

OVERVIEW OF DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Statewide Nursing Program (SNP) began in Spring of 1981 with two major commitments: to make quality higher education in nursing more accessible to employed registered nurses and to ultimately improve health care in California.

Movement toward these goals is occurring through our BSN and MSN programs. Both of these programs were funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and by contributions from individuals and health care organizations.

The curricula are responsive to the needs of adult learners whose time, lifestyles, or work schedules make it impossible to complete a traditional course of study in residence at a campus. The program provides nursing professionals with varying interests and backgrounds with unique advantages such as:

- Classes designed to meet the needs of the adult learner.
- Opportunities to meet students with similar goals.
- Opportunities to study with CSU and other highly qualified adjunct faculty.
- · Courses offered at geographically convenient locations.
- · Credit and course work transferable statewide.

ORIENTATION SESSIONS

All prospective students are expected to attend an orientation session prior to enrolling. The faculty is strongly committed to the position that registered nurses should have access to complete SNP program information as well as information about other traditional and non-traditional routes to bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing, so that an *informed* decision can be made regarding further professional education. The most effective means of sharing this information is through a group orientation. Please plan to attend one of the sessions as listed in this schedule or contact the Regional Program Director in your area for further assistance.

PROGRAM FEATURES

Modules

All courses are divided into 1 and 2 unit "mini courses" called modules. A one unit module has 2-3 seminar meetings with assignments due before and after each seminar, and takes 6-8 weeks to complete. Many students take two courses concurrently. Students must pre-register for each unit and obtain required course materials in order to prepare for the first class seminar. See details under the BSN and MSN sections of this schedule for materials needed and the course registration procedure. The BSN section also outlines an assessment option whereby credit for selected undergraduate courses may be earned by passing standardized examinations.

Learning Resources

In addition to the 19 libraries of the California State University system and the general and specialized libraries of the University of California system, students also utilize SNP Learning Resource Centers. These centers are a joint endeavor of the SNP and a collaborating health care or educational institution. The centers house audio-visual hardware, audiotapes, videotapes, and computer programs which complement SNP coursework.

Individual Counseling

A mentor (nurse-counselor) is assigned to each degree student upon admission and payment of the Program Fee. The mentor provides individualized student advisement throughout matriculation. Preceptorships

Students are able to participate in performance courses (clinical laboratory/field experience) with the assistance of a preceptor as well as an instructor.

· Self-Directed Learning Materials

Workbooks as well as videotapes, audiotapes, and/or computer programs are an integral part of every SNP course. Audiovisual materials are available for use at Learning Resource Centers. Required workbooks are available from Statewide Technical Books. (See SNP Book Order form included with this publication.) Proof of purchase cards, included with each workbook, will be collected by the instructor at the first class meeting. Course registration is not complete until this requirement is met.

CONTINUING EDUCATION (C.E.) CREDIT

All BSN and MSN courses as well as Life Cycle, Culture And Health, Biochemistry, Pathophysiology and Statistics are approved for C.E. credit by the Board of Registered Nursing at the rate of 15 contact hours per unit of theory. (BRN Provider Number 03594). "Although the Board of Registered Nursing does not approve individual continuing education courses, providers are required by law to be approved by the Board. Complaints regarding continuing education providers or continuing education courses should be addressed to the Board. Your transcript is your certificate of completion.





PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the BSN program, the graduate will be able to:

• Provide professional nursing care to clients, families and communities across various cultures and throughout the life cycle through application of critical thinking skills within the framework of the nursing process.

• Develop collaborative professional relationships as a member or leader of a health care team, working dependently, interdependently, or independently according to the needs of the client and with consideration for the legal, ethical, and moral constraints that influence nursing practice.

• Synthesize knowledge from the physical and behavioral sciences, humanities, and nursing sciences to form a basis for professional practice and contribute to the expansion of nursing knowledge through critical analysis of nursing literature and the application of beginning research skills.

Graduates are eligible for certification by the State of California as Public Health Nurses (PHN).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Minimum of 56 semester units of transferable college credit with a grade point average of at least 2.0 (C).
- 2. Current RN licensure in the United States or an RN interim permit.

(Demonstrated clinical competence, validated through work history or by a clinical examination, RN licensure, and personal professional liability insurance are required prior to enrolling in a nursing performance course.)

Diploma Nurse Applicants. Diploma R.N.s who have not met the 56 unit entrance requirement may be considered for admission through the Undergraduate Preparatory Program. See Table of Contents reference for details.


Program Structure

The baccalaureate program comprises classes and/or examinations that include content essential for a professional nursing practice. Three options are open to the student:

- A series of classes. Classes are offered in one- and twounit modules. The student will take course work and be graded after each course module.
- A series of written and performance assessments which may be taken in lieu of selected courses. The student receives a study packet and takes the examination.
- 3. A combination of classes and assessments.

