
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

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

## **ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY**

C SU Dominguez Hills is a quality university in a cosmopolitan setting. The University is on a park-like, attractive campus of 346 acres. The University celebrated its 25th anniversary in the fall of 1985.

With an on-campus enrollment of over 8,500 students, CSU Dominguez Hills provides a friendly atmosphere with generally small classes and individual attention from faculty. An additional 3,000 students take part in the Statewide Nursing Program.

CSU Dominguez Hills faculty has one of the highest percentages of doctoral degrees in the CSU system-more than 90 percent. These faculty place an emphasis on teaching while also engaging in research and scholarly activity, and provide an environment of caring about the needs of individual students. The University is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and by professional associations in several academic specialties.

With moderate size, modest costs and a beautifully landscaped campus with modern and attractive buildings, CSU Dominguez Hills represents an attractive alternative to much larger and more expensive universities. CSU Dominguez Hills provides many of the nearby advantages of a large metropolitan area, while at the same time offering a pleasant and easy-to-get-to location.

## ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

**P**rospective students, part-time or full-time, or returning students, who have been out of school for two or more semesters, must file an application for admission, pay the \$45 application fee (or qualify for a fee waiver), and provide supporting documentation within the announced filing period. To enroll in classes, applicants must be formally admitted to CSU Dominguez Hills for that semester. Procedures are explained in the University Catalog, and admissions advising is available at the Information and Service Center. Applications may be obtained from that center.

Eligibility varies depending on the applicant's previous academic background. There are four applicant groups:

I. FIRST-TIME FRESHMAN - A California high school graduate and legal resident of the state must present a high school grade point average (GPA) from the last three years of high school (excluding physical education and military science) and a test score from either the American College Test (ACT) or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). The combined GPA and test score must place the applicant in the upper onethird of the statewide California high school graduating class. In addition, students must have satisfactorily completed ("C" grade or better) a comprehensive pattern of college preparatory course work (See the Catalog for a comprehensive eligibility table and details regarding the subject requirements).

Students who are not legal residents of California and are graduating from high school in other states or United States possessions must have a GPA and test score placing them in the upper one-sixth of California high school graduates.

#### **II. TRANSFER STUDENTS - Requirements:**

To qualify for admission as a transfer student you must have a grade point average of 2.0 ("C") or better in all transferable units attempted. You must be in good standing at the last college or university attended and meet any of the following standards:

- 1. Freshman admission requirements must be met that are in effect for the term to which you are applying (see "Freshmen Requirements" section).
- a. Freshman eligibility was attained at the time of high school graduation and you have been in continuous attendance in an accredited college since high school graduation, or

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- b. Freshman eligibility was attained at the time of high school graduation except for the subject requirements; you have made up the missing subjects, and have been in continuous attendance in an accredited college since high school graduation.
- At least 56 transferable semester (84 quarter) units have been completed and you have made up any missing subject requirements (see "Making Up Missing College Preparatory Subjects" section). Nonresidents must have a 2.4 grade point average or better.

For this section, transferable courses are those designated for that purpose by the college or university offering the courses.

#### Making up Missing College Preparatory Subject Requirements:

Undergraduate applicants who did not complete the subject requirements while in high school may make up missing subjects by any of the following ways:

- 1. Complete appropriate courses with a "C" or better in adult school or high school summer sessions.
- Complete appropriate college courses with a "C" or better.
- 3. Earn acceptable scores on specified examinations.
- Applicants with 56 or more semester (84 quarter) units may complete, with a "C" or better in each course, one of the following alternatives:
  - a. 1987 or earlier high school graduates: complete a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) units to be chosen from courses in English, arts and humanities, social science, science and mathematics of at least equivalent level to courses that meet general education or transfer curriculum requirements. Each student must complete all CSU general education requirements in communication in the English language (at least nine semester units) and mathematics (usually three semester units).
  - b. 1988 and later high school graduates: complete a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) units to be chosen from courses in English, arts and humanities, social science, science and mathematics of at least equivalent level to courses that meet general education or transfer curriculum requirements. Each student must complete all CSU general education requirements in communication in the English language (at least nine semester units) and mathematics (usually three semester units).

For this section, one course of at least three semester (four quarter) units will be considered equivalent to one year of high school study. For further information about alternative ways to satisfy the subject requirements, call the Information Center.

III. GRADUATE STUDENTS - A graduate applicant must have a minimum 2.5 GPA in the last 60 semester units attempted, possess an accredited baccalaureate degree, and be in good standing at the last institution attended to be admitted to unclassified standing. Unclassified admission does not constitute admission to a graduate degree curriculum. (Please note that beginning fall 1985 lower division courses and extension courses completed after the bachelor's degree will be excluded from the GPA calculation. Upper division course work taken through Open University will be included in the GPA calculation)

IV. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS - International students are required to have a 2.4 GPA on all units attempted from college.

All students, regardless of citizenship, who have not attended school at the secondary level for at least three years or beyond where English is the principal language of instruction, are required to earn a minimum score of 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

#### New Undergraduate Student Orientation Programs

Each new student must obtain an advisor's signature on the **Registration Ticket** before registering. To expedite the advising process, to introduce students to the campus and to answer general questions about the policies and procedures of the University, orientations are provided at the beginning of the semester.

The mini-orientation session provides a brief campus overview and academic planning program for all new students. During the mini-orientation, new students will be welcomed to the campus, will be given an explanation of advisement procedures and will receive general or major advising, as appropriate.

#### PLEASE NOTE: NEW UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND AN ORIENTATION.

#### Advising for New Graduate and New Credential Students

The above orientation sessions are intended primarily for undergraduate students; however, new graduate students are welcome to attend.

Master's degree candidates in specific disciplines should consult advisors in departmental offices; graduate, special majors and unclassified postbaccalaureate students (undeclared graduate students) should contact the Office of the Dean of Graduate Studies at (213) 516-3693; second bachelor's degree students should seek advisement from the office of their major and education graduate students should go to the departmental offices.

## ADVISEMENT

#### **GENERAL ADVISING SUGGESTIONS**

A good, consistent relationship with an advisor can greatly assist students in achieving educational, career and personal goals, and in taking maximum advantage of the resources of the University. It is in students' best interest to seek and obtain advisors with whom they are compatible and to meet with advisors on a regular basis. Contact an advisor as soon as possible.

#### **Undergraduate Students and Second Baccalaureates**

All new students should plan to attend a New Student Mini Orientation (described on page5) and should carefully read the sections of this Class Schedule describing how to obtain advisement during registration.

Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) students receive advisement from the EOP office, SCC C-127 (phone: 516-3632). Students who are non-EOP admissions exceptions (special admits) or who entered CSU Dominguez Hills with academic deficiencies, must contact a University Advisement Center advisor in SCC M-110 (phone: 516-3538). Major advisors may provide general studies advising in addition to academic advising in the major. If necessary, contact the University Advisement Center for General Studies advising.

The following are the procedures for obtaining academic advisement:

- Undeclared Majors should contact the University Advisement Center (SCC M-110; phone: 516-3538);
- Declared majors and minors should contact the department office of their major/minor (see pages to for department locations and phone numbers) except for business administrations majors/minors who instead should contact the Business Administration Advisement Center (SBS A-326; phone: 516-3561);
- Special majors, minors and second baccalaureates should contact the Office of the Associate Dean, Academic Affairs (ERC D-506; phone: 516-3561).

Students with general studies advising needs, unresolved advising problems or those experiencing academic difficulty (e.g., on probation) should drop by (SCC M-110) or call (516-3538) the University Advisement Center.

#### **Graduate Students**

Students should contact their graduate program coordinators for advisement. The Office of Graduate Studies (phone: 516-3693) will advise M.A./M.S. Interdisciplinary Studies (Special Majors) and unclassified post-baccalaureate students.

