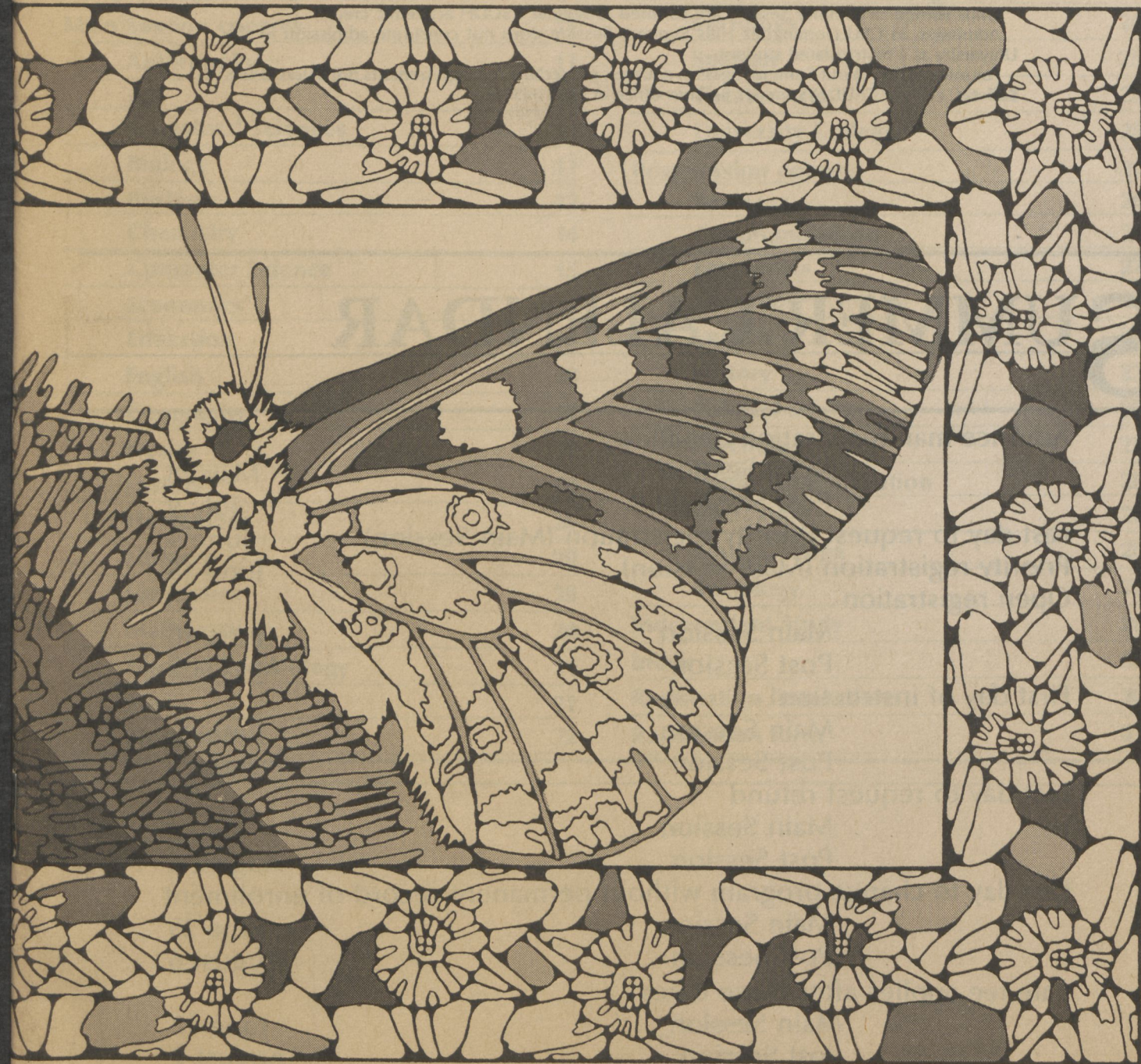

Units earned in Summer Session are counted as regular CSUDH academic credit.

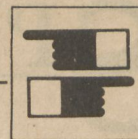
Admission to CSU Dominguez Hills Summer Session does not constitute admission to the University as a matriculated student.

Seventh Annual Gerontology Institute

STUDENTS who successfully complete the six courses (24 units) in the core program and eight quarter units of electives will receive the Certificate in Gerontology, which is recognized for licensing requirements by the California Nursing Association of Homes for the Aged and the Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators. Some of the courses are also approved for continuing education by the California Board of Registered Nursing; contact Diane Henschel or Barbara Hazelleaf for more information: 213/516-3641.