HOW TO BEGIN

- 1. Attend group orientation/review program materials.
- 2. Submit Admission Application and fee (see application in this schedule).
- 3. Request transcripts as indicated in the Admission Application have transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.
- Pre-register by phone with Regional Program Director for BSN 310 "Expanding Professional Nursing Horizons" Module One (310.1). (It is not necessary to have formal admission completed).
- 5. Obtain SNP workbook and texts for BSN 310 (see BSN book order form in this schedule).
- 6. Review workbook; complete pre-assignment before first class.
- Attend first class meeting, register and pay course fee at this time.
- While the Admission and Records Office performs an evaluation of your prior college work you may continue to take classes during the term.
- When you are notified of formal admission, submit Program Fee, and meet with mentor to develop a Program of Study for degree completion.


BSN COURSE REGISTRATION

- 1. Theory Courses Register two (2) weeks prior to the first class meeting.
 - By Phone Contact your Regional Program Director and pay the course fee at the first class meeting.
 - By Mail -Send the completed Registration form and fee to the Regional Program Director.

2. Performance courses - Register three (3) weeks prior to the first class meeting. Note: additional time is needed to establish preceptorships at affiliating agencies. If you plan to nominate your own preceptor, indicate this at the top of the Registration form.

By Mail — Send the completed Registration form and fee to the Regional Program Director.

When planning your schedule, be aware that performance labs for BSN 410 and BSN 420 are usually scheduled during the summer trimester to accommodate the affiliating agencies.



*Sequenced courses and modules must be taken in numerical order.

Courses and modules must be successfully completed (grade of C or better) in the order indicated by the curricular progression flowchart. Certain modules within a course may be sequenced. Any deviation from meeting the course prerequisites or sequence is subject to prior written approval by the Regional Program Director.

- 3. Each student must have a personal copy of the required workbook for the course/module. Registration is not complete until you have submitted the Proof of Purchase card from your workbook. Proof of purchase cards included with each workbook will be collected by the instructor at the first class meeting. Students are not fully registered for the course and final grade will not be issued until this requirement is met.
- Every effort will be made to notify all students who have pre-registered if it has been necessary to change the time or date of the class, if a second section is opened or if a class is cancelled.

ASSESSMENT OPTION

The Statewide Nursing Program recognizes that many students have knowledge and skill learned by means other than a transferable college credit course. Students may earn academic credit by demonstrating their knowledge through successfully passing specified written or performance examinations. Direct your questions to the appropriate person listed for each option.

If you are testing out of a course which is prerequisite to another course, you must have your successful test results reported to the Admissions and Records Office before you enroll in the subsequent course.

• WRITTEN EXAMINATIONS - NURSING

You may earn academic credit for the following **theory course modules** by successfully passing written examinations offered by the **American College Testing Service (ACT)** through its Proficiency Examination Program (PEP).

The passing score for ACT tests is presently 45. A score of 45 or greater results in a grade of credit (CR) on your transcript. A test may be repeated twice without academic penalty. Each test costs \$50. You must request the study guides and registration materials (free) directly from ACT. If you have questions regarding ACT/PEP Nursing tests, please contact your mentor.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Statewide Nursing Program offers a certificate program in public health nursing. Current regulations for public health nurse certification require that the nurse be a graduate of a NLN accredited BSN program. Recognizing the fact that other groups of nurses should be eligible, the Statewide Nursing Program and the State of California, Department of Health Services, have jointly developed the program described herein. This certificate program is administered by Ms. Kathleen Johnston, Associate Director, Undergraduate Program.

To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must: (1) hold a current R.N. license from the California Board of Registered Nursing and (2) hold a bachelor's degree under one of the following conditions:

- a. BSN graduate from a non-NLN accredited program offered by an accredited U.S. institution.
- b. Baccalaureate graduate wtih a degree from an accredited institution.
- c. Graduate of a BSN program from an accredited foreign institution. Foreign transcripts will be sent directly to International Evaluation Services. The program will then perform transfer unit evaluation and the general education analysis. More information will be sent regarding this process upon receipt of the application.

Persons interested in applying to this certificate program must complete the following steps to initiate entry into the program: (1) Submit a completed Admission Application with fee and check the box labeled CERTIFICATE under Program Objective; (2) Attach a photocopy of your current California R.N. license; (3) Arrange for your previous college(s) to send your transcripts directly to the Admissions and Records Office. (Ask for a second set to be sent to your home if you do not already have your own copy.) Applicants must attend the certificate workshop, which is held at various centralized sites. Each student applying for the certificate program is required to attend one morning workshop of counseling/advisement. Previous and related nursing course work will be assessed for possible substitution. Each student will receive guidance on optional completion of a BSN or MSN through the Statewide Nursing Program if a degree objective is desired. An **afternoon, same-day workshop is required for those RNs selecting the PHN certificate-only option.** The cost of each workshop is \$45. Enrollment in the first required course is permitted when eligibility has been determined and the workshop requirement has been met.

Courses required for the certificate program may be met by SNP coursework or by substitution with transferable courses from other collegiate programs. The required courses are:

Self-Directed General Education/Elective Courses

California State University Dominguez Hills has arranged to provide the following classes for Statewide Nursing Program students. The classes are offered through correspondence. In addition, courses #423, #440, #446, and #474 also meet G.E. Area D: Behavioral Sciences and can be used to satisfy upper division general education requirements for Humanities. They may also be used for elective credits. If you wish to register for any of these classes, use the registration form printed below and mail your registration and fees **BEFORE MAY 1, 1988.** When mailing coursework to your instructor, use instructor's name and mail to CSU Dominguez Hills address. HUX 420 Humanities Encounter: Art (2,3). Visitation to three local museums to examine their architecture and collections. Open to non-local students by special arrangement.

