## **INTERNET ACCESS**



All Division of Nursing Students are now required to have access to the internet with e-mail and web search capability. This modality is increasingly used to facilitate communication between students, instructors and advisors. There are several choices that a student can make regarding online services.

Your computer, hardware, software, browser online charges, etc., may be considered tax deductible. See your tax accountant.

After you obtain access to a computer, you need to establish your own email account/address. The advantage of having your own e-mail address is that mail sent to that address is your own vs. using the e-mail address that belongs to your friend, husband, child, etc. There are a variety of FREE e-mail providers such as Hotmail, Yahoo, Juno, etc. In the search engine of your choice, search on 'e-mail" + "free" and see what comes back. The advantage of free e-mail providers is that you can access your e-mail from any computer, anywhere (unlike AOL, Pacbell, etc. which require software to be installed on a specific computer).

The important features you need for e-mail are:

- unlimited access (don't get one that only provides so many hours per month)
- 2. local dial-up phone number
- 24-hour technical support line (have to worry about the "local" providers)
- 4. sufficient phone lines to support traffic
- 5. ability to support a high-speed modem

## **NEW BSN STUDENTS**

- As soon as you receive your letter of acceptance to the university it is important to enroll in classes promptly.
- You must enroll in BSN 301 (web based course) and BSN 310 your first semester. You may take as many other units as you feel you can carry.
- Additional courses you may enroll in include: BSN 305, 315, 340, 345, 405. You may choose between live classes, online courses, or a combination of both.
- In BSN 310 you will prepare a program of study for degree completion and you will get answers to many of your questions about progression through the nursing curriculum and general education requirements.
- Before you go to class, be sure to 1) obtain books and Learning Module Texts from the bookstore (see table of contents), and, 2) prepare for the first class session according to the directions in the Learning Module Texts.

## ANNOUNCEMENT FOR BSN APPLICANTS

New applicants with 56 or more transfer units are expected to meet the following GE requirements prior to admission:

- Pass a GE math course such as College Algebra or Statistics.
- Pass an English Composition course.
- Pass a Speech class. (Oral Communication)
- Pass a Critical Thinking/Logic class. (Coastline Community College Philosophy 115 meets this requirement)

New applicants who meet the "Adult Student" criteria,:

- 1) 25 years old or more, and
- have not been a full time student in the past 5 years may have these requirements waived as prerequisite to being admitted. They will need to meet them within their initial semesters in the University.

## **OVERVIEW OF DEGREE PROGRAMS**

## **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

- All students admitted to the major must be actively licensed as registered nurses. It is the student's responsibility to immediately report in writing any change in licensure to the Advisor and Department Chair.
- All students must maintain proof of personal professional liability insurance coverage. Coverage is verified at the beginning of each performance or role performance course.
- Students are responsible for obtaining any necessary health exams, immunizations, etc., required by the University or an affiliating clinical agency.
- · Client confidentiality must be respected.
- Students must purchase their own copy of the BSN Module Text or MSN syllabus required for a particular course/module.
- The nursing curriculum must be completed in the order prescribed and all students must earn C or better for each module in that course.
   Failure to meet course/module prerequisites will adversely affect student progress. MSN students must maintain at least a 3.0 GPA (B).
- Students must adhere to the highest standards of academic and professional integrity.

## CONTINUING EDUCATION (C.E.) CREDIT

All BSN and MSN courses (not general education) are provider approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing, Provider Number CEP 3594, for 15 contact hours per unit. Non-nursing general education courses do not qualify. Although the Board of Registered Nursing does not approve individual continuing education courses, providers are required by law to be approved by the Board. Complaints regarding continuing education providers or continuing education courses should be addressed to the Board. Your transcript is your certificate of completion.

## OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

In any educational program, student participation in the non-classroom aspects of the program is essential. In fact, accrediting bodies such as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC) specifically look for such involvement. California State University, Dominguez Hills is WASC accredited. The Baccalaureate and Masters Degree programs in nursing are both NLNAC accredited.

There are several standing committees of the Division of Nursing faculty whose membership includes student representatives from the BSN and MSN programs as well as faculty. These committees usually meet once a month via phone conference and include Curriculum, Faculty Affairs, Student Affairs, Research and Evaluation, and Ad Hoc Committees. You may also consider serving as a student representative in your area.

Students are needed in each area to gather information for the program's newsletter which will be published twice a year. Graduation ceremonies, alumni gatherings, and honors and awards convocations, are ongoing activities that need student involvement. Students who are interested in volunteering should contact their student representative. Student commitment to the educational program beyond the classroom is most important to the vitality of university life. Ideas from students are most welcome. Students are encouraged to apply for membership in the Xi Theta Chapter of Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing. 

## **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

## MINIMUM DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

- 1. Students are required to complete 124 semester units with a 2.0 GPA.
- 2. Completion of the General Education program (48 semester units).
- Satisfaction of the American Institutions requirement in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution and California State and Local Government.
- Satisfaction of Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR) by exam or course.
- Satisfaction of the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) requirement or exemption and English Placement test or exemption.
- 6. Complete the residence requirement of 30 semester units earned through CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted student. Residence units refers to those units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted student in a degree program. Fees must be paid through the regular registration process. Residence requirements for a bachelor's degree include a minimum of 30 semester units in residence of which 24 units must be in upper division courses and 18 units must be earned in the major.
- 7. The maximum credit that may be taken in Extension (Open University) and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 quarter) units at the undergraduate level and 9 semester (13 quarter) units at the graduate level. Extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.

## APPLICANTS WITH 56 OR MORE TRANSFERABLE COLLEGE CREDITS

- College Grade Point Average of at least 2.0
- Completion of Basic General Education courses (12 credits)
   English 3 credits
  - Logic 3 credits
  - Speech 3 credits
  - Mathematics 3 credits

## MINIMUM DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MASTERS OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

- Completion of 33-53 semester units with a 3.0 GPA. Degree requirements include completion of a directed project, comprehensive exam, or thesis.
- Complete the residence requirements of at least 21 semester units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted nursing student. Not more than 9 semester units may be earned as transfer work.
- 3. Satisfaction of Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR) with a grade of 8 or better on the Graduate Writing Exam (GWE) or a satisfactory grade ("B" or above) in an upper division English writing course. Must be completed prior to or during first semester of coursework in order to register for second semester.

## GRADUATE WRITING ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENT

#### UNDERGRADUATES

All newly admitted and returning undergraduate students must meet the upper division Graduate Writing Examination (GWE). Every CSU campus offers the means for meeting this requirement, either through a test or coursework, or a combination of both. Check the appropriate CSU catalog for details. A testing fee will be charged. Students are encouraged to meet this requirement by some appropriate means **prior to their last 2 semesters.** 

#### GRADUATES

All graduate students are required to meet the Graduate Writing Examination (GWE) at the graduate level (which may mean a higher grade on a certifying test, or a higher grade in a certifying course than is required of undergraduates). Consult the appropriate CSU catalog for particulars. This requirement must be met PRIOR TO OR DURING THE FIRST SEMESTER OF COURSEWORK.

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT VERIFICA-TION OF PASSING EITHER THE TEST OR AN APPROVED COURSE IS FORWARDED TO ADMISSIONS BY THE END OF THE FIRST SEMESTER OF CONTINUOUS ATTENDANCE. THE UNIVER-SITY ADVISEMENT CENTER WILL DETERMINE IF REQUIREMENT HAS BEEN MET.

A final Program of Study signed by the appropriate Advisor must be filed by the deadline above, if not filed previously. Students will receive a "degree check" from the Admissions and Records Office which will indicate any remaining academic work, and grade point deficiencies which must be resolved before approval of graduation is granted. All coursework must be completed by the end of the term of anticipated graduation. If you are attending a community college and their term ends at a later date, you must apply for graduation for the following semester/term.

If you do not qualify for graduation at the end of the semester for which you applied, you must submit a Change of Graduation Date Application and fee of \$10 to the Admissions and Records Office. Failing to do so will place a hold on your registration for the next semester. You must move up the Graduation application until your degree requirements are completed. Completion of degree requirements is the student's responsibility and, therefore, each studer' must be thoroughly familiar with the procedures and information about graduation. If you have questions, please consult the Admissions and Records Office.