#### WHEN ADVISOR SIGNATURES ARE REQUIRED

#### **Academic Advising**

While it is the student's responsibility to seek academic advisement on a periodic basis, the faculty requires students to meet with their advisors at the following three times:

Upon entering the University.

- At the completion of 60 semester units.
- At the completion of 90 semester units.

Many majors, however, require advising during each term of enrollment. Be sure to check with the department of your major to determine policies in this regard.

#### Special Consent(s) For Enrollment

Certain classes listed in this schedule require special consent(s) for enrollment. Students should have the school or program stamp or signature in the authorization column on the Registration Ticket signed before priority registration time.

#### **Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)**

Students who are admitted through the Educational Opportunity Program will not be allowed to register without receiving a prior signature from EOP Director James Clayton or the EOP academic advisor. In addition to the EOP signatures, students need a signature from a departmental major advisor.

#### Non-EOP Admission Exceptions (Special Admits)

For their first year on campus, special admits must obtain advising and an advisor's signature from the University Advisement Center (SCC M-110; phone: 516-3538).

#### **Contract Students**

Contract students should follow the same advisement procedures as admitted new students, including obtaining required signatures.

#### **Continuing Graduate and Credential Students**

Continuing M.A./M.S. and credential students should see their advisors in departmental offices before registration.

#### FINDING AN ACADEMIC ADVISOR DURING ADVANCE REGISTRATION FOR CONTINUING STUDENTS

Advisement for continuing students who are taking advantage of advance, on-line registration will take place within the period prior to the advance registration. To determine the exact advance registration advising procedures for your major/minor program, contact the appropriate department office as described under "General Advising Suggestions."

#### FINDING AN ACADEMIC ADVISOR DURING REGULAR REGISTRATION

If you are a Declared Major, seek advising at your academic department. Faculty in your major or minor will answer questions about General Studies. Office locations are listed in the Class Schedule under the title of Directory of Department Locations and Phone Numbers.

For Undeclared Majors, Admissions Exceptions (Special Admits), EOP students and General Studies troubleshooting, advisors are available at the University Advisement Center (SCC-M110).

International Students should read the sub-sections entitled International Students, under Registration Information.

If you have any questions about the above procedure, call the University Advisement Center, (213) 516-3538.

Note for New Students: Please attend orientation prior to registration. If you are awaiting acceptance, you are strongly urged to attend classes from the first day for a maximum of four weeks or until your admission is confirmed or denied. See section on Late Registration.

#### ADVISEMENT DURING LATE REGISTRATION

Before selecting the courses in which to enroll this term, be sure to consult with a major advisor.

#### **Undergraduate** students

Undeclared majors can find an advisor in the University Advisement Center (SCC M-110; 516-3538). All other majors should read the "Undergraduate Students and Second Baccalaureates" section under "General Advising Suggestions" to determine how to locate an advisor.

#### **Graduate Students**

Students should contact the coordinator of their graduate program for advisement. The Office of the Dean of Graduate Studies (213) 516-3693 will advise graduate special majors and unclassified post-baccalaureate students.

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## **REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

#### FALL REGISTRATION DATES

Note - You must register during your priority time or during any "open" period after your designated hour.

#### Advance Registration:

Tuesday, November 28 through Friday, December 8, 1989

Payment Deadline for all advance registrants will be noted on account statement

Students who do not pay advance registration fees will be "disenrolled" and must register during the regular or late registration periods.\*

#### Regular Registration:

Monday, January 22 through Thursday, January 25, 1990

#### Late Registration:

Monday, January 29 through Friday, February 16, 1990

\*Note: Late registrants will incur a \$25.00 late registration fee.

#### **REGISTRATION TICKET**

Complete the registration ticket before registration. A copy of this form can be seen under "Registration Procedures."

#### **NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS**

Students admitted by the published deadline for the term are notified of eligibility by mail and sent materials for regular registration.

Students applying late and students processed for conditional (contract) registration are issued registration tickets and are assessed an additional late fee of \$25.

Questions regarding admission should be directed to the Office of Admissions or call (213) 516-3696.

#### **CONTINUING STUDENTS**

If you attended CSU Dominguez Hills as a regular nonextension student this past fall or spring, you should receive registration materials in the mail. If you have not received the materials by November 17, 1989, please call the Office of the Registrar (213) 516-3608.

If you have received your registration materials, continue to Advisement and Signatures unless:

- You attended another academic institution since last attending CSU Dominguez Hills, or
- You graduated from CSU Dominguez Hills and you wish to begin postbaccalaureate studies.

In either case, you must reapply and should read the item New or Returning Students.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL HOLDS

Students with administrative and/or financial holds are reminded that your registration cannot be processed until all holds are released from your CSU Dominguez Hills records.

#### **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

All international students must clear their "registration hold" due to lack of health insurance coverage. To do so, contact the University's international student advisor, Dan A. Joseffini in the Small College Complex, Room B-130 (SCC) Information Center.

International students *must provide proof of health coverage* (a membership card or official letter indicating the expiration date and amount of coverage for a personal policy) prior to registration.

If students have not made prior health insurance arrangements and do not have proof of insurance on the day of registration, they will be required to take out and pay for the Hartford Insurance Plan (minimum cost of \$216) in order to register. This plan is the only health insurance plan available to international students on campus. Coverage must be for the months of February 1, 1990 to August 31, 1990. If there are any questions, please call (213) 516-4215 to make an appointment with the international student advisor.

#### **CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT**

A student enrolled at the University may enroll concurrently at another institution by filing a **Petition for Concurrent Enrollment or the Intra System Concurrent Enrollment Form** for enrollment in a CSU system campus with the Office of the Registrar after securing written approval by the academic advisor. Permission will not be granted when the schedule for the proposed combined program exceeds the units authorized at this University for full-time study.

#### **EXCESS UNITS: STUDY LOAD LIMITS**

For undergraduate students in good academic standing, the normal program load is the equivalent of five full courses. To this may be added activity courses having a value of onehalf course or less.

Students may enroll in 15 units without an advisor's signature unless otherwise required. Students enrolling in 16 - 21 units are required to have an advisor's signature. Students enrolling in more than 21 units also must obtain the approval of the dean of the school in which the student is majoring. Undeclared majors must obtain the approval of the coordinator of the University Advisement Center.

#### ENROLLMENT IN OPEN UNIVERSITY FOR MATRICULATED STUDENTS

Effective with fall quarter 1984, a matriculated student who is eligible for enrollment as a regular student may not enroll partially or completely in courses through Open University.

#### ENROLLMENT IN CONFLICTING CLASSES

Students are not allowed to enroll in two classes that meet at the same time, without specific approval on the Petition for Permission to Register for Courses with a Time Conflict. A student found to be enrolled in conflicting courses without the form on file will be required to resolve the conflict. The petition form is available at the Office of the Registrar.

#### **FULL-TIME STATUS**

Undergraduates are considered to be full time students during any semester in which they are enrolled in 12 units or more. In order to graduate in four years, however, a student must complete approximately 16 units each semester. Graduate-level students enrolled in eight or more graduatelevel (500 level) units are considered to be full time.

#### **NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS**

If you were admitted to CSU Dominguez Hills as a nonresident student you should be aware of the following:

- Chapter 102 of the 1981 Statutes of California requires that the "financial independence" of a student must be considered when a non-resident student is requesting reclassification as a resident.
- If you are seeking reclassification as a resident, you are required to complete and file new residency forms with the Office of Admissions. The completed forms will be reviewed and a determination made. If you are eligible for residency status, you will be informed and your registration packet will be changed to reflect your new status. The appropriate forms are available at the Office of Admissions.
- The residence questionnaires by which your status may be changed must be submitted to the Office of Admissions at least two weeks prior to registration.

#### PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL

All pre-medical, pre-dental, pre-pharmacy, pre-veterinary, pre-optometry, pre-etc. students should also seek advising from a pre-medical professional advisor in addition to their major advisor. Please call the SMT School Office (516-3373) for information.