HUX 423 Humanities Encounter: History (2,3). Exploring the historical roots of one's own community. Open to non-local students by special arrangement.

HUX 424 Humanities Encounter: Film (2,3). Watching and analyzing several movies with special focus on the techniques and content of the medium.

HUX 441 The Rational Perspective (3). The meaning of rationality from the perspectives of philosophy, history, literature, music, and art. Special emphasis on the possible differences between scientific and humanistic rationality.

INTRODUCTION

THE PROGRAM

The graduate program prepares professional nurses for advanced and specialized practice. The curriculum is organized around the role of the nurse in societal institutions with emphasis on the application of nursing theory through excellence in professional practice and the advancement of the profession through research, leadership, and scholarship for the ultimate benefit of the health care needs of society. The curricular planning reflects the accreditation criteria for graduate education established by the National League for Nursing.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- Upon completion of the program graduates will be able to: 1. Analyze nursing phenomena (human responses to actual or potential health problems) utilizing the research process and initiate and evaluate therapeutic action in advanced practice;
- Contribute to the advancement of nursing education, practice, and research through analysis, synthesis, application, and expansion of nursing models and theories; and
- 3. Demonstrate professional performance in advanced practice, in leadership roles and as participants in sociotechnical based health care delivery systems to benefit clients and the society at large.

ROLE EMPHASIS OPTIONS

The curriculum offers the student a choice of role emphasis option of nurse educator, nurse administrator or clinical specialist in parent-child nursing or gerontology nursing. Through a personalized Program of Study the curriculum is individualized and reflective of the student's learning needs and professional goals.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please refer to the section on Admission. In addition, please note the following special requirements for admission to the MSN program:

- 1. Completion of a baccalaureate degree program from a regionally accredited institution with an upper division major in nursing (BSN) and NLN accredited nursing program or the equivalent as determined by the Graduate Student Affairs Committee.
- Overall grade point average of 2.5 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, 2 or demonstrated academic ability as required by the faculty, following the appeal process. (Registered nurse applicants who have already earned a bachelor's or master's degree in a major other than nursing should contact Dr. Davis for preadmission advisement.)
- 3. Current licensure in the United States.

As indicated in the Admission Application, have transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.

NURSES WITH NON-NURSING BACHELOR'S DEGREES Registered nurses who have earned a bachelor's degree in another field may be eligible for a pilot program BA/BS to MSN degree. See following pages for additional information.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

All students complete 19 units of core courses and then begin role emphasis courses.

Students may select role preparation as:

- Nurse educator .
- Nurse administrator .
- Parent-child clinical specialist Gerontology clinical specialist

Subspecializations in areas such as quality assurance, staff development, and client education are possible.

Nurse educators and nurse administrators complete 12 units of role theory and performance courses and 2 units of electives. Clinical specialists complete 14 units of role theory and performance. All students conclude their 36 units of master's preparation with a culminating graduate project.

FEDERAL TRAINEESHIPS

A Professional Nurse Traineeship grant has been awarded to the SNP by the Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service Act. The grant monies are designated toward tuition support for students who are pursuing graduate study in nursing on a full-time basis.

ELIGIBILITY

- Student is not currently receiving any other Federal educational award which provides a stipend or otherwise duplicates financial provisions. Veteran's Administration Benefits (G.I. Bill) are excepted. Loans from Federal banks are not considered Federal awards.
- Student is able to enroll in at least eight (8) graduate units during the Fall and Spring term.

If you are interested and eligible, please contact the graduate secretary, Nanci Kingsbury at (213) 516-4050 for application forms. All students, new and continuing will be considered.

HOW TO BEGIN

- Attend group orientation/review program materials.
- Submit Admission Application and fee (see application in this schedule).
- Request transcripts. (As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you if you do not already possess a copy.)
- Register for Introductory Graduate Workshop (See registration form in this schedule).
- 5. Attend workshop.
- Preregister with graduate secretary and pay fee for the 6. first required course (as advised at workshop).
- While the Admissions and Records Office performs an evaluation of your prior college work, you may continue to take classes during the term.
- When you are notified of formal admission, submit Program Fee and meet with your mentor to develop a Program of Study for degree completion.

MSN COURSE REGISTRATION

The Admissions and Records Office must be in receipt of a completed registration form and course fee payment at least 2 weeks prior to the first class meeting of any graduate nursing course. Registration for the first graduate course occurs during the Introductory Graduate Workshop. Registration for subsequent classes is completed by mail.

CURRICULUM

The program requires 36 semester units of approved graduate study. The curriculum consists of core courses, role emphasis, role performance courses, and a directed project. Elective units round out the graduate program requirements. Up to 15 approved units may be accepted for transfer credit.