## GRADUATION WITH HONORS POLICY FOR BSN STUDENTS

To graduate with honors, an undergraduate student must complete 36 units in residence and receive a minimum of 3.40 on all units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills, with the overall grade point average determined on transferable undergraduate work. The honor categories are as follows based on cumulative grade point average:

Cum Laude	3.40-3.59	
Magna Cum Laude	3.60-3.79	
Summa Cum Laude	3.80-4.00	

Candidates for graduation with honors will be listed in the commencement program based on grades earned through the previous fall semester. Official placement in one of the honors categories will be based on all grades earned including the final term. Therefore, it is possible to be listed as a candidate in the commencement program, but not graduate with honors after all grades have been calculated. Students who graduate with honors will have the appropriate designation inscribed on their diplomas.

### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION/OBJECTIVES**

The undergraduate program (RN to BSN) prepares registered nurses as generalists in professional nursing practice. Graduates are equipped to function as leaders, managers and resource persons in a variety of health care settings. Higher order thinking and decision making are informed through both general and discipline specific education

Upon completion of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program, graduates will be prepared to:

- Design competent, caring professional nursing care for healthy, vulnerable and/or high risk individuals or populations in a variety of community based settings;
- Integrate knowledge from the physical and behavioral sciences and the humanities into professional nursing practice;
- Provide for human diversity in all its aspects in designing professional nursing care;
- Promote empowerment of individuals, populations and peers in fostering health promotion and disease prevention;
- Synthesize knowledge from nursing theory and research findings to professional nursing practice;
- Foster collaborative relationships with patients and with other professionals, disciplines and community organizations in promoting healthcare access and maintenance;
- Exhibit commitment to professional growth in advancing the values and role of professional nursing; and
- Participate in political and regulatory processes to influence healthcare systems and policy

Graduates are eligible for certification by the State of California as Public Health Nurses (PHN).

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum of 56 semester units of transferable college credit with a grade point average of at least 2.0 (C) or better in all transferable course work (non-residents, 2.4), and have satisfied any high school subject deficiency in English and mathematics by equivalent course work (the maximum transferable credit accepted from a two-year college is 70 semester units.) Effective Fall, 1998, English composition, Speech, GE Math and Logic/Critical Thinking must be completed prior to admission for new applicants.
- Current RN licensure in the United States, or its equivalent, or an RN interim permit. (Demonstrated clinical competence, validated through work history or by a clinical examination, RN licensure, and personal professional liability insurance are required prior to enrolling in a nursing performance course.)

Diploma Nurse Applicants. Diploma R.N.s who have not met the 56 unit entrance requirement may be considered for admission.

**Program Structure.** The baccalaureate program comprises classes and/or examinations that include content essential for professional nursing practice. Three options are open to the student:

- A series of classes. Classes are offered in one-and two-unit modules. The student will take course work and be graded after each course module.
- A series of written and performance assessments which may be taken in lieu of selected courses. The student receives a study packet and takes the examination. Students who successfully pass the examination MUST enroll in and challenge the corresponding nursing course. See procedures under "Assessment Option".
- 3. A combination of classes and assessments.

## HOW TO BEGIN

- 1. Review program materials/speak with Student Services Center.
- Submit Admission Application, fee and a copy of your current R.N. license. (Request a CSU Application packet from the SNP Central Office at 310/243-3596 or 800/344-5484.)
- 3. Request transcripts be sent directly to Admissions and Records. Also request a copy be sent directly to you. All transcripts must be received by the admissions deadline or disenrollment from classes will result. All GE prerequisites must be completed prior to admission for new applicants unless adult admission criteria is met. Call Student Services Center if you have any questions 800/344-5484.
- 4. Complete a registration form for BSN 301 & 310 plus any other beginning classes after acceptance.
- 5. All new applications submitted after the application deadline must be accompanied by a registration form for BSN 301 & 310 class that semester. Students who do not register and take at least one unit in the semester they apply are required to reapply.
- 6. Obtain textbook and course materials for BSN 301 & 310 and other classes (See BSN book order form in this schedule.) and begin preparing for class. Review module text; complete pre-assignment before first class.
- 7. Attend first class meetings or log on-line.
- You may not attend class, or log into an on-line class, until the Admissions and Records Office performs an evaluation of your documents and admits you.

## **BSN COURSE INFORMATION**

## ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better in all courses taken to satisfy the requirements for the degree is required. A student will be placed on probation if, in any term, he or she has failed to earn a grade point average of 2.0 or higher for the work taken that term. During the subsequent probationary term the student must achieve a grade point average of 2.0 or better. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the program.

All nursing major and nursing support courses/modules must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. A course/module may be repeated only once according to University policy.

## ELECTIVE COURSES FOR MATRICULATED STUDENTS

Undergraduate and graduate students may earn elective credit. Undergraduate students taking a graduate level course may specify in writing to Admissions and Records Office at the time of registration if the credit earned is to be applied toward the BSN degree or reserved for a future graduate degree.

## PERFORMANCE COURSES



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BSN 301 TECHNOLOGY FOR THE INFORMATION AGE (1).

Prerequisite: Admission to undergraduate program. This course focuses on the impact of the information age on nursing education, research and practice. Informatics as a discipline is introduced. Access to a computer with modem, e-mail including a personal address and WWW capability is required.

### **BSN 310 PROFESSIONAL NURSING HORIZONS (2).**

Prerequisite: Admission to undergraduate program. This twounit course presents a systematic problem-solving approach which will help nurses assess potential roles and options, establish career goals, and identify resources which can guide them on a path toward fulfilling their own educational and professional goals.

#### BSN 305 HUMAN DIVERSITY AND HEALTH CARE (4).

*Pre- or Corequisite: BSN 310.* Uses cross cultural and family theory to explore forms of human diversity, including culture, gender, age, and family form. Analyzes how human diversity affects health/illness dynamics, and how recognition of ethnocentrism and bias can help improve health care delivery.

### BSN 315 LIFE CYCLE (3).

*Pre- or Corequisite: BSN 310.* This three unit course explores the biological psychological, cognitive, and social aspects of human development throughout each stage of the life cycle. Each module is organized around the growth of the individual within the context of the family structure.

#### BSN 340 PROFESSIONAL COLLABORATION INNURSING PRACTICE (3).

*Pre- or Corequisite: BSN 301 & 310.* Examines communication skills critical to the practice of nursing, incorporating theoretical principles and applications. Includes analysis of helping relationships with clients, as well as collaboration, networking, negotiation, and conflict resolution in interdisciplinary health care settings.

## **BSN 345 PATHOPHYSIOLOGY (4).**

*Pre- or Corequisite: BSN 301 &BSN 310.* Explores the response of the human body to illness and injury with respect to common disorders of the major physiologic systems. Clinical correlations are provided to assist the health professional in applying this knowledge toward proposing therapeutic interventions.

## **BSN 380 HEALTH ASSESSMENT (4).**

Prerequisite or Corequisite BSN 301, BSN 310 & all other 300 level courses. Provides opportunity to gain basic knowledge and skills required to perform a complete nursing health assessment of pediatric, adult and geriatric patients. The performance component provides opportunity for application of knowledge and skills in the practice setting.

### **BSN400HEALTH TEACHING AND PROMOTION(3).**

*Pre- or Corequisite: all BSN 300 level courses.* Explores the concepts of health promotion and interelates them with the health teaching process. A variety of client situations and appropriate teaching strategies are considered. Learning needs within health care institutions are investigated and program evaluation is addressed.

#### BSN 405 STATISTICS (3).

Prerequisite: Fulfillment of the ELM requirement for BSN students: Includes development and application of the following topics: Descriptive and Inferential Statistics, Mathematics of Finance, Linear Programming and Graph Theory.

#### BSN410COMMUNITY-BASEDNURSINGI(5)

Prerequisite: All BSN 300 level courses + BSN400; 405 recommended. This course explores the role of the home health care nurse within the context of the community. The promotion and restoration of health, prevention of disease, health teaching and the provision of nursing care to individuals and families are emphasized. A performance module is included.

#### BSN 420 COMMUNITY-BASED NURSING II (5)

Prerequisite: All BSN 300 level courses, 400 & 410. Recommended 405 & 460. This course explores dimensions of community health nursing from a community perspective and focuses on the "community as the client" for health promotion, disease prevention, and risk reduction. Epidemiological principles and evidence-based nursing interventions are applied. Performance component required.

