decision and report.

A clear statement of the problem;

The specific action requested of the University, and

Arguments to support the student's request.