MSN PATHWAY FOR RNs WITH NON-NURSING BACCALAUREATE: BA/BS to MSN

The Statewide Nursing Program is conducting a pilot program to facilitate a master's degree in nursing program for those nurses who presently hold a bachelor's degree in another discipline.

Graduate study in nursing builds on a foundation of undergraduate professional nursing knowledge. Following an analysis of your previous coursework, the Graduate Student Affairs Committee will recommend a Program of Study which includes undergraduate nursing and related coursework or assessments to prepare you for MSN coursework. If you meet the usual University requirements for graduate study and concur with the recommended Program of Study, you will be admitted to the graduate program on a conditional basis. Once the undergraduate course requirements are successfully met, the conditional status is removed and you may proceed with completing the graduate curriculum. See MSN degree section for more details on graduate curriculum enrollment and completion requirements.

HOW TO BEGIN

QUALITY ASSURANCE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Statewide Nursing Program offers a certificate program in quality assurance for BSN prepared nurses who want to develop graduate level knowledge and skill in implementing an institutional quality assurance program. Included in this course of study is utilization review, assessment and measurement of the level of care provided to clients and the utilization of resources. This certificate program is administered by Dr. Kay Davis, Associate Director, Graduate Program.

To be eligible for this certificate program, applicants must: (1) hold a current R.N. license (2) hold a BSN degree from an accredited US institution, (Graduates of foreign institutions will need to have their transcripts evaluated by an international evaluation service. More information will be sent regarding this process upon receipt of the application.); and (3) have an overall grade point average of 2.5 (on a four-point scale) or higher in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted, or demonstrated academic ability as required by the Nursing faculty, following the appeal process.

As indicated in the Admission Application, have official transcripts sent directly to the Admissions and Records Office. Also request a copy be sent directly to you.

Persons interested in applying to this certificate program must complete the following steps to initiate entry into the program: (1) Submit a complete Admissions Application and check the box labeled CERTIFICATE under Program Objective; (2) Attach a photocopy of your current California R.N. license; and (3) Arrange for your previous college(s) to send your transcripts directly to the Admissions and Records Office. (Ask for a second set to be sent to your home if you do not already have your own copy.)

Applicants must attend an Introductory Graduate Workshop prior to enrolling in the first required course. Certain courses for the QA Certificate require the successful completion of prerequisites not offered as part of the program. These are:

- upper division statistics course (inferential and descriptive) or equivalent
- introductory research course or equivalent

Courses required within the certificate program may be met by SNP coursework or by substitution approved by program director with timely graduate level transferrable courses from other collegiate programs. Please note: if you eventually want to earn a MSN degree, any courses taken to meet certificate requirements may apply to the degree but may not be more than 7 years old at the time of degree completion.

The certificate program should be completed in 15 months or less, depending on your personal preference and availability of courses. Courses and modules must be completed in the approved sequence with a grade of C or better and an overall B average for the program.

A certificate completion check will need to be completed by the Admissions and Records Office one term prior to the term you plan to complete the QA certificate program. The certificate application fee is \$35.00. The application form may be requested from Admissions and Records.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

To apply for admission:

- Complete the Admission Application found in this schedule.
- Send it to the Admissions and Records Office with a . \$45.00 check or money order (this fee is nonrefundable).
- Contact the college(s) and/or university(s) you have attended in the past and have official transcripts sent to the Admissions and Records Office. (For transcripts to be considered official, they must be received directly from the institution in an embossed sealed envelope.)

It is also recommended that you have a second set of transcripts sent to you for your personal portfolio for use by yourself and your advisor in developing a program of study.

Application Filing

Admission Applications must be submitted prior to or upon registration for the first class (see Active Student Status). Having submitted the Application, students can register for classes during the term for which they have applied while waiting for notice of formal admission. However, students may not continue to register for classes in subsequent terms until their admission status has been validated.

Admission Validation

In order to validate your admission status, all application materials must be in the Admissions and Records Office one month prior to the end of the term for which you are applying. UNDERGRADUATE PREPARATORY PROGRAM

The UPs Program: Something Special for Diploma School Graduates

Since the Statewide Nursing Program's BSN curriculum is at the upper division level, junior standing is required for admission to the major. The Undergraduate Preparatory Program is a pathway for students who have earned less than the required 56 college units.

Those applicants who lack 56 transferable units but meet the definition of adult students as defined in Title 5 of the

Administrative Code are eligible for admission to the Undergraduate Preparatory Program. This program permits students to take-in combination-general education courses and/or prerequisites for the major with a community college, a CSU campus or other higher educational institution. Students may also enroll for Statewide Nursing Program prerequisite and introductory courses and assessment options, with the exception of courses/tests offered at the upper divison level in the major. Upon completion of 56 units, the student will be admitted to the major, assuming other requirements for admission are met.

The UPs Program advisor, Dr. Laura Inouye is available to assist you with this option. Please leave a message for Dr. Inouye at (213) 516-4005 or 1-800-352-7517 and your call will be returned.

FOREIGN STUDENT ADMISSION

The initial evaluation of foreign transcripts must be handled by an international evaluation agency.