### BSN 430 HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS, POLICY AND FINANCE (3).

*Pre or Corequisite: all BSN 300 level courses.* Overview of health policy generation, regulation and implementation. Nursing is viewed as pivotal in promoting public health policy, advocating for nursing and health care reform and critically evaluating key outcomes of health care programs. Financing models are critically examined.

## **BSN COURSE DESCRIPTION**

#### BSN 440 PROFESSIONAL NURSING ROLES (3)

Prerequisite: BSN 300 level courses. The foundations of professional nursing practice from historical, philosophical, ethical, political, and legal perspectives are explored. Significant issues are analyzed and strategies presented. Diverse roles and setting for nursing practice are examined. The relationship between theory, research, and nursing practice is analyzed.

## BSN 450 PRINCIPLES OF LEADERSHIP ANDMANAGEMENT (5).

#### Prerequisite: BSN 300 level courses.

This course integrates theoretical principles with role performance experiences to provide nurses with the knowledge base to be effective leaders/managers in today's healthcare environment. Comprehensive discussion of topics such as strategic planning, power, advocacy, collaboration and resources is facilitated.

#### **BSN 460 NURSING RESEARCH UTILIZATION (3).**

Pre- or Corequisite: All BSN 300 level courses, BSN 405 may be concurrent. Examines scientific clinical nursing rationale for research utilization and theory-based practice. Concepts of research methods, processes, analyze relevant nursing problems for clinical effective practice.

## ELECTIVES

### BSN325COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE HEALTH CARE MODALITIES(1)

Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310. Examines the role of traditional healers in the context of culture. An overview of some Eastern and Western approaches to healing is offered. Students investigate through interviews, field trips, internet and liternature searches a variety of non-conventional therapies.

#### BSN 335BIOCHEMISTRY (4)

*Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310.* Explores the principles underlying the chemistry of living systems and how the human organism meets vital needs. It provides an introduction to the chemistry of bioenergetics, metabolism, biosynthesis, and molecular physiology.

### BSN 416 CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT (CQI) IN HEALTHCARE(1)

Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310. This course focuses on multidisciplinary perspectives of health care quality management. Case studies and discussions relating to statistical tools, approaches to operations management, organizational behavior, and CQI implementation in health care settings in introduced.

#### BSN 426 NURSING AND TELEHEALTH (2)

*Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310.* Explores the provision of healthcare by the multidisciplinary team to geographically remote clients through the use of sophisticated multiple technologies. The role of the nurse in telehealth is examined in terms of professional preparation and practice considerations.'

#### BSN436PRINCIPLESOFHEALTHCAREBUDGETING(2)

Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310. This course explores the basics of the healthcare budgeting process. Cost concepts, forecasting and variance analysis are reviewed. Emphasis is centered on the operating budget and performance based budgeting. Rationale for costing out nursing services is discussed.

## BSN 446 INTRODUCTION TO NURSING CASEMANAGEMENT (2)

Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310. This elective course explores the origins of case management and its relation to managed care. Strategies and processes are analyzed. Opportunities to examine real problems that arise in the nursing case manager role will be provided.

### BSN456HEALTH AND THE GLOBAL VILLAGE(1)

*Prerequisite: BSN 301 & 310.* This course investigates international health, focusing on developing countries and the effect of globalization on world health. The potential of telehealth is considered. Characteristics of the successful international practitioner are discussed and professional opportunities abroad are explore.

### **BSN 494 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3).**

A course of study designed cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the Program Coordinator, to accomplish individualized learning objectives that are appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students should contact advisor prior to enrolling to determine the appropriateness of this course for degree completion.)

### BSN 495 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3).

These courses offer student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

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Division of Nursing offers nurses with baccalaureate degrees from foreign nursing schools, non-NLN accredited nursing schools, or those with nonnursing baccalaureate degrees the opportunity to complete the requirements for the Public Health Nurse Certificate. The Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) issues the Public Health Nurse Certificate in California when specific course content has been completed. The process for obtaining the certificate differs depending on where the nurse received their bachelor's degree. Find the category below that best describes your educational preparation and follow the instructions given.

## DIVISION OF NURSING, BSN GRADUATES

All BSN graduates of the Division of Nursing are automatically eligible for the Certificate. Upon graduation, the names of BSN graduates are forwarded to the BRN by the Division of Nursing.

- Contact the BRN at 916/322-1988 or write P. O. Box 944210; Sacramento, CA 94244-2100 and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Return the completed application to the BRN with the \$75 fee.

### CURRENT DIVISION OF NURSING, MSN PATHWATY STUDENT

You must be a current MSN Pathway student. After completing the Pathway requirements:

- Contact Student Services Center 310/ 243-2050 and obtain a change of objective form.
- Complete and return this form, and a copy of your transcripts and Pathway evaluation (Graduate Student Action for Conditional Admission form) for review and evaluation.
- If all requirements have been met, your name will be forwarded to A & R for clearance and then to the BRN.
- Contact the BRN and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Complete the application and return to the BRN with a \$75 fee.

## GRADUATES FROM A FOREIGN NURSING SCHOOL : DO NOT ATTEND WORKSHOP

If you are currently licensed as a registered nurse in California and have earned a BSN from a school outside the United States or from a U.S. school that was not accredited by the National League for Nursing at the time that you graduated:

- Contact the BRN at the 916/322-1988 or write P. O. Box 944210, Sacramento, CA 94244-2100, and request a PHN Certificate application.
- Complete and return the application to the BRN with the \$75 fee.

- Request transcripts be sent to the BRN from all schools you have attended.
- The BRN will evaluate your transcripts for completion of PHN Certificate content and will either issue the certificate or a letter of deficiency.
- If you receive a letter of deficiency contact Kunnary Mok, for a letter of process and instructions, enroll in the required courses using Open University registration form. (See table of contents).
- After completing required coursework, request that your transcripts be sent by CSUDH to the BRN & your certificate will be issued by them in 6-8 weeks.

### NURSES WITH NON-NURSING BACCALAUREATE DEGREES:

If your bachelors degree is NOT in nursing:

- Enroll in one of the workshops listed on the following page.
- You will then receive confirmation and requirements.
- Send copies of all unofficial transcripts and course description to the PHN Coordinator one month prior to the workshop.
- Following the workshop and transcript evaluation, you will be eligible to apply for admission to the PHN program, and to enroll in the courses you need.
- When all requirements are met, you will be eligible to apply to the BRN for the PHN Certificate.



#### THE PROGRAM

The graduate program prepares professional nurses for advanced and specialized practice. The curriculum is organized around the role of the nurse in societal institutions with emphasis on the application of theory through excellence in professional practice, and the advancement of the profession through research, leadership, and scholarship for the ultimate benefit of the health care needs of society.

### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVES**

Upon completion of the program graduates will be able to:

- Use epidemiological, social, environmental, and physiological data to draw inferences regarding the health status of individuals, families, groups, and communities, with a special emphasis on vulnerable, high risk, and diverse populations;
- Develop, monitor, and evaluate comprehensive, holistic plans of care that address the health promotion, disease prevention, and health deviation needs of client populations;
- Incorporate theories and research in generating nursing interventions to promote, preserve, and restore health and healthy lifestyles in client populations;
- Foster multidisciplinary approaches to strategies and resources which empower client populations to attain and maintain maximal functional wellness;
- Influence regulatory, legislative, and public policy in private and public arenas to promote and preserve healthy communities; and
- Practice in an advanced nursing leadership role to influence professional and healthcare systems.

### **ROLE EMPHASIS OPTIONS**

The curriculum allows the student to request role emphasis as nurse educator, nurse administrator, clinical nurse specialist in parent-child nursing or gerontological nursing, or family nurse practitioner. Through a personalized Program of Study the curriculum is individualized and reflective of the student's learning needs and professional goals.

#### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please refer to the section on Admissions. In addition, please note the following special requirements for admission to the MSN program:

- Completion of a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution with an upper division major in nursing (BSN) and NLN accredited nursing program or the equivalent as determined by the Student Affairs Committee.
- Overall grade point average of 3.0 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the faculty, following the appeal process.
- Current licensure in the United States. License must be submitted with application. Personal professional liability insurance is required prior to enrolling in a nursing performance course.
- As indicated in the Admission Application, send an official transcript to Admissions and Records and request a copy be sent directly to you.
- The Graduation Writing Examination (GWE) must be met prior to OR during the first semester of coursework with a score of 8 or better.