#### VETERANS' BENEFITS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

It is the responsibility of each veteran to request certification for veterans' educational benefits at the time of registration, if this request was not completed previously. Continuing students are normally certified for the school year, September through June, and must make arrangements for any variations, including discrepancies in the number of units reported. Upon request, new students are certified for the current semester through the end of the school year. Please verify your certification with the veterans clerk prior to registration.

It is also the responsibility of the veteran to report to the Office of the Registrar any changes of enrollment affecting certification status.

For new students who are being certified for the first time, and for continuing students who were not certified previous to registration, it will take six to eight weeks from the date of certification before veterans educational benefits are received.

#### **REGISTRATION PROCEDURES**

Each CSUDH student who is eligible to register will be mailed a preprinted **Registration Ticket** (see illustrations A&B). The student must bring this completed form to the registration site (SCC J-127) during the indicated priority hour.

Prior to coming to the registration site (SCC J-127), the student must:

- Correct any incorrect data preprinted on the front of the form in the spaces provided.
- 2. If required, secure advisor's signature. See bottom right corner on the front of the Registration Ticket for "advisor's signature required" notation.
- Clear all holds indicated on the front of the Registration Ticket. Bring hold clearance form with you to the registration site.
- Complete Program Planning Sheet on the back of the Registration Ticket; complete both the preferred and alternate course selections.
- 5. If you are registering for over 16 units, you must secure an advisor's signature. If you are registering for over 21 units, you must additionally secure the signature of your school dean.
- 6. Secure appropriate authorization for classes requiring special permission. Check the Class Schedule footnotes for courses requiring special authorization. Students who do not have appropriate authorization for designated courses will be asked to leave the registration site to secure such approval; students will then be permitted to reenter the registration site and complete the registration process.
- At the completion of the registration process, each student will receive a Schedule Confirmation and Account Statement.
- Students with financial aid awards will have the awards credited on their account statement.
- Fees can be paid by cash, check, money order, VISA or MASTERCARD. Payment of the "Total Due" reflected on the Account Statement must be received in the Cashier's Office by the stated due date. Students who fail to satisfy this requirement will be disenrolled and must register during the regular or late registration periods.

## LATE REGISTRATION AND SCHEDULE CHANGES

#### LATE REGISTRATION

#### Deadline: February 16, 1990

Continuing and new students who do not take advantage of advance or regular registration may register late beginning at 8 a.m., Monday, January 29, 1990. Students may begin late registration on the first day the class meets (not necessarily the first day of classes). Students should use their mailed **Registration Ticket** for late registration processing. Late registration will take place in the Office of the Registrar. New students may not register until they have been formally admitted to the University or issued a "Conditional Registration Contract."

Students must report to the late registration area if they fall into one of the following categories:

Eligible Continuing and New Students who did not register during the advance or regular registration periods must bring their "registration ticket" to the Office of the Registrar.

Students who registered during advanced or regular registration but did not pay fees must report to the late registration area.

New Students who were admitted too late for the regular registration must bring the completed **Registration Ticket** sent to them at the time of admission.

Contract Registration Students who signed a contract for Conditional Registration who have not been processed for admission must bring the completed Registration Ticket and a copy of the contract.

Each student will be provided with a "Late Registration" ticket and instructions on procedures to follow to register for classes. The students must complete the late registration process by February 16; payment of the "Total Due" reflected on the Account Statement must be received in the Cashier's Office by the stated due date. All students registering late will be charged a \$25 late registration fee.

Students who are registering late must obtain proper signatures on the **Registration Ticket**. Signatures obtained on a "Change of Program" form will not be accepted.

#### **CHANGE OF PROGRAM**

A change of program is any change that is made in a student's official schedule. Such a change includes: dropping a class, adding a class, changing the number of semester units for a class in which the student is registered, changing the section of the same course. It is the student's responsibility to verify the classes listed on the schedule confirmation.

A change of program must be made before the deadline date listed for each semester in the official University calendar. NO change is official until the appropriate forms have been signed by the instructor, when required, and processed by the Office of the Registrar.

#### Change of Program deadlines are as follows:

#### Add and Drop Processing

The student must obtain a Change of Program form from the Office of the Registrar and follow these procedures:

- Complete appropriate sections of the Change of Program form per the instructions on the back of the form.
- b. If adding a class, you must obtain the instructor's signature.
- c. If dropping a class, instructor signature is not required.
- d. The completed Change of Program form must be personally returned to the Office of the Registrar for immediate processing. You will be required to present your validated ID card or receipt for processing.
- e. Conditions for dropping a class after the fourth week are outlined in the current University Catalog.

NOTE: A student who enrolls in a course, discontinues attendance and does not officially drop or withdraw from the course, will automatically receive an "F", "NC", or "U" grade for the course.

#### Official Withdrawal from the University

Official withdrawal is necessary if a student leaves CSU Dominguez Hills at any time after registration and does not intend to complete the semester. The forms for initiating this process may be obtained from the Office of the Registrar.

When official withdrawal from the University occurs before the semester deadline for dropping classes (the fourth week of instruction), the record indicates official withdrawal. However, if official withdrawal occurs after the fourth week of instruction, different procedures must be followed. Refer to the current *University Catalog* for those procedures. Students who do not officially withdraw will automatically receive "F" or "U" grades in all courses for which they are enrolled.

Conditions for readmission are indicated on the withdrawal form. A student who withdraws under satisfactory conditions shall be classified as a continuing student for the next semester.

## FEES, REFUNDS, FINANCIAL INFORMATION

#### TUITION IS NOT CHARGED TO LEGAL RESIDENTS OF CALIFORNIA

All students pay the regular fees shown below. Auditors pay the same fee as students registering for credit. ALL FEES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY.

Fees for each semester are part of the registration process and are payable at the time of registration.

#### **NON-RESIDENT TUITION FEE REFUNDS**

Total or partial refund of this fee can be obtained if a refund application is filed with the Office of the Registrar on or before the dates listed in the "**Refund Deadlines**" chart on this page. Refund applications are available from the University Information and Service Center (SCC A130).

#### INSTALLMENT PAYMENT OF NON-RESIDENT TUITION

Effective January 1, 1976, a non-resident student who is a citizen and resident of a foreign country and not a citizen of the United States, may pay the required non-resident tuition fee on an installment basis. This is limited to three equal payments established at the time of registration.

A 15% non-refundable service charge will be added to each installment payment. If payment of either installment is not made on or before the due date, a \$10.00 late fee is also added.

Payments are made at the Cashier's Office, SCC B135.

**NOTE:** Failure to pay any installment within ten (10) calendar days of the due date will result in complete disenrollment for the remainder of the semester and the student will not be eligible to pay non-resident tuition on an installment basis in subsequent terms.

#### **DISHONORED CHECK POLICY**

Once a check has been dishonored, no personal checks will be accepted from that person for a period of at least two academic semesters.

This rule applies to any check returned from any financial institution for any reason. The person will be required to pay all university-related debts by cash, a certified check, money order or travelers check(s) including the \$10.00 returned check fee and, if applicable, a \$25.00 late fee. No personal checks will be accepted. Those passing a dishonored check may be notified and identified in three ways: a letter will be sent to them at the time the check is dishonored; a notice will be included on their registration priority card; and their fee card will be specially identified for the following two academic semesters.

#### **REFUND DEADLINES**

Refunds are not automatic. If you are withdrawing completely from school, or reducing the number of units in which you are enrolled, you should request a "Refund Application" from the University Information and Service Center. Refunds are calculated based on the date the application is received. It is, therefore, important to file for a refund as soon as possible. Please review the refund deadlines shown below. No exceptions can be made to the dates noted. A \$5.00 service charge will be retained by the University to cover the cost of processing each refund application. Refunds are processed after the add and drop period.