Pre-Medical/Dental Organic Chemistry

A YEAR of organic chemistry with lab in 10 weeks is covered in these courses. CHE 200/201 meets the first five weeks, followed by CHE 202/203 the second five weeks. Designed for pre-medical and pre-dental students, the two sequential courses offer 12 quarter units - equivalent to eight semester units - the required minimum in organic chemistry for professional schools.

Students who have taken the course in previous summers have also found it very useful in preparing for the DAT and MCAT.

Students must register for both halves during Early Registration.

Writers' Craft Workshop

FOR PROSPECTIVE and practicing writers, teachers of writing, and English majors (undergraduate and graduate), the workshop will meet in two blocks of time, separated by two weeks of independent writing time.

The first four sessions (August 3, 4, 5 and 6) will explore the broad range of writing and pre-writing strategies, the varieties and intricacies of modern prose style, and the contemporary marriage of

fictional and non-fictional technique.

Each participant will, with workshop guidance, plan a writing project—an essay, short story, or article—to be carried out in the interim between the workshop's first and second phases.

The five sessions of the second phase (August 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27) will be devoted to editorial analysis and evaluation of the completed writing projects, aiming each toward a standard of professional merit.

All of the sessions, with the exception of the one on August 23, Monday, will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with ample lunch and coffee breaks. The abbreviated session on August 23 will meet from 9 to 10 a.m.

The Writers' Craft Workshop is applicable for either graduate or undergraduate credit in English and, on advisement, may be acceptable for credit in Education.

Music Producing

MUS 377 Music Producing (3): Production of music recordings, including selections of artists and repertoire, musicians, budgeting, studio booking and procedures, mastering, copies, promotion, marketing, distribution, airplay, sales, advertising, and creative decision-making.

MUS 377L Music Producing Laboratory (1): Actual experience in producing music recordings in studio and remote formats. May include producing for any

of the following: disc, film, video, TV, cassettes, radio and cable audio.

INSTRUCTOR: Jim Ed Norman. Jim Ed Norman is one of the leading independent producers in Hollywood and Nashville. He has produced albums for Jennifer Warnes, Anne Murray, Charlie Rich, Janie Fricke, Jackie Deshannon, Mickey Gilley and Johnny Lee, and is currently doing Glenn Frey's solo album. Norman was also the string arranger for Linda Ronstadt, America, and three albums by

the Eagles, including "Hotel California." He brings a wealth of practical experience to the teaching of this professionally oriented course. In addition to lectures and discussions, the class will participate in a 16-track production project.

Enrollment in MUS 377 Music Producing Laboratory will be by audition and interview on July 26 at 1 p.m. Students interested in this class should bring a cassette tape of their best previous work.

Prerequisite: MUS 369 Audio Recording or equivalent.

Direct Instruction Workshops

THE BASIC workshop is designed for beginning special or remedial teachers. It will review teacher effectiveness research, principles of direct instruction, training in one small group direct instruction program and will offer a supervised practicum with learning handicapped students, including 16 hours of individual tutoring and 16 hours of small group teaching.

Prerequisites are a basic (elementary or secondary) teaching or services

credential; EDU 210 Motivation and Learning; EDU 266 Introduction to Exceptional Children; and a goal of earning a learning handicapped, reading, math, pupil services or language, speech and hearing specialist credential.

The advanced workshop is for experienced special and remedial teachers and supervisors and provides review of teacher effectiveness research, principles of direct instruction, training in two small group direct instruction programs,

curriculum and behavior management techniques, a supervised practicum, generalization of direct instruction techniques to a variety of curricula and direct instruction supervision techniques.

Prerequisites are a basic (elementary or secondary) credential, special credential, and professional goal of becoming a master, cooperating, helping teacher or supervisor in regular, compensatory, remedial or special education.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMISSION

Anyone 18 years of age and/or a high school graduate may attend Summer Session. Transcripts of previous college or high school work are NOT required. However, certain courses have prerequisites or special qualifications for enrollment; special requirements for enrolling in classes are listed beneath schedule information.

Admission to Summer Session does not constitute admission to the University for the regular academic year.

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

Regularly enrolled students should obtain academic advisement during Spring Quarter, when departmental offices are open and fully staffed.

Informal advisement assistance will be provided during walk-in registration for Main Session. Also, the answers to many questions of a general nature can be found in the University Catalog, available at the Bookstore. Course descriptions are also listed in the Catalog.