## NON-NURSING BACHELOR'S DEGREES

Registered nurses who have earned a bachelor's degree in another field may be eligible for the BA/BS Pathway to the MSN degree. (See this schedule for information on the MSN Pathway.) All potential Pathway students must attend a special MSN Pathway Program Workshop.

#### FEDERAL TRAINEESHIPS

A Professional Nurse Traineeship grant may be awarded by the **Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service.** The grant monies when awarded are designated for registration fees and other expenses for selected students who are pursuing graduate level coursework in nursing as Nurse Educators, CNSs, or FNPs, and meet the eligibility criteria

established by the USDHHS, PHS and CSUDH/Graduate Nursing Department. Nurse Administrator students are not eligible under Federal guidlines. Please call 310/243-3426 for current information regarding eligibility and application procedures.

## **PROGRAM STRUCTURE**

All Students complete 17 units of core courses before beginning role emphasis courses.

Students may request role emphasis preparation as: Nurse educator with advanced clinical focus, nurse administrator, parent-child clinical nurse specialist, gerontology clinical nurse specialist, family nurse practitioner.

Within the role emphasis option subspecialization may occur. The student focuses on a specific nursing practice area. For example, quality improvement, the depressed elderly, parenting, or client education/teaching.

### HOW TO BEGIN

- 1. Review program materials and attend an information session.
- Submit admission application and fee. Request a CSU admission application packet by calling 310/243-3596 or application is online at http://www.csudh.edu.
- Request transcripts (As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to Admissions and Records. Request a copy sent directly to you.) All documents must be in by the deadlines stated in this schedule.
- 4. Submit copy of R.N. license with application.
- Register for Nursing Informatics and attend Mandatory Workshop. Order texts and course materials from Textbook Connection.
- 6. With your first registration, add \$5.00 to your total fee. The \$5.00 is a ONE TIME fee to cover costs and handling of your ID/library card.
- 7. You will be notified formally of your admission status.
- You must take at least one unit in the term for which you applied.

#### CURRICULUM\*

The program consists of 33-53 semester units of approved graduate study. The curriculum consists of core courses, role option, role performance courses, and a directed project, or thesis, or comprehensive exam. Elective units round out the graduate program requirements. Up to nine approved units may be accepted for transfer credit. All role performance courses have dates and hours in addition to those listed in this class schedule. A revised MSN curriculum was implemented in July, 1998 following University Curriculum Committee approval.

- All prerequisites, MSN coursework, and Directed Project, or Thesis, or Comprehensive Examination can be completed within the 5 year time period designated by CSUDH depending on personal preferences for class sites and dates, and the number of units carried each semester.
- Grade averages are calculated each semester by University Admissions and Records. To maintain acceptable standing in the MSN program a "B" average is required.
- All core courses are non-sequenced except for Informatics which must be taken prior to or concurrent with first core course.
- Any deviation in course/module sequence requires prior written approval by the Graduate Coordinator and Department Chair.
- All coursework, including electives, are to be completed prior to MSN 599, Directed Project, Thesis or Comprehensive Exam.

## COMPLETION OF DEGREE

Prior to the completion of MSN 592 Advanced Nursing Research, the graduate student must request one of the following culminating experiences:

# Alternative I: Coursework and Thesis or Directed Project (33-53 units)

- 1. Complete approved program with a minimum of 33 units of coursework depending on role option with at least a 3.70 GPA for Thesis and 3.50 GPA for directed Project.
- Complete approved thesis or directed project (3 units). See advisor for guidelines and selection criteria for Thesis or Directed Project.

## Alternative II: Coursework and Examination (33-53 units)

- Complete an approved program of 33-53 units of coursework depending on role option with at least a "B" (3.0) average (including core courses).\*
- Pass a comprehensive written examination. After completion
  of all coursework the student may apply to take the comprehensive examination. There is only one retake opportunity.

\*If a comprehensive exam is elected rather than the directed project or thesis, 3 units of electives must be taken except for FNP role option students.


## COURSE PREREQUISITES

Certain MSN courses require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the graduate program, but available as undergraduate nursing courses. These prerequisite courses are as follows:

Statistics and Nursing Research: An-upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent and an upper division introductory research course or equivalent are prerequisite to MSN 530.

Health Assessment: An academic, upper division, undergraduate course, less than 5 years old, with clinical lab experience or equivalent is required of Health Educator, Clinical Nurse Specialist and Family Nurse Practitioner students.

Pathophysiology: An academic upper division, undergraduate course, less than 5 years old, or equivalent course is required for the Clinical Nurse Specialist and Family Nurse Practitioner.



## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS EFFECTIVE FALL 1998

#### MSN 501 NURSING INFORMATICS (1).

Contribution of nursing informatics to advanced roles is examined, including relationships among critical thinking, computer literacy, information literacy, and nursing informatics. Exercises in data/ information management applied to nursing research, theory, and advanced role evaluated.

#### MSN 504 ADVANCED NURSING ROLES (2).

Prerequisite: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment. This course will facilitate transition into advanced nursing roles. The requirements for and the regulation of advanced roles will be explored, including dealing with role ambiguity and changing role boundaries. Participation in the profession and exertion of leadership in the profession and the health care system will be examined.

#### MSN 510 THEORIES FOR ADVANCED NURSING ROLES (3).

Prerequisite: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment. Focuses on the use of nursing theory in advanced nursing roles in response to health related human phenomena in diverse settings. The evolution of nursing models and theories is explored including history, philosophy of science, and utilization.

## MSN 513 HEALTH CARE POLICY/ECONOMICS (3)

Prerequisite: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment. Explores characteristics of the current healthcare environment with emphasis on advanced nursing practice, as it pertains to policy development, health planning, and economic management at the national, state and local levels. Multidisciplinary decisions regarding equitable distribution of existing resources, policy development, program evaluation, and client/ population outcomes will be explored.

### MSN 514 HEALTH PROMOTION AND DISEASE PREVENTION (3)

Prerequisite: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment. Examines traditional and alternative theoretical and conceptual bases of wellness from the perspective of nursing and health. The focus is on the assessment, diagnosis, intervention and outcome evaluation of wellness and disease prevention needs and issues encountered in advanced nursing roles.

#### MSN 521 NURSE EDUCATOR: THEORY (4).

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535 and 523 or 537 Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. Examines the role of nurse educator in community, academic and agency settings. Curriculum development is analyzed, synthesized, and evaluated. Emphasis on transforming a curricular framework into instructional design reflecting current learning theory, technology, and healthcare systems.

## MSN 522 NURSE ADMINISTRATOR: THEORY (4).

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530 and 535. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. This course examines the evolution and contemporary status of the role of the nursing service administrator within complex systems. Particular emphasis will be placed upon the management of primary organizational, financial and human resources, utilization of information science and technology, and selected conceptual tools.

#### MSN 523 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: PARENT CHILDI (3).\*

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535, 526 & 527. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 553 & 591 are required. An academic, upper division undergraduate Health Assessment and Pathophysiology is required. Focuses on the child and family from childbearing and early childrearing through adolescence, emphasizing biopsychosocial and developmental aspects of child, family and parent growth and development.

#### MSN 524 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: GERONTOLOGY (6).

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535, 526 & 527. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 554 and 591 are required. An academic, upper division undergraduate Health Assessment and Pathophysiology is required. Theoretical perspectives on aging and normative aging. processes within the context of the family and society. Nursing assessment, diagnosis, intervention and evaluation will be applied to common alterations in health as well as to high-risk human responses to health problems associated with aging. The advanced nursing role in promoting, maintaining and advocating health for senior adults is emphasized including fostering self-care in the senior population.

## MSN 525 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: PARENT CHILD II (3)

Prerequisite: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535, 523, 526, and 527. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 553 and 591 are required. Building on CNS Parent Child I, Pharmacology and Advanced Health Assessment, the advanced practice role of the nurse as clinician, researcher, educator, consultant in the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of programs for special populations is emphasized.

## MSN 526: PHARMACOLOGY (3)

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535 or permission of Chair. This course examines the theoretical basis for pharmacological treatment of common health problems seen by the Family Nurse Practitioner. Selected classifications of drugs will be discussed. Ethical and legal issues of drug administration and the role of the Family Nurse Practitioner will be explored.