If you have already applied for admission and have sent in your transcripts, we can make arrangements to forward your foreign transcripts to the recommended agency.

This service will provide:

- Evaluation of High School level, Post Secondary through Graduate level, employment and skill recertification.
- Reconstruction of education studies.
- 3. Certified translation of documents.
- Career development and counseling. 4
- 5. Authenticity verification.

There is a fee of \$50-\$125 depending on the complexity of the evaluation. The evaluation fee covers subject breakdown, equivalence statements, detailed analysis and a narrative evaluation if needed. This includes one original evaluation sent to the designated agency or institution and one copy to the applicant.

The Admissions and Records Office will evaluate the transfer units allowed as well as the general education breadth requirements from the original analysis of the international evaluation service. Please refer to:

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Applicants are required to include their Social Security account number in designated places on applications for admission and registration form pursuant to the authority contained in Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 41201. The Social Security account number is used as a means of identifying records pertaining to the student as well as identifying the student for purposes of financial aid eligibility and disbursement and the repayment of financial aid and other debts payable to the institution.

New and re-entering students must submit Admission Application and fee prior to or upon registration for the first class!

GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION (G.E.) REQUIREMENTS

Each candidate for a baccalaureate must complete general education coursework as prescribed by the Board of Trustees in Title 5 of the Administrative Code, Sections 40405 through 40405.4. The program consists of 48 semester units of courses approved for this purpose, including nine semester units taken during the junior and senior years and approved as upper division G.E. courses. At least nine of the required 48 units must be completed in residence.

Since the Statewide Nursing Program offers primarily upper division and graduate courses, most general education work will be completed prior to enrollment in the program or by referral to another institution after matriculation. A student may satisfy the General Education requirements in any one or a combination of the following ways.

Prior to matriculation:

- Completion of courses or examinations that are approved as meeting particular requirements by CSU campuses, California community colleges, or other participating campuses.
- Completion of courses at other institutions determined to meet particular requirements.

After matriculation:

- Completion of approved courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university. (Students should consult with their advisor for information on the course substitution process prior to enrolling in any course which is intended to satisfy a General Education requirement.)
- Completion of designated courses or examinations approved for General Education purposes.

REQUIRED PATTERN OF COURSES

- A. Communication in English (9 semester units)
- 1. Oral communication-an introductory course in speech.
- 2. Written communication-a standard course in Freshman composition.
- 3. Critical thinking—a course in logic, argumentation, or critical thinking.
- B. Science and Mathematics (12 semester units)
- A general introductory course in astronomy, chemistry, geology, physical science, or physics.
- 2. A general introductory course in biology, botany, or zoology.

At least one course in either category 1 or 2 above must include a laboratory; however, it is recommended that two laboratory courses be taken.

- A mathematics, statistics, or computer science course with a prerequisite of at least two years of college preparatory mathematics.
- C. Humanities (12 semester units)

Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: art, drama, language, literature, music, and philosophy. No more than six semester units may be activity or performance courses.

D. Social and Behavioral Sciences (12 semester units) Choose courses from two or more of the following areas: anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology. Certain courses which meet these requirements may also be applied to the requirements described in section **F** below. At least one course either in area C or in area D above must involve study of the non-Western world. A course dealing with ethnic or other minorities in America is highly recommended. In choosing courses from areas C and D, avoid highly specialized courses. Try to choose courses which seek to integrate two or more areas.

E. Lifelong Understanding (3 semester units)

F. Requirements in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution, and Principles of California Sate and Local Government. Title 5, California Administrative Code, Section 40404, requires that each student demonstrate competency in these areas to qualify for graduation. Students who have not met these requirements at the time of admission may do so by completing appropriate courses or by passing comprehensive examinations prepared and administered by most CSU campuses. Courses used to meet this requirement may also be applied to the requirements in section D.

Students commencing undergraduate study in September, 1981 or thereafter are responsible for meeting these requirements. Students enrolling for an additional bachelor's degree must meet any difference between these and any previous requirements that may have been completed.

The Program Director, upon the recommendation of a Regional Program Director, may authorize substitutions or exceptions to the foregoing in individual cases where failure to do so would result in unreasonable hardship.

GENERAL EDUCATION/ ELECTIVE OPPORTUNITIES

California State University Dominguez Hills faculty and the Statewide Nursing Program have made General Education courses satisfying Area A, C, and D requirements available to you. ACADEMIC POLICIES/PROCEDURES

GRADUATE WRITING ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENT (GWAR)

All degree candidates are **required** to pass a **written examination** to comply with the California State University Graduate Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR).

 Evidence of successful completion of this requirement should be submitted to the Admissions and Records Office as follows:

Undergraduate ---

prior to the completion of 90 units towards a degree. Graduate --

during the term student is accepted as a degree candidate (admitted as a classified student).

- Students who do not achieve a passing score should seek counseling from their mentor prior to reapplying for the examination.
- 3. Any student who has met the Graduate Writing Assessment Requirement at a CSU institution will be cleared with proof of having met the Program requirement.

Please Note: At some CSU institutions a specific course has been designated as meeting the GWAR. This course may be in lieu of, or an alternative to a written examination. The course grade report must be forwarded to the SNP Admissions and Records Office.