The last day to apply for a refund of state university fees is February 16, 1990. No refund applications will be accepted after this date, unless a student withdraws upon the advice of a physician and can document this fact.

The student activity fee, student center fee, facilities fee and instructionally related activities fee are refundable only upon complete withdrawal from the University.

## GENERAL ACADEMIC INFORMATION

#### **AUDITING A CLASS**

Auditors must pay the same fees that would be charged if the course were taken for credit. Enrollment as an auditor is subject to the approval of the instructor. A student registered as an auditor may be required to participate in any or all classroom activities at the discretion of the instructor. Credit for courses audited will not subsequently be granted on the basis of the audit. No record of audit appears on the student's permanent record card nor are transcripts issued for audited courses.

An enrolled student who wishes to audit a course in addition to his regular program must obtain the approval of the instructor on the "Approval for Audit" form available in the Office of the Registrar and pay the fees required as if the course was taken for credit. The approval may not be obtained before the first day of instruction. A student may not opt to audit a course after the end of the fourth week or change from credit to audit status after that date. If a student has enrolled in a course and is changing to audit status, the course must be officially dropped at the time the audit form is submitted.

An audited course should be taken into consideration when planning a program so that the study load will not be excessive.

A student not admitted to, nor enrolled in, the University must file a "Statement of Residence" prior to auditing a course. A resident determination must be made so that the appropriate fees may be charged. An application for admission is not required. A student must then follow the procedures as outlined above. 6.

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#### **CANCELLATION OF CLASSES**

The University reserves the right to make changes in the *Class Schedule* as printed. When enrollment in any class is not sufficient to justify its continuance, the course may be cancelled.

If the University cancels a class, the student will receive a full refund of applicable fees **upon application for refund** or will be allowed to register in another class without payment of a late fee.

#### **CHANGE OF GRADE PROCEDURES**

If a student wishes a grade changed for whatever reason, the process is initiated through the academic department. If a change is made, a "Change of Grade" form, with appropriate signatures, is prepared in the department and sent to the Office of the Registrar. The student will be notified of the change of grade by the Office of the Registrar.

#### **CHANGE OF NAME OR ADDRESS**

If you have made a change of name or address which has not been reported to the University, please come to the Office of the Registrar and request the "Change of Name/Address" form. It is very important that the University be informed of any change so that you will receive all mailing.

#### CHANGE OF INSTRUCTOR

The University reserves the right to make changes in the *Class Schedule* as printed. When classes are split or sections are cancelled due to lack of enrollment, it may be necessary to assign an instructor different from the one listed in the class schedule.

#### **CREDIT BY EXAMINATION**

Effective with the fall quarter of 1978, "Credit by Examination" is governed by the following regulations:

#### **General Conditions**

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- Registered students may receive "credit by examination" for courses in which they are eligible to enroll.
- 2. The student should contact the office of the appropriate department to initiate the procedure.
- Each department will maintain an up-to-date listing of courses that may/may not be taken as "credit by examination."
- The student will select a traditional letter grade or the CR/NC option in accordance with the policies applicable to regular course enrollment.
- "Credit by examination" will not be given for course work that an academic department deems inappropriate or impossible to evaluate by examination.
- 6. The same course can be taken only once by "credit by examination."
- "Credit by examination" will not be given for a course if the student already has received credit for a similar but more advanced course.

#### Procedure for Courses Listed in the Class Schedule

- 1. The student secures a petition for "credit by examination" from the appropriate department office and obtains the signature of the instructor and department chair.
- 2. If the petition is approved, the student enrolls in the course during registration and is given the examination during the first two weeks of the semester.
- 3. The student is notified of the results of the examination during the third week of the semester. If the examination is passed, the grade is submitted to the Office of the Registrar by the end of the third week. The student's name will remain on the roster and the grade will appear on the semester grade card. If the examination is failed, the student has two options: (a) remain enrolled in the course and complete it according to standard procedures, or (b) officially drop the course before the end of the fourth week.
- The course grade will appear on the student's permanent record card with the other grades for the semester with the designation that the course was completed by examination.

#### Procedure for Courses Not Listed in the Class Schedule

- 1. The student secures a petition for "credit by examination" from the appropriate department office and obtains the signature of an appropriate and willing instructor and the department chair.
- 2. If the petition is approved, the examination will be scheduled within 15 days.
- 3. Upon the completion of the exam, a grade is recorded on the petition and the petition is forwarded to the Office of the Registrar.
- 4. The Office of the Registrar notifies the student of the grade provided by the department.
- Only a passing grade will be recorded on the student's permanent record card. A non-passing grade will not be recorded.

#### **CREDIT/NO CREDIT OPTION**

#### **Undergraduate Students**

Undergraduate students selecting the credit/no-credit option must do so by the end of the fourth week of instruction, February 23, 1990. "Credit/No-Credit" forms are available from the Office of the Registrar and the Information and Service Center and must be submitted by the deadline. For additional conditions and limitations of the Credit/No-Credit option, consult the current University Catalog.

#### **Graduate Students**

"CR/NR" grades may be allowed in courses numbered below 500, which will not be used to satisfy the requirement of a graduate degree program.

For full information on "CR/NR" grading, see current University Catalog.

#### CREDIT FOR OPEN UNIVERSITY, EXTENSION AND CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

The University allows transfer credit or appropriate collegelevel courses completed in extension, including "Open University", or by correspondence from accredited colleges or universities and the United States Armed Forces Institute. A maximum of 24 semester (36 quarter) units earned through extension, completed at CSU Dominguez Hills or elsewhere, through correspondence, and USAFI may be accepted toward a bachelor's degree. For graduate level students, a maximum of 9 semester (13 quarter) units of extension work may be applied to a degree. Please note that these credits do not satisfy CSU Dominguez Hills residence requirements for the degree. For more detailed information, please refer to the current University Catalog.

#### DOUBLE COUNTING OF GENERAL STUDIES COURSE

Lower division general courses may be "double-counted" in both the major and the minor. Upper division general studies courses may be double-counted in the following majors only: liberal studies, medical technology, and interdisciplinary studies. (Majors in these programs should consult their faculty advisor for details.) Upper division general studies courses may be double-counted in the minor if: (a) at least 18 semester units are taken in the minor exclusive of general studies courses and (b) general studies courses used in the minor have the approval of the chair/ coordinator responsible for the minor. Even though students may double-count certain general studies courses, they will not receive additional unit credit towards graduation by double-counting. A double-counted course counts four (4) units (not eight) towards graduation.

## FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974

All student records of The California State University, including CSU Dominguez Hills, are kept in accordance with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Students may request access to those campus records that personally identify the student. The student may challenge the accuracy of the record or the appropriateness of its retention in the campus records. For records covered by the Act, student consent is needed to release records to outside parties (e.g. prospective employers) except for those agencies entitled to access under the provisions of the Act (e.g., campus officials, other schools, federal officers, and requests in connection with the application or receipt of financial aid).

A student may request a copy of a record that he/she has requested for release. Students must pay a charge for copies of records for which such a charge has been established. Copies of the full text of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 are available at the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs (ERC C532) or the campus library. Particular questions with respect to a student's prerogatives under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 should be directed to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs. If a student wishes to restrict the release of directory informati request may be made at the Office of the Vice President for St Affairs. The request is valid from the semester requested thro end of the academic year. Requests for restriction of release o information for a subsequent academic year require a new for

#### FIRST CLASS MEETING

Students should report to the first meeting of their scheduled classes. Check the *Class Schedule* for time, day and room numbers. Each student is responsible for attendance in the courses and specific sections in which he/she has enrolled.

Students who enroll in a class but do not attend its first two meetings (or first meeting of once a week classes) and do not contact the instructor beforehand, may be dropped from the class by the instructor and their space given to other students waiting to add the class. It is the responsibility of the student to make sure that he/she has been dropped by the instructor. Students who are in doubt regarding their drop status should file their own official "change of program" form.