## MSN 527: ADVANCED HEALTH ASSESSMENT (3)

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535 or permission of Chair. Examines theory and practice of advanced health assessment, and application to the advanced practice role. Emphasizes analysis and synthesis of subjective and objective date to identify health problems and develop management plans. Health promotion, risk factor identification, and recognition of common abnormalities in advanced practice are explore.

### MSN 530 RESEARCH UTILIZATION IN ADVANCED NURSING PRACTICE (3).

Prerequisites: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment. Requires an upper division statistics and research courses. Prepares the nurse to critique and apply research findings in nursing practice. Critical thinking is related to problem identification, assessment of data, and outcome evaluation. Research methodologies, including qualitative and quantitative approaches, are examined and related to nursing informatics.

## **MSN COURSE DESCRIPTIONS**

## MSN 535 ETHICS IN ADVANCED NURSING ROLES (2).

*Prerequisites: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment.* Examines the theoretical/conceptual bases of ethics from a nursing perspective. Focus is on the analysis, synthesis, and resolution of ethical issues encountered in advanced nursing roles. Ethical relationships among nursing theory, research, and practice in healthcare delivery to a diverse population are explored.

# MSN 536: CASE MANAGEMENT ACROSS THE HEALTH CARE CONTINUUM (3)-ELECTIVE

Prerequisites: MSN 501 or concurrent enrollment; 504 is recommended. Student examines clinical case management in depth. Models of nursing care delivery are compared/contrasted with clinical case management. Student articulates current economic influences on case management, and develops business plan strategy.

## MSN 537: GERONTOLOGY FOR NURSES (3) ELECTIVE

Prerequisites: MSN 501 & 504. This course focuses on the health care delivery system and public policies that affect older adults. Theory and current research associated with common clinical problems and therapeutic nursing interventions are examined. Nursing care of at risk groups is emphasized.

## MSN 551 NURSE EDUCATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE I (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 521 and concurrent enrollment in 592 is required. Clinical focus provides the basis for implementing the nurse educator role in an educational institution or health care setting. The student will apply and evaluate didactic and clinical teaching/learning concepts and strategies. "CR/NC grading."

## MSN 552 NURSE ADMINISTRATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE I (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 522 and concurrent enrollment in 592 is required.. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting, focusing on a change project. The student will formulate, implement and evaluate a change plan based on a conceptual nursing model. "CR/NC grading."

## MSN 553 CHILD BEARING AND REARING: ROLE PERFORMANCE: TODDLER: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).\*

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535, 526 & 527. Concurrent enrollment in 523, 525 and 591 are required. An opportunity for the student to implement the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the childbearing family. The student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 554 GERONTOLOGY CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST: ROLE PERFORMANCE (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 501, 504, 510, 513, 514, 530, 535, 526 & 527. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 524 and 591 are required. An opportunity to implement the gerontological CNS role in a selected health care setting. Emphasis is on health screening and clinical decision making related to ethics, legal and regulatory influences on care of elderly persons. Instructor and clinical preceptor guide experiences. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 555 QUALITY IMPROVEMENT IN HEALTH CARE (3)-ELECTIVE

Prerequisite: MSN 501. This course explores the evolution of quality initiatives in health care. The major elements of a quality assessment and improvement program and their relationship to organizational performance are explored. Outcomes assessment and management in health care are explored as unique to the health care setting.

#### MSN 556: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY I (4)

Prerequisites: MSN 526 and 527 or permission of Chair. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. Examines theoretical basis for pharmacological treatment of common health problems. Emphasis will be placed on comprehensive assessment and management of common acute health problems seen in the care of clients across the life span.

### MSN 557: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY I: ROLE PERFORMANCE (4)

Prerequisites: MSN 526 and 527 or permission of the Chair. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. This preceptored supervised clinical experience emphasizes comprehensive assessment and management of common health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 566: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY II (4)

Prerequisites: MSN 556, 557 or permission of Chair. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. Examines theoretical and conceptual basis for advanced practice as a Family Nurse Practitioner. Emphasis is on comprehensive assessment and management of common chronic health problems.

#### MSN 567: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY II: ROLE

**PERFORMANCE (4)** Prerequisites: MSN 556, 557 or permission of Chair. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 591 is required. This preceptored supervised clinical experience emphasizes comprehensive assessment and management of common acute and chronic health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 576: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY III (4)

*Prerequisites: MSN 566, 567 or permission of Chair.* Emphasis will be placed on comprehensive assessment and management of increasingly complex acute and chronic health problems seen in the care of clients across the life span. Specific emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the family unit within a culturally diverse environment.

### MSN 577: PRIMARY CARE OF THE FAMILY III: ROLE PERFORMANCE (4)

Prerequisites: MSN 566, 567 or permission of Chair. This final preceptored supervised clinical experience emphasizes comprehensive assessment and management of complex health problems seen in the primary care of clients across the life span. Emphasis will be placed on the primary care of the individual and family within a culturally diverse environment. "CR/NC grading"

## MSN 561 NURSE EDUCATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE II (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 551. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required.. The student demonstrates advanced clinical knowledge and competency with a selected population. Clinical knowledge and skill are applied to a teaching situation. "CR/NC grading."

#### MSN 562 NURSE ADMINISTRATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE II (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 552. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting. The student will apply valid and reliable measures of performance evaluation to nurse administrator performance and organizational performance. "CR/NC grading."

### MSN 563 CHILD REARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PRE-SCHOOL AGE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).\*

Prerequisites: MSN 553. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the emerging family. The student provides advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 564 THERAPEUTIC INTERVENTIONS: CNS GERONTOLOGY ROLE PERFORMANCE (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 554. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. Focus is on application and evaluation of an advanced practice model under the guidance of a clinical preceptor and instructor. Therapeutic nursing interventions are investigated for theory and research foundations and implemented in providing care to elderly clients. "CR/NC grading"

## MSN 571 NURSE EDUCATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE III (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 561. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required.. Student synthesizes knowledge and skill from previous graduate theory and clinical coursework in the nurse educator role in a selected educational institution or health care setting. "CR/NC grading."

#### MSN 572 NURSE ADMINISTRATOR: ROLE PERFORMANCE III (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 562. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity for the student to initiate the nurse administrator role in a selected health care setting focusing on professional and regulatory requirements. The student formulates a nursing service plan for integrating quality measures with cost control and case management practice. "CR/NC grading."

#### MSN 573 CHILD REARING ROLE PERFORMANCE: ADOLESCENT: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).\*

Prerequisites: MSN 563. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity for the student to initiate the clinical nurse specialist role in a selected health care setting which focuses on the early childrearing family. The student will provide comprehensive advanced clinical nursing care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary health care team. "CR/NC grading"

## MSN 574 THERAPEUTIC INTERVENTIONS: ROLE PERFOR-MANCE GERONTOLOGY CNS (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 564. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity to develop the CNS role of teacher/leader. Emphasis is on staff development to enhance care provision to elderly clients and on program development and evaluation for at risk groups of elderly clients. Instructor and clinical preceptor guide experiences. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 583 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: PARENT-CHILD CNS (2).\*

Prerequisites: MSN 573. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. An opportunity for the student to select a field setting and operationalize a comprehensive CNS role in a focused clinical specialty. "CR/NC grading"

#### MSN 584 CULMINATING ROLE PERFORMANCE: GERONTOLOGY CNS (2).

Prerequisites: MSN 574. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 592 is required. Continuation of CNS gerontology role development. Emphasis is on the researcher, case manager and consultant subroles. Opportunity is provided, under clinical preceptor and instructor guidance to implement and evaluate the effectiveness of the CNS role in selected health care settings. "CR/NC grading"

MSN 591 APPLIED RESEARCH FOR NURSING PRACTICE I (1)

Prerequisite: MSN 530. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 524 and 554; or 525 and 553; or 521; or 522; or 556 and 557 are required depending on role option. Focuses on developing a research question/hypothesis and methodological issues pertaining to specific role emphasis populations. Particular attention is paid to design, sampling, instrumentation, and data collection methods.

## MSN 592 APPLIED RESEARCH FOR NURSING PRACTICE II (2)

Prerequisite: MSN 591. Concurrent enrollment in MSN 551, 561 and 571; or 564, 574 and 584; or 563, 573 and 583; or 552, 562 and 572; or 566 and 567 are required depending on role option. Provides opportunity to utilize research findings through the conduct of a study focused on a special population related to the student's role option practice as Educator, Administrator, Family Nurse Practitioner, Parentchild Clinical Nurse Specialist, or Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist.