 Students who do not have a recorded successful completion of the GWAR will be denied graduation.

RESIDENCE CREDIT REQUIREMENT

Undergraduate

Students must earn the equivalent of 30 semester units of credit through SNP to meet residence requirements for a bachelor's degree. At least 12 semester units must be in the major and 24 semester units must be in upper division level courses.

Graduate

Twenty-one semester units of work must be completed in residence through the SNP.

Definition of courses that meet the residence credit requirement.

- Any regularly scheduled CSUDH course taken after admission.
- Any successfully completed assessment which is approved to meet a major course requirement that was taken after admission.
- Any course taken for academic credit at one of the CSU campuses after admission, which had prior written approval by the Regional Program Director.

ACTIVE STUDENT STATUS POLICY

The following policy defines Active Student Status:

To allow our students maximum flexibility in completing graduation requirements, SNP has instituted a policy change, effective January 1986, which states that no minimum enrollment in courses is required either per term or per year. Instead, active status will be maintained by filing an Active Student Status form each year with the Office of Admissions and Records. By returning the Active Student Status form, you are indicating your intent during the following year to enroll in one or more courses, complete approved assessment examinations, and/or enroll in courses at other institutions in accordance with appropriate policy. Receipt of official transcripts will serve as verification of non-SNP educational activities.

Return of the form not only validates Active Student Status for the coming year, but also assists the Regional Program Director in scheduling classes as needed.

Active students are entitled to all student services including academic advising, academic file maintenance and transcript posting of all courses/assessment examinations taken during the year. Active students receive all informational materials distributed throughout the year, and a library card for use at CSU campus libraries.

Students who are unable to pursue their educational program for financial, medical or other valid reasons may, on the Active Student Status form, request to be continued as an active student for a maximum of one year.

Students who indicate on the Active Student Status form that they wish to become inactive or withdraw the program, or who do not return the card, will be required to formally reapply in order to matriculate in the following year(s) and may be required to meet new degree requirements in effect at that time.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

ACADEMIC STANDING

Undergraduate:

Satisfactory scholarship means at least a C (2.0) grade point average or twice as many grade points as units attempted. Graduating "with honor" is satisfied with a 3.75 grade point average.

Graduate:

Satisfactory scholarship means at least a B (3.0) grade point average or three times as many grade points as units attempted. The student is entitled to honorable dismissal unless otherwise indicated.

GRADING SYSTEM

Courses are based on the standard semester unit. The following grades and grade points are used in reporting student standing at the end of each term.

A - Superior	4 grade points
B - Good	3 grade points
C - Acceptable	2 grade points
D - Poor	1 grade point
F - Failure	0 grade points
I - Incomplete	O grade points; not computed in grade point average until letter grade is assigned. Coursework not completed within one calendar year following the end of the term during which it was assigned will be counted as a failing grade for GPA computation.
U - Unauthorized Incomplete	0 grade points; counted as a failing grade for GPA computation.
W - Withdrawal	0 grade points; posted to record only if the student officially withdraws.
AU - Audit	O grade points; student is not require to take exams and does not receive unit credit. Must be arranged with instructor at first class session.
RD - Report Delayed	0 grade points
SP - Satisfactory Progress	O grade points; student is maintainin satisfactory progress in a course which required more than one term to complete.
CR - Credit	0 grade points; credit is not compute in the grade point average, but units are allowed.
NC - No Credit	0 grade points; work has not been completed satisfactorily; NC is not computed in the academic grade point average; however, it can result

in progress deficiency.

Application for Incomplete ("I") Grade

An approval form, signed by the instructor, must be completed by the last scheduled day of class.

Removal of Incomplete ("I") Grade

When an incomplete grade or "I" has been removed, a later entry is made on the Permanent Record Card. The original listing of the course showing the "I" is marked with an asterisk in the grade column and the subsequent complete posting is marked with an asterisk. The date the "I" was removed is also listed. An "I" grade is normally removed within one calendar year; however, it is possible upon petition, for a student to receive an extension of that time limit. Therefore, the date listed for the final grade may be an amount of time greater than the one calendar year normally allowed for removal of the "I".

Repetition of Courses

Permission to repeat a module must be obtained from the Regional Program Director through the petition process.

Undergraduate students may repeat a module once if they have received a grade of "D", "F", or "NC". The previous units attempted and grade points received will be excluded from grade point computation. Credit is earned only once.

Graduate students may repeat a module once if they have received a grade of "D", "F", or "NC". The student's permanent record will indicate the course repeated and the grade earned. The grades earned in the original enrollment and the repeated enrollment will be averaged when computing the grade point average. Credit will be earned on the first attempt only.

If a student wishes to participate in graduation ceremonies at a local CSU campus, he/she should indicate so on the Application for Graduation.