NOTE: Failure to officially drop or withdraw from a course will result in a grade of "F", "U", or "NC".

#### **GRADUATION, APPLICATION FOR**

All degree candidates must file an "Application for Graduation" with the Office of the Registrar in accordance with the following schedule:

#### **Baccalaureate Degree**

#### **Graduate Degree**

If you do not qualify for graduation at the end of the semester for which you applied, you must submit a **Change of Graduation Date** card to the Graduation Unit. Failing to do so will place a hold on your undergraduate registration for the next regular semester.

Completion of degree requirements is the student's responsibility and, therefore, each student must be thoroughly familar with the procedures and information about graduation. If you have questions, please consult a University Catalog or check with the Office of the Registrar. Please note that a master's degree requires a minimum of 21 semester units earned in residence. Resident extension (Open University) units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree. A maximum of 9 semester (13 quarter) units of credit at the graduate level taken in Extension may be used toward degree requirements. GI Eff hon rec Do trai

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#### **GRADUATION WITH HONORS POLICY**

Effective with the 1978-79 academic year, to graduate with honors, a student must complete 36 units in residence and receive a minimum of 3.40 GPA on all units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills, with the overall GPA determined on transferable undergraduate work. The honor categories are as follows:

Cum Laude (3.40-3.59)

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Magna Cum Laude (3.60-3.79)

Summa Cum Laude (3.80-4.00)

All students graduating under the 1978-79 or earlier catalogs will be evaluated for graduation using the new criteria. If they meet the new criteria, they will be designated as graduating *cum laude*, *magna cum laude* or *summa cum laude*. If they do not meet the new criteria, they will be evaluated as graduating with honors as stipulated in earlier catalogs and, if eligible, will be designated as graduating "With Distinction" or "With Great Distinction". Students graduating under the 1978-80 catalog and subsequent catalog years will be evaluated using the new criteria only. Graduation with honors is available only to undergraduate students earning a first baccalaureate degree.

Candidates for graduation with honors will be listed in the commencement program based on grades earned through the previous fall semester. Official placement in one of the honors categories will be based on all grades earned including the final term. Therefore, it is possible to be listed as a candidate in the commencement program, but not graduate with honors after all grades have been calculated. Students who do graduate with honors will have the appropriate designation inscribed on their diplomas.

#### **HONORS PROGRAM - GENERAL STUDIES**

The CSU Dominguez Hills Honors Program offers special opportunities to especially able and highly motivated students. New and continuing students may participate in "Honors" sections of General Studies and advanced courses. Open to only Honors Program students, these stimulating classes enrich student learning in required courses. (See the course listing section in this schedule for current offerings, which are listed at the end of the General Studies section under "Honors Program Courses.")

Honors Program students also are eligible to arrange Honors Contracts, whereby any upper-division course may become an Honors course for the individual student. Honors Program students may apply to become Honors apprentices who receive a stipend for working on teaching or researchrelated projects with faculty members in their fields. Additional components of the program include advising from faculty mentors and special activities.

#### **ID CARD**

The ID card must be carried at all times and be validated each term. A current ID card is necessary to perform certain transactions in the Office of Admissions, the Office of the Registrar, the Library, the Business Office and other campus offices, and is necessary to obtain services covered by the student service fee, such as personal and career counseling, and employment and health services.

The ID card also is required by the Student Association to establish eligibility to participate in student activities and elections.

#### **REPEAT AND CANCEL POLICY**

The Repeat and Cancel Policy has been amended effective fall semester 1986. The following procedures are applicable to all CSU Dominguez Hills students:

- "Repeat and Cancel" may be used by students working toward a baccalaureate degree.
- "Repeat and Cancel" may not be used by graduate/postbaccalaureate students working on master's degrees, graduate certifications, teaching credentials, or by "undeclared" graduate students, even when they might take undergraduate courses.
- 3. In the case of a repeated course, the subsequent grade is substituted for the earlier in the computation of units attempted and grade point average (GPA). The previous course grade(s) remain(s) on the record, but is annotated as being discounted from GPA calculations.
- "Repeat and Cancel" may be used on courses taken and repeated at CSU Dominguez Hills, and other CSU campuses during summer sessions or as a CSU visitor/ concurrent student.
- 5. "Repeat and Cancel" may be used up to a total of 18 semester units taken at CSU Dominguez Hills.
- "Repeat and Cancel" may be used only on grades of "U", "F", "D", "CD".

#### **RETAINING CONTINUING STUDENT STATUS**

#### Procedure

Students may elect to be absent for one semester without losing eligibility for re-registration, subject to the following conditions:

- A permit to register will not be released to students who were scholastically disqualified following their most recent semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills.
- Students who attend another college or university during an absence from CSU Dominguez Hills must file an application for admission as a returning student and must have official transcripts of work attempted sent to the Office of Admissions. The non-refundable \$45 application fee is required.
- Undergraduate students who graduate from CSU Dominguez Hills and wish to continue as graduate students must file a new application for admission. An application fee of \$45 is required.

#### **Retention of Catalog Rights**

A student utilizing the continuing student status procedure will retain catalog rights. The student will be able to use the requirements of the *University Catalog* under which they were admitted.

#### TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENTS OF 1972

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and the Departmental Regulation (45 CFR Part 86), promulgated thereunder, prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex in the operation of most federally assisted education programs. The affirmative action coordinator, Office of Faculty and Staff Affairs, has been assigned the administrative responsibility for reviewing such matters.

## **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR'S DEGREE**

Students seeking a baccalaureate degree from the University must complete specific requirements as determined by the Trustees of The California State University, the California Administrative Code, Title 5, and CSU Dominguez Hills.

Briefly summarized, the college-wide requirements include all of the following:

- Completion of a minimum of 124 semester units of credit. Students earning a B.S. degree may be required to take up to 132 semester units.
- Completion of General Studies program (52-59 semester units).
- Satisfaction of statutory requirements in U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals by completing courses History 101 or examination and Political Science 101 or examination.
- 4. Satisfaction by examination or course of the graduation requirement in writing proficiency.
- 5. Satisfaction of the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) requirement.
- 6. Completion of one of the following: a major and a minor, or a major in one of the designated single fields, or a double major. This requirement also can be satisfied through the Areas of Concentration in Interdisciplinary Studies combined with a thematic project, a minor or another major. Specification for each field are outlined under their appropriate headings in the University Catalog.
- Completion of elective courses (beyond the requirements above) to reach the total of a minimum of 124 semester units of credit.
- 8. The term, residence units, applies to those units earned at CSU Dominguez Hills while an officially admitted student in a degree program. Fees must be paid through the regular registration process. Residence requirements for a bachelors degree include a minimum of 30 semester units in residence of which 24 units must be in upper division courses and 12 upper division units must be earned in residence. The maximum credit that may be taken in Extension (Open University) and used toward degree requirements is 24 semester (36 quarter) units at the undergraduate level and 9 semester (13 quarter) units at the graduate level. Resident extension units do not satisfy residence requirements for a degree.

#### ACADEMIC SKILLS ASSESSMENT PLAN

The California State University (CSU) and CSU Dominguez Hills recognize each student's needs for adequate preparation in mathematics, English, reading and critical thinking for successful continuation and completion of his or her college education. C

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The CSU now requires all freshmanand those transfer students who have not completed appropriate college courses to demonstrate entry level skills in two areas: English and mathematics. To better ensure that students who are poorly prepared in one or more of the basic skills receive this preparation early in their college career, CSU Dominguez Hills began implementation of an Academic Skills Assessment Plan (ASAP) in fall 1984, starting with new freshmen. Beginning fall 1986, all new and readmitted former undergraduate students will be expected to meet the requirements of the plan.