SUMMER SESSION SECTION NUMBERS

Section numbers beginning with 6 (61, 62, etc.) are classes in the Main (6 week) Session. Section numbers beginning with 4 (41, 42, etc.) are classes in the Post (4-week) Session. Section numbers starting with 1 (11, 12, etc.) are classes that start in Main Session and end in Post Session.

Main and Post session courses are listed in separate sections of this *Bulletin*.

FINAL EXAMINATION SCHEDULE

Final examinations will be scheduled in the final meeting of the class and should take at least two hours to complete. If you have a time conflict you should meet with your instructor to arrange to take the exam within 48 hours of the scheduled time.

GENERAL INFORMATION



CHANGE OF PROGRAM (Forms available in the Admissions and Records Office and Service Center)

You are responsible for all courses listed on your official study list completed at registration. Forms to drop or add courses are available at the Admissions and Records Office. No change is effective until you have filed the Change-of-Program form with the Director of Records and Registration, and paid additional fees, if any, to the University Cashier.

To **ADD**, attend the course in which you want to enroll. If there is space available, and the instructor is willing, the instructor signs the appropriate space in the ADD section of your Change-of-Program form which you must return to Admissions and Records by **June 25** for Main Session and **August 6** for Post Session.

To **DROP**, obtain the Change-of-Program form. Through the first week of the session you may drop without an instructor's approval. The balance of the session (excluding the last week) you may drop with only the instructor's signature. The last week of the session you must secure the instructor's signature and either the School Dean's or Dean of Extended Education's signature, plus present valid evidence of the extenuating circumstances causing withdrawal. In the event of illness or accident, medical verification may be required. Failing work in the class will not be acceptable.

If you drop a course (whether or not in conjunction with withdrawal from the University), you will be assigned a grade in accordance with the following schedule:

Main Session:

First week (June 21 thru 25)-no record of enrollment

Second through fifth week (June 28 thru July 24)-Grade of W

Sixth week (July 26 thru July 30)-a final grade will be assigned. (Exceptions due to extenuating circumstances may be considered.)

Post Session:

First two days of instruction (August 3 and 4)-no record of enrollment.

Third day (August 5) through third week (August 20)-Grade of W

Fourth week (August 23-27)-a final grade will be assigned.

(Exceptions due to extenuating circumstances may be considered.)

MAXIMUM CREDIT LOAD

You may enroll in a maximum of 12 units* in the six-week Main Session and a maximum of eight quarter units in the four-week Post Session.

Permission to exceed these limits may be requested by a regularly enrolled (continuing) student from the Dean of the school in which the excess units will be taken. Students who have never attended or are attending for the summer only may request permission to exceed maximum units from the Dean of Extended Education.

Forms for this purpose are available from the Office of Admissions and Records and the Summer Sessions Office.

**CSUDH is on the quarter system calendar. Units are quarter system units. One quarter unit equals 1.5 semester units.*

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Independent Study is designed primarily for regularly enrolled, matriculated students to supplement and enhance their regular course of study.

Many faculty members may not be available to supervise projects during the summer months. Therefore, it is important to plan Independent Study early enough to make other arrangements if a particular supervisor is unavailable.

To enroll in an Independent Study, you must complete the appropriate form, available from departmental and school offices, **before enrolling**. The form requires the signatures of the supervising faculty member and the Dean of the school.

Only those course numbers listed in this *Bulletin* may be used. Be careful to record the correct section number, as these numbers correspond to the session and the number of units assigned. *The same registration deadlines apply to Independent Study courses as to regularly scheduled courses in Main and Post Sessions, and the same policies on late registration apply.*

Special requirements apply to Independent Study involving foreign travel, including the completion of a written agreement between the student and the University. Contact the Summer Session office for more information.

COURSE CANCELLATIONS AND SCHEDULE CHANGES

The University reserves the right to make changes in this schedule as printed. When enrollment in any class is not sufficient to justify its continuance, the course may be cancelled. Faculty may be reassigned from one class to another to adjust to the distribution of enrollment. Meeting times may also be changed when circumstances require.

If the University cancels a class, the student will receive a full refund of applicable fees **UPON APPLICATION FOR REFUND** or will be allowed to register in another class without payment of the late fee.

PARKING

All vehicles parked anywhere on the University campus must have an appropriate parking decal affixed to the left rear bumper or a permit visible in the rear window. Summer Session parking permit decals may be purchased from the Cashier (SC B130) from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Fridays.