GRADUATION-DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Students planning to graduate from a degree or certificate program may obtain an Application for Graduation from the Admissions and Records Office or from the Regional Program Director. The Application for Graduation signed by the mentor must be submitted along with the \$35.00 fee on or before the following dates:

Fall Term Graduation	by May 15
Spring Term Graduation	
Summer Term Graduation	by January 15

A final Program of Study must accompany the Application for Graduation signed by the mentor (BSN) or Associate Director, Graduate Program (MSN) (QA) or Associate Director Undergraduate Program (PHN) if not filed previously. Students will receive a "grad check" from the Admissions and Records Office which indicates any remaining academic work, outstanding fees or obligations which must be resolved before approval for graduation is granted.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Since decisions to offer or cancel classes are based on attendance at the first class session, preregistration is preferred in all program courses and required for certain courses.

Students may register for classes in one of three ways:

1. By Mail. Use this method to ensure your place in class. Registration must be mailed at least two weeks in advance of the first class session. All M.S., Nursing students must use this option. If you use this option:

NOTE: Students who have not applied for admission to SNP/CSUDH must submit an **Admission Application** with the registration form (an Admission Application is included in this Schedule of Classes).

FEE PAYMENT

Fees must be paid at the time of registration.

- Checks should be made payable to the "Trustees of the California State University."
- Fees can be paid via a VISA or MasterCard plan.
- For your protection, do not send cash.

If a student is on a fee-payment plan in which the sponsoring agency or company prefers to pay The CSU fees directly, the student must secure a purchase order from the sponsoring agency or company. In addition to other fees, a program fee is required of all nursing students. Upon admission, a non-refundable, onetime program fee of \$250.00 is required. For those students who are unable to pay this fee within one month of the date of admission a \$40.00 penalty fee will be assessed. At that time \$290.00 (\$250 program fee + \$40 penalty fee) is due and payable in full. It is possible to pay in a 3 month installment payment plan which includes the \$40.00 penalty fee. The Program Planning Form will be sent to the student upon notification of acceptance to the program. A student may pay the Program Planning Fee prior to admission by requesting the necessary form from the Regional Program Director.

ADDING A CLASS/LATE REGISTRATION

Students who wish to add a class(es) after the first session should complete an Add/Drop Form (included in this Schedule) following consultation with the Instructor and/or Regional Program Director.

Requests must be submitted within the first two weeks of class upon approval of the instructor and advisor. The form should be sent to the Admissions and Records Office with appropriate course fees and a \$35.00 late registration fee.

Note: If you cannot attend the first class session of your course, contact your Regional Program Director in advance.

DROPPING A CLASS/ WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS

Students who wish to drop a class(es) after the first session should complete an Add/Drop Form. In order to officially withdraw and obtain a "W' grade, approval of both instructor and Regional Program Director is required, otherwise the student may receive an "F", "U", or "NC" grade.

Students who are unable to complete course requirements due to unforeseen, but fully justified, reasons may petition to the instructor for additional time to make up incomplete work. If approved, the instructor will prepare an Incomplete ("I") Grade Agreement Form which must be signed by both the instructor and the student.

A full refund will be given to pre-registered students if the withdrawal request is received before the first day of class. The request must be made in writing on the Add/Drop Form.

A 65% refund will be given if the request (with the signatures of the instructor and Regional Program Director) is received before 25% of the class session time has expired.

NO refund can be given once a one-unit module/course has begun.

NOTE: Once approvals have been obtained, all requests should be sent to the Admissions and Records Office.

STUDENT SERVICES

FINANCIAL AID

GUARANTEED STUDENT LOAN (GSL)

The Guaranteed Student Loan Program provides an opportunity for eligible students to obtain educational loans through participating banks, credit unions or other lending institutions. The federal government will pay the interest on the cumulative amount borrowed as long as the student is enrolled at least half-time at an eligible school.

According to federal regulations, the student may apply for the Guaranteed Student Loan providing the student:

- is enrolled in and in good standing or has been accepted for enrollment at an eligible school;
- is enrolled minimally, as a half-time student (6 units or more) with the program;
- 3. is a citizen of the United States or is in the United States for other than a temporary purpose.

This program provides long-term, low-interest (seven to nine percent) loans available through participating lending agencies. Upper division undergraduate students may borrow up to \$4,000 per year, and graduate students may borrow up to \$7,500 per year.

California Loans to Assist Students (CLAS): Students who are ineligible for a GSL or who wish to supplement their GSL may apply for a CLAS loan. CLAS loans enable borrowers to obtain up to \$4,000 per year (\$20,000 aggregate) to help pay for education. CLAS loans are guaranteed by the participating lenders. This guarantee, backed by federal reinsurance, allows the loans to be made without security or collateral.

Unlike the Guaranteed Student Loan (GSL), a CLAS loan goes into repayment 60 days after the loan is made. However, the favorable interest rate (varies from 9 to 12%, depending on the annual average rate of 91-day Treasury Bills) makes CLAS an attractive alternative for parents and students faced with financing postsecondary education. CLAS loans can be used in addition to Guaranteed Student Loans.

Parent and less than full-time student borrowers must begin repayment of principal and interest 60 days after the loan is made.

Full-time student borrowers may defer (postpone) principal and interest repayment until their enrollment status changes.