The ASAP has four stages that may affect you:

Stage 1.	Assessment of Entry Level Skills
Stage 2.	Completion of Entry Level Skills
Stage 3.	Certification of Basic Skills
Stage 4.	Certification of Writing Proficiency

Stages 1 and 2 are detailed below. Stages 3 and 4, in their detailed form, may be found in the University Catalog.

#### Stage 1. Assessment of Entry Level Skills

Assessment of entry level competencies in reading, composition and mathematics.

- 1. Unless exempt, students must take the English Placement Test (EPT) and Entry Level Mathematics test (ELM) no later than their first semester of attendance at CSU Dominguez Hills. (See entry describing EPT and ELM in the "Admission to the University" section of the University Catalog.) If exempt, the student will be notified when admitted.
- Entry Level English Skills If students score T150 or below on the EPT, they must enroll in ENG 009 Basic Writing Workshop or IDS 006 Intensive Writing Skills Workshop. If their score is T141 or lower on the EPT, they also must enroll in ENG 088 Developmental Reading. Both ENG 088 and 099 or SMC 006 are prerequisites to ENG 110 Freshman Composition I and may be taken concurrently prior to ENG 110.
- Entry Level Mathematics Skills If students score 470 or below on the ELM, they should registe for MAT 003 and/ or MAT 005. If students are not exempt, they must pass the ELM before taking any higher level math course (MAT 105 or higher). No course satisfy this requirement.

#### Stage 2. Completion of Entry Level Skills

By the end of two semesters of attendance, students are required to have achieved a score of T151 or higher on the EPT or have completed appropriate remedial courses and to have passed the ELM. If they do not meet these requirements, they will not be allowed to register in subsequent terms for any classes except the appropriate remedial courses and selected courses upon mandatory advisement.

#### **COMPETENCY IN WRITING**

#### **Undergraduate Students**

All new and returning undergraduate students admitted for fall 1983 or subsequent terms must meet the upper division writing requirement. Those students who have rights to a catalog prior to 1983 will be held to the graduation requirements stated therein. This would include students who have been in continuous attendance at a California Community College or continuing students at CSU Dominguez Hills. This requirement may be satisfied by one of the following options:

- A. VOLUNTARY TESTING. The Graduation Writing Examination (GWE), for which a fee will be charged, is available to students at regularly scheduled intervals. Students wishing to pursue this option are encouraged to take the test early in their junior year. A score of at least seven (7) is necessary to pass. Students are allowed to take the test twice.
- B. ADVANCED COMPOSITION COURSES. The English Department regularly offers two types of advanced composition courses: a general purpose advanced composition course (English 350), and a course designed for students capable of profiting from intensive instruction (English 456). A grade of "C" or better is necessary.
- C. UPPER DIVISION WRITING ADJUNCT. The Writing Adjunct (IDS 397, followed by IDS 398, 4 units required) currently offered in Interdisciplinary Studies, is a structure for providing individualized instruction in composition that is adjunctive to study in another subject area.
- D. UPPER DIVISION COURSES (offered by Departments other than English). Some departments presently offer courses that, though not solely composition courses, stress instruction in writing, require frequent writing assignments, and provide regular response to students about their writing. Courses currently available in this category are History 300, Chemistry 460 and Sociology 300. A grade of "C" or better is necessary.

The voluntary (GWE) test is administered each semester. Information on test date and procedures for sign-up are available in the Information and Service Center.

#### **Graduate Students**

All graduate students entering in fall of 1983 and thereafter, are required to satisfy the graduate competency in writing requirement in accordance with the following policy:

- Students who have made either a score of eight (8) on the Graduation Writing Examination (GWE) or at least a grade of "BC", or its equivalent, in one of the undergraduate certifying courses at CSU Dominguez Hills are adjudged to have met the graduate writing requirement. Information regarding the schedule of test administrations and the list of approved courses is available in the Information and Service Center. (Also, see above B,C, and D.)
- 2. All students who did not meet the requirement as undergraduates, as in (1) above, must take the GWE and make a score of at least eight (8) or take one of the

undergraduate certifying courses at CSU Dominguez Hills and make at least a grade of "BC."

- Students in the graduate program in English may fulfill this requirement by satisfactory performance on the Graduate Exercise administered by the departmental graduate committee.
- Students who fail to make at least an eight (8) on GWE have the option of taking the exam a second time.
- Students who fail twice to make a score of at least eight (8) on the GWE must take one of the undergraduate certifying courses and make at least a grade of "BC" to meet the requirement.
- Writing competency must be certified no later than the point of advancement to candidacy. Individual programs may require such certification at an earlier point in the student's program.
- CSU Dominguez Hills will accept certification of graduate writing competence from another CSU campus.
- Special arrangements will be made for some external degree programs. Students should consult with the program coordinator.

#### **ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST - (EPT)**

All students wishing to enroll in English 110 must take the English Placement Test unless they meet one of the exemptions listed in the current *University Catalog*. Verification of exemptions in the form of letters of notification or scores reported by testing agencies is required at the time of registration for the course.

Additionally, students who are bound by the EPT requirement must take the test in their first semester on campus whether they plan to take English 110 that semester or not.

The test dates for the EPT: The EPT is given at least once each semester and during the summer. Test dates are listed on page 25 of the Class Schedule.

#### **ENTRY-LEVEL MATHEMATICS (ELM)**

All students who entered CSU Dominguez Hills in fall 1983 or later must demonstrate basic competence in mathematics. New freshmen must demonstrate competence by successful completion of the CSU Entry-Level Mathematics (ELM) Examination. All students who have not achieved a grade of "C" or above in an intermediate algebra course (or more advanced algebra course) prior to fall 1988 are subject both to the ELM requirement and to the fall 1988 quantitative reasoning requirement. Satisfactory performance on any of several alternate examinations may exempt students from taking this examination. For more information, contact the Office of Admissions.

Students required to take this examination should do so as soon as possible after admission. Failure to take the examination before the end of the first term may lead to probation and disqualification.

## **GENERAL STUDIES**

#### STATUTORY REQUIREMENT

#### **CURRENT GENERAL STUDIES**

The General Studies program, which is divided into three components, requires 52-59 semester units:

- 29-30 units of lower division General Education divided among: (B) Natural Sciences (9 units);
  (C) Humanities (9 units); (D) Social Sciences (9 units); (E) The Whole Person (2-3 units)
  - 9 units of (F) Upper Division Integrative Studies.

In addition, students must take a course emphasizing cultural pluralism (0-3), which can satisfy General Studies or other graduation requirements as well. All students must take three upper division courses in General Studies, and all students must take three General Studies courses at CSU Dominguez Hills. The statutory requirement in American Institutions (HIS 101 or examination and POL 101 or examinations) is NOT part of the General Studies program, but is a graduation requirement.

The current General Studies program is required of all students who enter CSU Dominguez Hills or a California Community College as first-time freshmen beginning fall 1986. Continuing students (other than 1980-81, 1981-82, and 1986-87 first-time freshmen) and transfer students in continuous enrollment at a California Community College or a CSU campus since 1980-81 may have the option of choosing the former General Education program.

## CREDIT BY EXAMINATION for English 110, 111, 350 and 352

Students wishing to earn credit by examination for English 110, English 111, English 350 or English 352 must take an examination at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 10, 1990. To be admitted to the testing room, each student must:

1. Register for the course.

 Fill out a petition to take the test. Petition forms are available in the English Department Office, (HFA E-315) and must be on file in that office before noon, February 8, 1990;

and

 provide verification of satisfactory performance on tests or in courses. Verification in the form of letters of notification, scores reported by testing agencies, grade slips, or transcripts will be checked before the petition forms are accepted by the English Department Office.