## MSN 594 INDEPENDENT STUDY (1-3).

A course of study designed cooperatively by student and instructor, and approved by the department chair, to accomplish individualized learning objectives appropriate to the role of the professional nurse. (Students must contact their advisor prior to enrolling.)

#### MSN 595 SPECIAL TOPICS/COLLOQUIA (1-3).

This course offers student groups an opportunity to explore a topic of current interest to the nursing profession with colleagues, faculty and special guest speakers.

#### **MSN 599 DIRECTED PROJECT OR THESIS (3).**

Prerequisites: MSN 591 & 592. The goal of all students enrolled in this course is to complete a scholarly project or thesis under the guidance of an assigned instructor. It is the culminating learning experience of a performance-based curriculum. The project or thesis must demonstrate a rigorous scientific approach, use a clearly documented theoretical framework, and have practical application to the student's selected role emphasis.

### MSN 600 PROJECT CONTINUATION COURSE (0).

Students who have not completed their MSN 599 Directed Project or thesis module by the end of the term may enroll in the following term in the Project Continuation Course.

## **MSN PATHWAY**

## MSN PATHWAY FOR RNs WITH A NON-NURSING BACCALAUREATE

Pathway students receive advisement directly from the Program Coordinator.

The Division of Nursing Program offers a pathway to facilitate a master's degree in nursing for those nurses who presently hold a bachelor's degree in another discipline.

Graduate study in nursing builds on a foundation of undergraduate professional nursing knowledge. Following an analysis of your previous coursework, a Program of Study will be recommended which includes undergraduate nursing and related coursework or assessments to prepare you for MSN coursework. If you meet the usual University requirements for graduate study and concur with the recommended Program of Study, you will be admitted to the graduate program on a conditional basis. Once the undergraduate course content requirements are successfully met, the conditional status is removed and you may proceed with completing the graduate curriculum. See MSN degree section for more details on graduate curriculum enrollment and completion requirements.



The Division of Nursing offers a certificate program in quality improvement for BSN prepared nurses who want to develop graduate level knowledge and skill in implementing an institutional quality improvement program. Included in this course of study is utilization review, assessment and measurement of the level of care provided to clients and the utilization of resources. The certificate program is administered by the Chair, Department of Graduate Nursing Science. To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must hold a current R.N. license and hold a BSN degree from an accredited US Institution. (Graduates of foreign institutions will need to have their transcripts evaluated by an international evaluation service). More information will be sent regarding this process upon receipt of the In addition, students must have an overall grade point application. average of 3.0 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the Nursing faculty, following the appeal process. As indicated in the Admission Application, official transcripts should be sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you and to your advisor.

Students who are admitted in the MSN degree program and want to add the Quality Improvement (QI) certificate program must file a revised Program of Study form with the Admissions and Records Office. Applicant must take Nursing Informatics as the first required course. Certain courses for the Quality Improvement (QI) Certificate require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the graduate program. These are:


- upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent
- Introductory research course or equivalent

Courses required by the certificate program may be met by coursework or by substitution approved by the Chair, or by Graduate Coordinator, with timely graduate level transferable course from other collegiate programs. Please note: if you eventually want to earn a MSN degree, any courses taken to meet certificate requirements may apply to the degree, but may not be more than 5 years old at the time of degree completion. The certificate program can be completed in 15 months or less, depending on your personal preference and availability of courses. Courses and modules must be completed in the approved sequence with a grade of C or better and an overall B average for the certificate program.

A certificate completion check must be done by the Admissions and Records Office one term prior to the term you plan to complete the QI certificate program. The certificate application form may be requested from Admissions and Records.

## MSN 555 Quality Improvement in Health Care

*Prerequisite: MSN 501.* This course explores the evolution of quality initiatives in health care. The major elements of a quality assessment and improvement program and their relationship to organizational performance are explored. Outcomes assessment and management in health care are explored as unique to the health care setting. (See MSN course descriptions for 501, 530, 522, 590 & 591)

#### **REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY**

#### **Continuing Students**

- You are considered a continuing student if you:
  - attended CSUDH as a matriculated student in Fall 1999 or Spring 2000, and
  - 2. have not attended another academic institution since attending CSUDH, and
  - have not applied to graduate from CSUDH Fall 1999 or Spring and Summer 2000.

If you are a **continuing** student and have not received a Registration Access Mailer or a letter regarding ineligibility one week before Touchtone Registration begins, please call the Registration Office, 310/243-3608.

#### New or Returning Students

You are a new student if you have not attended CSUDH before. You are a returning student if you:

- 1. have not enrolled for more than one semester
- attended another academic institution since last attending CSUDH, or
- graduated from CSUDH and choose to begin post-graduate studies.

Returning students must reapply for admission. Failure to pay registration fees or submit required admission documents will result in cancellation of your application and you will be required to reapply for a subsequent term.

#### **Returning from an Approved Planned Educational Leave**

Deadline to submit an application to return from a Planned Leave—first. day of the academic term in which you plan to return. You must submit a completed CSU Application (no application fee required) to the Office of Admissions and Records as official notification of your intent to return from an approved Planned Educational Leave. To be eligible for Touchtone Registration, your application to return must be submitted and processed prior to Touchtone Registration. If you have taken courses at another institution during your leave, you must also provide official transcripts. Please refer to the Planned Educational Leave of Absence section for additional information, and contact the Registration Unit if you have further questions, 310/243-3608.

#### **Concurrent or Visitor Enrollment**

Students from other CSU campuses wishing to enroll concurrently or as a visitor at CSUDH should consult their home campus class schedule for eligibility and procedures. Contact the Office of Admissions and Records at host campus for deadlines.

#### **Open University**

Students should consult the Open University section in this *Class* Schedule, complete the form and mail with payment to the Undergraduate Chair at the address noted on the form. This option is for nonmatriculated students only, i.e., you may not enroll concurrently in Nursing and/or regular campus courses and in Open University courses.

#### TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Each student eligible to register will receive a Registration Access Mailer or an admission letter from the Admissions and Records Office, which will provide important registration information:

- · Registration appointment date and time
- Personal Identification Number (PIN)
- Student Identification Number (SID)
- Major
- Holds preventing registration, if any

It is very important to review all the information printed and to clear all holds as soon as possible; do not wait until your registration appointment date and time.

#### **Appointment Date and Time**

You will not be able to access the Touchtone Registration System (T.O.R.O.S.) before the date and time printed on your Registration Access Mailer or admission letter. Appointment dates and times are determined by class level and number of units completed. Note that units in progress at CSUDH are not included and courses taken at another institution may not be included in the calculation of units completed.

It is important to register during the touchtone registration period at, or very soon after, your priority appointment time for the best selection of classes. Mailed requests to register or add will be accepted but not processed until your appointment date; however, registration and schedule adjustment via T.O.R.O.S. is quicker, more convenient and will provide you with the best course selection. If you are not able to register on your priority registration appointment day, you may register at any time after your appointment time through the end of the registration period, but you will be competing for classes with students with lower priority access. It is in your best interest to register as early as possible to secure a seat in your preferred classes!

#### Personal Identification Number (PIN)

Each student is assigned a 6-digit personal identification number. This PIN is used to access any of the touchtone applications (registration, billing, application status, financial aid status and grade reporting). You are urged to change your PIN for security reasons and to keep your PIN in a safe place. You can change your PIN via T.O.R.O.S. by making the appropriate selection at the opening menu; the recorded voice will guide you.

#### Student Identification Number (SID)

The 9-digit SID on your Registration Access Mailer or admission letter should match your social security number. If the number is incorrect, use the assigned number and then mail a request for a change of SID to the Admissions and Records Office after you have completed your registration. Include a copy of your social security card.

#### Holds

Holds must be cleared prior to registration. Clear holds immediately upon notification; do not wait until your registration appointment time. Refer to the appropriate department to release holds:

## TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION (T.O.R.O.S.) INSTRUCTIONS

Listen carefully; a recorded voice will prompt you after each entry.