Application Procedures:

Step One-File a Student Aid Application for California (SAAC). All SAAC forms and appropriate fee, must be mailed to: College Scholarship Service, Box 70, Berkeley, CA 94701-0070. This may take up to four weeks so plan accordingly. The GSL or CLAS application cannot be certified until the SAAC is received.

All undergraduate students are required to apply for a Pell Grant. This may be accomplished by answering yes to SAAC question number 43. The Pell Grant determination is called the Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR will be mailed directly to your home and then submitted to the Financial Aid Office. In addition, you may be required to provide a copy of your/your parents tax return(s) and Financial Aid Transcripts from any schools previously attended.

Step Two-Complete the GSL or CLAS loan application and questionnaire. To obtain these forms write or call:

Since processing the GSL/CLAS application normally takes 1 to 2 weeks after we have received all the above forms (total of 6-8 weeks), it is recommended you apply early for a given term. All fees are expected to be paid at the time due, regardless of your loan application status.

PELL GRANT

The Pell Grant is awarded to help undergraduates pay for their education after high school. The Pell Grant Program is the largest Federal student aid program and, unlike loans, grants do not have to be paid back.

How to Qualify:

The Department of Education uses a standard formula, revised and approved every year by Congress, to evaluate the information reported when a student applies for a Pell Grant. The formula produces a Student Aid Index number to determine eligibility.

The use of the formula guarantees equal treatment for all applicants, but it also means that, except for a few specific cases, there are no exceptions made for unique financial circumstances of students or their families.

Amount of Award:

Awards range up to \$2,100. How much a student actually receives will depend on their Student Aid Index number, whether they are a full-time or part-time student, how long they will be enrolled in the current academic year, and the **cost of education** at the school.

Usually, Pell Grant eligibility is calculated using prior year of a income information. In certain cases, however, students can file a Special Condition Application. This application allows the student to estimate current income information, and eligibility will be calculated using that estimate instead of prior year income information.

How to Apply:

The final deadline for current year applications is April 1, 1988. It is preferable, however, to submit the Student Aid Report, which determines the Student Aid Index number as soon as possible. Interested students should contact the Admissions and Records Office for detailed information and required forms.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF STUDENTS RECEIVING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

- 1. All Financial Aid recipients agree to carry and complete the number of units specified each term **showing at least half-time status**, report graduation or withdrawal, and notify the Financial Aid Office of any changes in their financial status, marital status, or unit load.
- Students must use the funds only to meet education costs. Any other use of the funds is prohibited by law.
- Satisfactory academic progress must be maintained. A student is considered to be in good standing and maintaining satisfactory progress when enrolled in and successfully completing at least a half-time credit hour load.

GENERAL EDUCATION/ ELECTIVE OPPORTUNITIES

California State University Dominguez Hills faculty and the Statewide Nursing Program have made General Education courses satisfying Area A, C, and D requirements available to you. These may be taken on-campus, at a LA area hospital or by self-study at home throughout the State. See "New Opportunities for Earning General Education and Elective Credit" in the Table of Contents. The one academic unit BSN 498 courses, Child Abuse and Health Assessment, may be taken for elective credit.

Veterans Certification

New students who are veterans should be approved by the Veterans Administration to receive benefits and should obtain form 1995 (Change of Institution Form) or form 1990 (Veteran's Application for VA Benefits Form) from the SNP Admissions and Records Office, the VA, the Campus Veterans Office, VA Hospital, or other appropriate agency. The form should be completed by the student and sent to the SNP Admissions and Records Office. The A&R Office will submit the form to the appropriate office along with form 1999 (Certification of Enrollment Form). The student must notify the Admissions and Records Office at once upon withdrawal from a course or upon adding a course.

Concurrent Enrollment: If a student attends another school at the same time, a VA form must be sent from the other school to the Admissions and Records Office verifying enrollment.

Prior to each term, new and continuing students should contact the Admissions and Records Office indicating the courses to be taken that term. In addition, students applying for VA benefits for both the Fall and Spring terms should estimate the number of units to be taken in Spring. Summer benefits must be applied for separately. Any other questions regarding VA benefits should be directed to the Admissions and Records Office.

LIBRARY SERVICES/CARDS

Library cards are available from the Statewide Nursing Program Admissions and Records Office and are mailed to the student approximately 2 weeks after receipt of the student's Admission Application. Each card is valid for one academic year and permits the student full library privileges at any of the nineteen California State University campuses. The student must return the library card at once upon complete withdrawal from the program. Library cards are renewed prior to the beginning of the Fall term for students who maintain active enrollment status (See Active Student Status Policy Section). Please contact the Admissions and Records Office if you do not receive your library card.

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

Academic advisement is an essential component of student services. A personal relationship between students and their assigned mentor/advisor begins upon admission to their degree program. The mentor/advisor will assist the student in completing a Program of Study following a discussion of her/his educational goals and previous experience. This initial planning meeting will form the basis for an ongoing counseling relationship through graduation. The guiding principle for the interaction between the student and mentor/advisor is the creation of a plan for degree completion that is compatible with the student's available time, fiscal, and academic resources. Students who are unaware of the identity of their assigned mentor/advisor are encouraged to contact their Regional Program Director as soon as possible.

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