#### Each student petitioning to take:

English 110 is required to have an English Placement Test (EPT) score of: (1) C-155 or higher or (2) T-155 and E-8 or higher. A student exempted from the EPT on the basis of a satisfactory score on the EEE, AP, SAT-Verbal, ACT, or College Board Achievement Test in English Composition with essay may attempt to earn credit by examination. (Only test scores will be used to determine the eligibility of a student.);

English 111 is required to have an English Placement Test score of: (1) C-155 or higher and L-155 or higher (2) T-155 and E-8 or higher. Students must also have completed English 110 with a grade of "B" or better. Students with a transferable (baccalaureate) course in freshman composition must have earned a grade of "B" or better in that course but are exempt from the EPT. Eligible students may challenge both English 110 and 111 at the same time.

English 350 is required to have completed English 110 and 111 or their equivalents with an average grade of "B" or better;

English 352 must show a passing score of at least eight (8) on the junior-level competency in writing examination (GWE) or JEPET or have successfully completed English 350, Advanced Composition, or the equivalent with a grade of "B" or better. They also must have completed English 110 and 111 or their equivalents. Students who are unsuccessful in their attempts to earn credit by examination may remain in the class, complete the work, and be awarded credit at the end of the semester. Students who pass the challenge examination may NOT remain in the class to earn grades better than those earned on the challenge examination. They may, however, retake the course in a later semester to improve their grades.

All students should bring an  $8-1/2 \ge 11^{\circ}$  blue book to the examination.

#### **ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST - (EPT)**

All students wishing to enroll in English 110 must take the English Placement Test unless they meet one of the exemptions listed in the current *University Catalog*. Students who are bound by the EPT requirement **must** take the test in their first semester on campus whether they plan to take English 110 that semester or not.

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## **STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES**

#### **ALUMNI ASSOCIATION**

The CSU Dominguez Hills Alumni Association seeks to advance the welfare of the University, to promote common interests of its students and alumni, and to serve as liaison with the University, alumni and the area. The Alumni Association sponsors a number of activities during the year, provides scholarship assistance to students, presents Outstanding Achievement Awards annually to outstanding seniors and generally supports the University.

Today the alumni of the University number more than 20,000 and are found throughout the world. All CSU Dominguez Hills students are eligible for membership in the Alumni Association. #### ASSOCIATED STUDENTS

The Associated Students has been in existence in one form or another since 1967. During that time, they have been dedicated to furthering the educational, social, cultural and recreational welfare of the students at CSU Dominguez Hills.

In essence, the students are the Associated Students' main concern. The membership fees (activity fees paid at the beginning of each semester ) constitute the yearly budget, which is expended for student-run activities that benefit students, such as intercollegiate activities, tutorials, the Child Development Center and cultural programming. Students making decisions about activities that benefit students – that's what the Associated Students is all about!

Nearly 50 student volunteers are needed yearly to fill University and Associated Students committees that make important decisions concerning the educational welfare of students. #### **Student Activities**

The Student Activities and Cultural Programs Commission (S.A. and C.P. #### ATHLETICS

The intercollegiate athletic program at CSU Dominguez Hills (the Toros) is unique in its balance between men's and women's sports programs. The department currently conducts the following four Toros men's sports and four women's sports that serve approximately 150 athletes: men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, baseball, softball, men's golf and women's volleyball. CSU Dominguez Hills is a member of the California Collegiate Athletic Association along with Cal State Los Angeles, Cal State Northridge, Cal State Bakersfield, Cal Poly Pomona, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Chapman College and UC Riverside. The Toros compete on a national level in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II.

All teams have recently earned distinction by either winning conference championships, playing for NCAA regional or national championships and garnering national rankings. During the 1988/89 season, five of the eight sports were nationally ranked.

The Toros athletic program is noted for playing very competitive schedules, including many games against NCAA Division I institutions. Additionally, academic excellence is a priority for CSUDH student-athletes. Recently, John Nojima and Kathy Goggin, men's and women's basketball, respectively, were honored to be selected as Rhodes scholar finalists. Also, many team members have earned All-American and Academic All-American distinction.

## CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER - (Casa Dominguez)

Students, faculty or staff members with children ages 2-1/2 to 14, may be eligible to utilize the on-campus Child Development Center.

Under the auspices of the Center for Quality Education, the center is a professional school for child development. Teachers and student interns observe and assist the children in the carefully prepared indoor and outdoor activities.

Funded by a variety of sources, including Associated Students, parents are charged a sliding fee scale. All children must be toilet trained and in good health. Each is given breakfast, noon-time hot lunch and afternoon snack. The center hours are Monday through Thursday, 7:45 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Friday 7:45 a.m., to 5:00 p.m. when the University is in regular session. For further information, call (213) 327-2880.

#### **DISABLED STUDENT SERVICES**

#### EOP

The Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) is an alternate admissions program for individuals who are not eligible for regular admission directly from high school, either because of their grade point average or their SAT/ACT scores. The program also is open to community college students who have less than 56 transferrable semester units or 84 quarter units. Re-entry students who are not recent graduates from either high school or community college also should consider EOP as a possible means of re-entering school. There are both income guidelines that must be met as well as firm deadlines for applying for admissions through the EOP program. CSU Dominguez Hills Re-admits who were formerly EOP and EOP students transferring from another CSU campus should contact the EOP office first when applying for admissions. #### **EVENING SERVICES**

Evening Services are provided in the Information Center, SCC A-130, (213) 516-3696, for students, staff and faculty. On Monday through Thursday evenings, 5 to 7 p.m., the staff is available to assist students with admission information, University academic policies, after-hours support for the Office of Admissions and the Office of the Registrar and pick-up and drop-off services.

Generally, we attempt to assist evening students so that they may function with the same effectiveness and convenience as daytime students.

#### FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

Information concerning student financial assistance may be obtained at the Financial Aid Office, SCC E-138, phone (213) 516-3647.

The Financial Aid Office handles financial aid and part-time employment. The purpose of student financial aid is to provide appropriate financial assistance to eligible students in order to help them achieve their educational objectives. To be considered for financial assistance, students must complete the "Student Aid Application" for California (SAAC). Students should file the application and complete supporting documentation on or before April 15th of the school year in order to be considered for priority funding. SAAC applications for the 1989-90 school year are currently available in the Financial Aid Office; 1990-91 SAAC's should be available during the month of December 1989. All students who are applying for financial aid, including Stafford Guaranteed Student Loans, must file a SAAC.

The University participates in the following financial aid programs: Perkins Loans; Stafford Loans; College Work Study (CWS); Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG); Pell Grant; California Educational Opportunity Grants (EOP); State University Grant (SUG); Cal Grant A; Cal Grant B; the California Graduate Fellowship Program, the Bilingual Teacher Grant Program, and The California Supplemental Loan for Students (SLS).

#### **FOOD SERVICE**

#### Cafeteria

During regular session, Monday through Thursday, Cafeteria hours are from 7 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. On Friday, the Cafeteria is open from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. Each morning until 10 a.m., the Cafeteria features breakfast cooked-to-order and fresh baked pastries. From 11 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., home-cooked lunch and dinner entrees, a full salad bar, grill, Mexican food and desserts are available.

#### The Pub

The Bullseye Cantina is open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Friday, 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. A lunch buffet is offered from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. daily.

#### **Vending Machines**

Food vending machines are located on the first floor of the Educational Resources Center (ERC), Social and Behavioral Sciences (SBS) buildings and on the east side in the Cafeteria dining area. For further information, please call 516-3814.

#### HEALTH CENTER

The student service fee paid by all regularly enrolled students at registration allows students to benefit from many services offered by the Health Center. Not only is care provided for illness and injury, but doctors, nurses and lab technicians do screening tests including those for diabetes, hypertension, anemia, pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases. The Center stresses the "health and wellness" concept and assists students by providing health care consultations in such areas as nutrition, birth control counseling and weight control.

The Center offers immunizations against measles and Rubella, which are easily prevented and are considered to be serious diseases for college age populations. The CSU system requires all new students born after January 1, 1957 to either submit proof of immunity to measles and rubella or to be immunized against these diseases. Students can get a combined measles/rubella vaccination free of charge at the Student Health Center.