- Prepare a list of classes you want to take; include CRN (Course Reference Number), section and number of units and a list of alternates in case your first choices are full.
- Call 310/243-2REG or 310/516-4538, from a touchtone telephone
- 3. Press 1 for Registration Information.
- 4. Press 1 to register, add or drop classes.
- 5. Enter your 9 digit Student ID Number (social security number).
- 6. Enter your 6 digit Personal Identification Number (PIN).
- Press 1 to register or adjust your schedule, or press 2 to review your schedule.
- Options if you entered 1 in step 7: Press 1 to Register or Add. Press 2 to Drop. Press 3 to make your Course Entries Permanent (required for all registrations, adds, drops and waitlisting). Press 4 to Check Course Availability. Press 5 to Review Your schedule.
- Enter 5 digit course request numbers (CRN) from your list of classes. If course is full: Press 1 to Check for Open Sections, Press 2 to Waitlist.
- 10. When you have entered all course numbers, press the ★ key followed by the # key to return to step 8. Then, select option 3 to make your entries permanent (confirm). Do not hang up without completing this step. Failure to complete this step will result in losing all your course entries. Stay on the line until you have heard that all course requests have been made permanent (registered or waitlisted).
- Press 9 to return to the main menu and to access your account balance.
- □ To end this call at any time, press the ★ key followed by the # key.

- □ To return to the selections you heard at the beginning of the call, press the ★ key followed by the 6 key.
- □ To have a prompt or selection repeated, press the ★ key followed by the 7 key.
- □ For menu help, press the ★ key, followed by the 4 key at any time.
- You may now pay registration fees by credit card via Touchtone after you have registered for classes. See instructions in this schedule of classes.

If the course is full, you will hear:

- Press 1 to check for open sections of the course and register for an alternate section, if possible, to maximize your enrolled units. If you decide to register for an alternate section, follow steps 9 and 10.
- □ If there are no available alternate sections or if you choose not to register for one, press the ★ key followed by the # key to go back to the previous menu. You are now back at step 8.

To waitlist your first choice section:

- Repeat steps 8 and 9.
- □ You will hear:

example: "When you make your entries permanent, you will be waitlisted for BSN 325.1, section 74, course request number 12345."

Complete your registration and follow step 10. Failure to make your entries permanent will result in not being on the waitlist.

## CREDIT CARD PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS

If you have completed registration you may call T.O.R.O.S. at 310/516-4493 to access billing information.

1. Press 1 for Account Balance.

Select the term for which you would like billing information. Enter your nine digit Student ID Number (social security number). Enter you six digit Personal Identification Number (PIN).

- 2. Press 1 to review your balance. (See NOTE below).
- 3. Press 2 to pay by credit card.

Select the type of credit card you will use to pay. Press 1 for Visa Press 2 for MasterCard Press 3 for Discover

4. Enter your credit card number.

Press 1 if the number repeated is correct. Press 2 if the number is incorrect and re-enter the credit card number.

5. Enter you credit card Expiration Date.

Press 1 if the expiration date repeated is correct. Press 2 if the expiration date is incorrect and re-enter the expiration date.

- 6. Select the amount you wish to pay.
  - Press 1 to pay the full amount you currently owe.

Press 2 if you choose to pay your registration fees using the CSUDH Installment Payment Plan. (See instructions below). Enter the amount you wish to pay using the star (\*) key as a decimal point.

Press 1 if the amount entered is repeated correctly. Press 2 to enter a different amount.

The system will place you on hold while your credit card is authorized. The system will inform you that your credit card has been accepted and will instruct you to hold while your payment is applied to your account. If your credit card is denied, you may start over with a different credit card. (Note: You will need to contact your credit card issuer if you wish to find out why your card has been denied.)

When the payment is applied to your account, the system will indicate the remaining amount due for the account, if any.

Press 9 to exit to the main menu.

## Paying by CSUDH Installment Payment Plan

If you choose to pay in installments, your first installment payment requires a signed copy of the Installment Payment Agreement and Application Form (see table of contents). You must bring this form in person, by mail or by fax 310/516-4432, to the Cashier's Office by the first payment deadline date. You may include payment of any prior balances with your credit card payment; however, you must pay the minimum installment amount due according to your student level, the date you register, and the number of units registered. If you pay less than the minimum, you may be dropped for non-payment. Please refer to table of contents of this schedule for information on the first installment payments.

NOTES: Your balance may not include all financial aid that may have been awarded to you. For further information regarding your financial aid, please call 310/243-3647.

Review your schedule periodically during the Registration and Late Registration periods to confirm your enrollment.
- If you are unable to register for classes because they are already full, call back periodically to check for newly opened seats as other students drop or are dropped for non-payment of fees.

## TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION (T.O.R.O.S.) INFORMATION

## **Making Your Entries Permanent**

It is very important to make your entries permanent before exiting T.O.R.O.S. Failure to do so will result in losing all your course requests. Refer to instructions.

#### Course Request Numbers (CRN)

Each course section has a unique 5-digit CRN, the number entered on your touchtone telephone key pad when selecting classes. The CRNs for telecourses are listed in the Telecourse section.

#### **Enrollment** Limit

A student may register/waitlist in a maximum of 18 units during Touchtone Registration. Students wishing to register for more than 18 units must wait until the Late Registration, Add/Drop period. The Program Coordinator's signature of approval is required to register for 19-21 units, and the signatures of the Program Coordinator and the Dean, School of Health are required to register for more than 21 units.

#### Full Classes/Waitlisting

If you attempt to register for a class that is already full, you will be given the option to place your name on a Waitlist. *If you choose to place your name on the Waitlist, remember that this does not mean you are enrolled in the class.* You **must** submit a Registration/Add Form signed by the Program Coordinator by the Add/Drop deadline in order to be officially enrolled in the class and obtain a grade. Please contact the Student Services Center at 800/344-5484 for referral to appropriate Program Coordinator.

### **Check Course Availability**

If you find that a desired course is full or canceled, you will be given the option to check for open sections of the same course. However, it is always best to have alternates ready before you attempt to register.

#### **Time Conflicts**

T.O.R.O.S. checks for time conflicts and will not allow registration in classes meeting at the same time. Contact the Registration Helpline at 310/243-3608 for procedures to add courses with time conflicts.

## Schedule Adjustment and Schedule Review

You may call back at any time through the end of the Registration period to change or review your schedule and account balance. If you choose to exchange one class for another, add the new class before dropping the other class (unless you have reached the maximum enrollment limit). If you wish to drop a class without adding another—do not delay—as a courtesy to another student trying to add the class.

# TOUCHTONE REGISTRATION WAITLIST

When you attempt to register for a class that is already full, you will be given the options of checking availability of another section of the same class or placing your name on a waitlist for the full section. It is very important that you read the following information and instructions before attempting to place yourself on a waitlist.

#### Automated Waitlist Information (April 24-August 22)

Careful planning and selection of classes are very important as the same restrictions apply to placing yourself on a waitlist as to attempting to register for classes. To maximize the number of units enrolled, you are strongly encouraged to check alternate section availability before placing yourself on a waitlist.

If the waitlist for a full class is already closed, contact the Student Services Center at 800/344-5484 for information on alternate sections.

This is how waitlisting works:

- you may not waitlist a section which has a time conflict with a registered or waitlisted section
- your may not waitlist a section if you are already registered or waitlisted for another section of the same class
- you may not waitlist a section if it is restricted to a major, class (e.g., seniors) or level (e.g., graduate) other than your own
- you may not register or waitlist more than 18 units of registered and/or waitlisted classes
- you must make your entries permanent (confirm) before exiting T.O.R.O.S. to secure your place in classes and on waitlists
- review your schedule periodically to verify your status
- if you wish to waitlist a regular campus CSUDH lecture/lab class or any class with a required co-requisite, e.g., THE 120/THE 120A or TED 305S/TED 405, you must waitlist both co-requisite sections or classes; failure to do so will result in not being on the waitlist for either co-requisite section

If you choose to waitlist a full class, you will be informed of your position on the waitlist by T.O.R.O.S. and the waitlisted classes will be listed after any registered classes when you make your entries permanent (confirm). You may drop yourself from a waitlist at any time during T.O.R.O.S. hours of operation. Remember that if you drop only one section of a corequisite pair that T.O.R.O.S. will drop you from the other co-requisite section.