The Center also features a licensed pharmacy where students may get prescriptions filled and purchase over-the-counter items as well. Costs are much lower than at private pharmacies and students are invited to consult with the pharmacist. X-ray services are also available.

Also offered are health education seminars on various health concerns, as well as out Lifestyle Health Faires and referrals to community resources.

Located in the building north of the University Theater, the Center is open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday, Tuesday and Friday and from 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday.

For appointments call (213) 516-3629 (3629 from campus phones). Students can also be seen on a walk-in basis.

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#### **On-Campus Housing**

Living on campus makes university life more fulfilling and exciting. The convenience and reasonable fees are yet other reasons for living in the student apartments. One- and twobedroom apartments are offered furnished and unfurnished, and unlike traditional dormitories, they have their own fullsize kitchens. #### **Off-Campus Housing**

As a service to students seeking off-campus housing accommodations, the Office of Off-Campus Housing keeps an upto-date listing of local houses, apartments and rooms that owners list with the University.

The Office also offers one or more workshops each semester on off-campus housing issues, such as tenants' rights, how to find a roommate, etc. Call or come into the office for dates and times of these events. ## INFORMATION AND SERVICE CENTER

The Information and Service Center, located in SCC A130, at the front of the campus, assists the campus population, prospective University applicants, and community members by providing essential, centralized information on campus resources, activities and programs. The center also makes appropriate referrals to other campus units. Brochures, maps, directories and other materials are available to students and visitors.

Center functions include maintaining a centralized calendar of campus activities, handling all application requests, providing information on admission policies and procedures, giving pre-admission advising, conducting tours and answering questions regarding fees, refund policies, withdrawal deadlines and other general academic policies. During the academic year, center hours are: Monday - Thursday, 8 a.m. -7 p.m.; Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. the telephone number is (213) 516-3696. Evening Services also are located in the center.

# LEARNING ASSISTANCE CENTER

The Learning Assistance Center offers a broad range of support services to students to include tutoring and assistance with study skills (listening/notetaking; exam preparation; reading development, vocabulary and computation skills development).

Other support assistance includes seminars and workshops for students who are preparing for the following tests: CBEST, GWE, ELM. The Novanet Computer system offers 7,000 hours of computer assisted instruction in mathematics, English grammar/usage, reading, business subjects and other subject areas. Students can use the Novanet system to enhance and expand their understanding of classroom subjects and prep for the CBEST, GWE, ELM. # OFFICE OF ACTIVITIES (AND TEMPORARY UNION)

The Office of Activities (and Temporary Union) is located in the north and west wings of the Commons. The staff is dedicated to providing a rich, multi-faceted schedule of events throughout the year.

The Office of Activities (and Temporary Union) has been designed as a place where students, faculty and staff can meet together between classes. It offers an activity lounge, meeting room, television-viewing area, activity game area (with pool tables, ping pong, electronic and table games), The Dominguez Express (a mini do-it-yourself postal service) and a Service Desk, which provides information on campus-wide student activities and a check-out service for games and ther equipment. The Office of Ativities (and Temporary Union) is located in the Commons (CSA) A-140; telephone (213) 516-3559.

# **OLDER ADULT CENTER**

The Older Adult Center (OAC) serves as a support system for older students on campus, but provides a warm and friendly atmosphere for people of all ages. The coffee pot is always on during open hours. Services included a tuition waiver program for a limited number of students over age 60, and a shared housing program designed to match homeowning or renting senior citizens with students needing a place to live. The OAC also provides many other academic and social opportunities for students, faculty and staff. Those interested in being placed on the OAC's activities mailing list may drop by the center and sign up. Information Referral Services are offered each semester to the community and University.

The OAC also serves as the Carson/Dominguez Hills Network of Gray Panthers, a senior citizen advocacy group. People of all ages are welcome to become active in the Gray Panthers.

## RECREATION

## **REENTRY PROGRAM**

A majority of the students at CSU Dominguez Hills have had a significant break in their education and are considered reentry students. Approximately 50 percent of undergraduates are more than 25 years-of-age and approximately 62 percent of the graduate population is over the age of 30.

The main purpose of the Take II Reentry program is to introduce students to campus, to show them how it works, and to encourage them to make it work for them. Initially, returning students can draw support from the program and then ease away from it as their own confidence increases. The office is located in SCC C-128. #### **ROTC (MILITARY SCIENCE)**

Through arrangements with the U.S. Department of the Air Force and Army, a student who is enrolled at CSU Dominguez Hills can concurrently enroll at CSU Long Beach or Loyola Marymount in an Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program. ROTC is designed to introduce students to a career as a leader in a variety of specialized fields and to the meaning of service to the country with a sense of deep pride and gratification. Army ROTC classes are offered both on-campus and at CSULB. Air Force ROTC classes are available twice a week at CSULB or Loyola Marymount University, where it meets on Saturday morning. # SERENITY CENTER

The Serenity Center, CSA B12/H-123, (213) 516-3656 is a center for education on the prevention of alcohol and other drug abuse. It offers programs and activities and provides the following confidential services:

- Referral to on/off campus Alcoholics Anonymous, Al-Anon, Cocaine Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous and other programs.
- Information regarding treatment programs.

The Serenity Center can also assist student groups, faculty, administrators, and staff in planning educational programs on alcohol and other drugs. Available are: workshop, speakers, brochures, posters, films, bibliography.

# STUDENT ESCORT SERVICE

Under the direction of the Department of Public Safety, student assistants are employed to escort the University community to their parked vehicles during the evening hours. #### STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

#### **Counseling Groups**

Personal counseling is offered individually and in groups. Some of the groups and workshops that may be offered this semester include:

Adult Children of Alcoholics: A therapy group for students who grew up with alcoholic parents.

Latinal: A group focusing on identifying cultural strengths and/or weaknesses that enhance or undermine the goals of Latinas.

"Do the Right Thing": A support group for men of color that focuses on discussing feelings and experiences which especially involve campus culture, racism and cultural awareness. Ser

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Men's Support Group and Women's Support Group: A supportive environment for sharing feelings and discussing issues that affect men and women students respectively.

Personal Awareness: This group provides participants with opportunities to improve their quality of life as well as to deal with specific interpersonal and intra-personal problems.

## Services for Reentry Students

SIGI/Discover Orientations: SIGI, the System of Interactive Guidance and Information, is a computer program that can help you in planning for a career. SIGI allows you to examine what you want in a career and to gather information about a wide variety of occupational fields.

Graduate School: Discusses the motivations for graduate study, explores the preparation, selection and application processes; also covers getting ready to go, tips on making the transfer, graduate school expectations, and answers to general questions about graduate study.

#### STUDENT PROGRAMS

Involvement in campus life gives students an opportunity to balance academic work with a variety of co-curricular activities that contribute to personal growth. Nearly 50 student clubs, honor/service societies and Greek organizations are in existence on the campus, and many students at CSU Dominguez Hills belong to a campus organization because it increases the value of student life. The numbers and types of student organizations vary with each year.

Student Programs is responsible for new student orientation and provides personal advising with respect to campus activities.

Working with the Activities Office (and temporary Union), Student Programs schedules all student programs on the campus, including all union programming.

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The Office is also responsible for the supervision of Disabled Student Services, the Women's Center, the Activities Office (and temporary Union), the Office of Off-Campus Housing and Veterans' Affairs and the Serenity Center, the campus program on Alcohol and Other Drug Education and Prevention, and serves as a liaison to the Associated Students.

To provide the campus with comprehensive and useful information, the Office of Student Programs offers several publications, including Campus Publicity and Posting Regulations, The Student Organizations' Directory, The Club Handbook, The Policies and Procedures Guidelines for Fratemities and Sororities and Campus Scheduling Policies.