Once there are students on the waitlist for a full class, *no more* registrations will be accepted. This will allow the University to give priority to waitlisted students over students who happen to call in when a seat has become available. The University will move students from waitlisted to registered status as seats become available and will mail written notification to students of the change in their schedules. Once your status in a class has been changed from waitlisted to enrolled, it is your responsibility to drop the class (as with any other class) if you decide not to attend; failure to do so will result in a "U" grade on your record which will lower your grade point average Note: At the beginning of the semester, the Department Chair and Program Coordinators will be provided with names of all students who placed themselves on the waitlist for full classes but who could not be officially registered because seats did not become available. It is your responsibility to attend the first class meeting to confirm that you are still interested in being added to the class, to obtain the Program Coordinator's signature of approval on a Registration/Add form, and to submit the form to the Registration Office before the last class meeting date. It is possible that the Program Coordinator may add you to a class from the waitlist once the semester has started; if so, you will receive notification from the Division of Nursing. It is your responsibility to drop any classes you do not plan to attend. Students who remain on a waitlist but do not officially enroll will not get credit for the class.

# LATE REGISTRATION/ADD PROCEDURES

August 28-October 6, 2000. Payment required with Registration/ Add form.

Use the Registration/Add form in this Class Schedule to register or add classes. Make copies as necessary.

It is your responsibility to ensure that your completed Registration/Add form is received before the first class meeting dates and by October 6, 2000.

- Complete the Registration/Add form. Include the correct course request number, course and section number and course start date for each course/module you wish to take either by course work or by challenge/assessment.
- 2. A Late Registration fee of \$25.00 is assessed for all students registering after August 22, 2000.
- Registration forms without payment will be returned unprocessed.
- 4. Checks will be deposited from late registrants who submit registration forms before being admitted to the University. You cannot be registered until you are oficially admitted to the University.

Calculate fee payment and attach check or complete credit card payment authorization. Checks should be made payable to CSUDH.

If, on receipt of your mailed or faxed registration request, a course is already full and a waitlist exists, you will be notified, in writing, by the Admissions and Records Office that you have been placed on the waitlist.

If your fees are to be paid by a third party who prefers to send payment directly to the University, a purchase order must be completed by the third party, payable to the University. The purchase order must accompany the Registration/Add form and must include the name and social security number of the student for whom payment is made. Both documents are to be submitted to the Admissions and Records office.

# LATE REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

#### Late Adds

For students who were unable to add a course via Touchtone Registration, late adds must be requested on or before first class meeting or by October 6, whichever occurs first. - All refunds are made in accordance with Title V of the California Administrative code.

# **GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS**

## CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

Each candidate for a baccalaureate degree must complete general education coursework as prescribed by the Board of /Trustees in Title 5 of the Administrative Code. The program consists of 48 semester units of course approved for this purpose, including nine semester units taken during the junior and senior years and approved as upper division G.E. courses. At least nine of the required 48 units must be completed in residence.

Since the Division of Nursing offers primarily upper division and graduate courses, most general education work will be completed prior to enrollment in the program or by referral to another institution after matriculation. A student may satisfy the General Education requirements in any one or a combination of the following ways:

#### Prior to matriculation:

- Completion of courses or examinations that are approved as meeting particular requirements by CSU campuses, California community colleges, or other participating campuses.
- Completion of courses at other institutions determined to meet particular requirements.

#### After matriculation:

- Completion of approved courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university (students should consult with their advisor for information on the course substitution process prior to enrolling in any course which is intended to satisfy a General Education requirement.)
- Completion of designated courses or examinations approved for General Education purposes (contact local advisor for courses.)

## **REQUIRED PATTERN OF STATUTORY COURSES**

- A. Communication in English (9 semester units)
- 1. Oral communication an introductory course in speech.
- 2. Written communication a standard course in freshman composition.
- Critical thinking a course in logic, argumentation, or critical thinking.
- B. Science and Mathematics (12 semester units)
- A general introductory course in astronomy, chemistry, geology, physical science, or physics.\*
- A general introductory course in biology, botany, or zoology.\* At least one course in either category 1 or 2 must include a laboratory; however, it is recommended that two laboratory courses be taken.
- A mathematics, or other quantitative course equivalent to advanced algebra (higher level than intermediate algebra). This course should have a prerequisite of at least two years of college preparatory mathematics. The ELM requirement must be met or exemption attained.
- C. Humanities (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: art, drama, language, literature, music, and philosophy. No more than six semester units may be activity or performance courses.

## D. Social and Behavioral Sciences (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology. Certain courses which meet these requirements may also be applied to the requirements described in statutory requirements.

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- E. Whole Person (3 units) (Lifelong Understanding).
- F. Upper division

May be satisfied with BSN prerequisites.

G. Cultural Pluralism (Course covers non Western civilization)

A course dealing with ethnic or other minorities in America is highly recommended.

#### Statutory Requirements

Requirement in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution and California State and Local Government. (National BSN students need to consult their advisor regarding their state's courses.) Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 40404, requires that each student demonstrate competency in these areas to qualify for graduation. Students who have not met these requirements at the time of admission may do so by completing appropriate courses or by passing comprehensive examinations prepared and administered by most CSU campuses. Courses used to meet this requirement may also be applied to the requirements in section D.

Students who began undergraduate study in September, 1981 or thereafter are responsible for meeting these requirements. Students enrolling for an additional bachelor's degree must meet any difference between these and any previous requirements that may have been completed.

The initial general education evaluation cost will be included in the admission application fee of \$55. For additional transcript evaluation updates, a fee of \$5 will be charged per transcript revision.

(Remote Educational Access Program) for students who live a considerable distance from the college. Telecourses are broadcast one-to-two times a week (check Coastline's class schedule). MATH 100-FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPTS OF MATH 3.0 Units History of mathematics, the axiomatic method and the nature of proof, relations and functions; the real number system with applications, computers and calculators; metric measurement; geometry; probability; statistics and graphing. CSU B4

**PREREQUISITE:** Math 030/Intermediate Algebra or achieve a qualifying score on a math placement test from any accredited two or four year institution. Please see below on how to fulfill this prerequisite with Coastline.

Grading: Graded A, B, C, D, F. (D and F grades are not transferable), CR, NC (CR work equals to grades A, B, C only.)

Semesters Begin: Early September, early February and an eight week condensed summer semester in mid-June.

# OFF-CAMPUS EXAMS

Political Science and US History may be taken to receive certification only or certification plus 3 units of credit. California State & Local Government must be taken for Certification only. These comprehensive exams must be taken by the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of each semester.

Conscientious preparation is highly recommended. You must complete the **Petition for Credit by Examination** in this class schedule (see Table of Contents), and attach it to the registration form with fee payment. Texts are listed on Book Order Form. You may drop if you fail. LAST DATE TO ADD/DROP REGULAR CAMPUS COURSES FOR CREDIT IS SEPTEMBER 14, 2000.

#### **Credit/No Credit Policy**

An Undergraduate student may elect to be graded CR/NC in particular courses, subject to the following conditions:

#### **Course Limitations**

- 1. Courses used to satisfy a major (both upper and lower division), or which are prerequisite to it, must be taken for a letter grade except when such courses are graded solely on a CR/NC basis. A student may enroll in up to 50% of the units required by a minor on a credit/no credit basis, unless otherwise specified elsewhere in the catalog under specific requirements for a minor.
- 2. No more than 24 units graded CR/NC whether taken at this or another institution, may be offered in satisfaction of the total units required for a bachelor's degree. If 24 units graded CR/NC are accepted in transfer, no additional courses graded CR/NC may be used to satisfy degree requirements, except when a required course is graded solely on a CR/NC basis. (All credits earned in the CLEP testing program may count even if they make cumulative total of all CR/NC units at that time over 24.)

**Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement Exam (GWAR):** To meet the CSU Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement, you may take the approved writing test (GWE) through CSUDH and also through most CSU campus testing centers, or you may take coursework specified by the offering CSU campuses as meeting the graduation writing requirement. Undergraduate students should complete this requirement by their 2<sup>nd</sup> semester in the program. Graduate students must achieve a passing score of 8 or better on the GWE during or prior to the first semester of enrollment.

CSUDH Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement examination consists of an essay exam with one hour allowed for completion. The test is graded by CSUDH faculty and you will receive notice of your results.

Early registration is advised. Registration must be received four weeks prior to test date. A \$25.00 fee is required. Fee can be paid by check or money order payable to California State University Dominguez Hills (CSUDH). A confirmation and test preparation materials will be sent to you. Bring 25 cents cash for purchasing bluebook. Also bring a #2 pencil and two pens.

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