Students who register in advance by mail must purchase their parking decal/permit in person.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Registration and parking fees can be paid by cash, check or money order (payable to California State University Dominguez Hills), or by Visa or MasterCard.

REFUND OF FEES

Course fees

If you officially withdraw from the University or reduce your unit load, you MAY be eligible for a refund of some of your fees. Refunds are not automatic, even if the University cancels the class. Refunds must be applied for. The amount of refund depends upon when the application for refund is received.

Refund application forms for students who are withdrawing from the University are available in the University Information and Service Center (SC A 130). If you are dropping a class or want a refund for a cancelled class, you may obtain the proper forms at the same location.

Summer Sessions refunds are determined using the following guidelines:

- A. Fee collected in error (includes cancellation of class by University)-100 percent
- B. Any fee paid by a student who is unable to continue a course because of compulsory military service or because of his death or disability. In each such case, the circumstances shall be stated upon the application for refund-100 percent.
- C. Withdrawal from a course (whether or not in conjunction with withdrawal from the University).
 1. Prior to the date a late registration fee is required (Main Session, June 18, Post Session, August 3)-total fees minus a \$10 processing fee;

2. After the above dates:

- a. First two days of class (Main Session, June 21, 22), (Post Session, August 4, 5)-total fees minus \$25;
- b. Any other day of first week (Main Session, June 23, 24, 25, Post Session, August 5, 6)-total tuition paid minus \$25, times 65 percent (plus Student Activity and Student Center fees upon complete withdrawal);
- c. Any day of the second week (Main Session, June 28, 29, 30, July 1, 2, Post Session, August 9-13)-Total tuition paid minus \$25, times 25 percent (plus Student Activity and Student Center fees upon complete withdrawal);
- d. After July 9 (Main Session), August 13 (Post Session). No refund.

3. Special policies apply to courses scheduled off-cycle (e.g., intensive offerings).

Parking - The following refund schedule refers to calendar days commencing on the date of the term when instruction begins.

To obtain a refund, you must attach all or part of the parking decal (at least the decal number), or all of the permit, to a Request for Refund form. The form is available at the Cashier's Office and when completed should be turned in at that office.

STUDENT SERVICES



LEARNING ASSISTANCE CENTER-ERC A103, 516-3827

The Learning Assistance Center provides comprehensive student services in two major program areas:

Personal Learning Skills for students who need to improve their abilities in basic skills such as reading, writing, spelling, notetaking and test taking.

Tutorial Programs for students with difficulties in a specific course.

Individual and group tutoring is available.

TESTING OFFICE - SC C144A, 516-3909

The Testing Office provides the following services:

National Test Programs-Information and registration materials for the GRE, SAT, ACT, DAT, LSAT, GMAT, MCAT and the CLEP (credit by exam programs).

Individual Diagnostic Testing-Interest inventories and other diagnostic instruments are administered to students who have been referred by counselors in the Student Development or Health and Psychological Services.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES - The Union (cafeteria/student area), 516-3559

The Union Service Desk is the main information center for all activities on campus. An activities counselor works with students and faculty to develop a variety of programs, designed around student interest and schedules.

The service desk schedules student-initiated activities. All information and announcements posted on campus bulletin boards are cleared through this area.

The staff works closely with the Student Association and can answer questions about student government. It also works with chartered clubs and serves as liaison between students and University administration.

The Information and Service Center is the point of contact and referral for prospective University applicants, students seeking fee waivers, and students who withdraw from the University. Pre-admission academic counseling is done through the center.

The center maintains a centralized calendar of all activities on campus.

Supplementary information service is provided by the Department of Public Safety, next door in SCC A122, when the Center is closed.

The Cafeteria will be open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-3 p.m. during the summer.

RECREATION FACILITIES - GYM B106, 516-3893

Physical education facilities including aquatics facility, gymnasium, tennis courts, volleyball courts, track and outdoor fields may be used for recreation by Summer Session students. Check with the Athletic Facilities Coordinator, 516-3893, for schedule of availability.

DUAL REGISTRATION/CON- CURRENT ENROLLMENT

Concurrent enrollment in resident courses, or in extension courses, in another institution is permitted only when the entire program has received the approval of the departmental major advisor and of the evaluations section of the Office of Admissions. This approval must be obtained before any coursework is started. The purpose of this procedure is to assure that all courses taken elsewhere will meet the requirements of CSU Dominguez Hills and that the total program will not constitute an excessive study load. Concurrent enrollment forms are available from the Office of Admissions and Records.

CAMPUS MAP

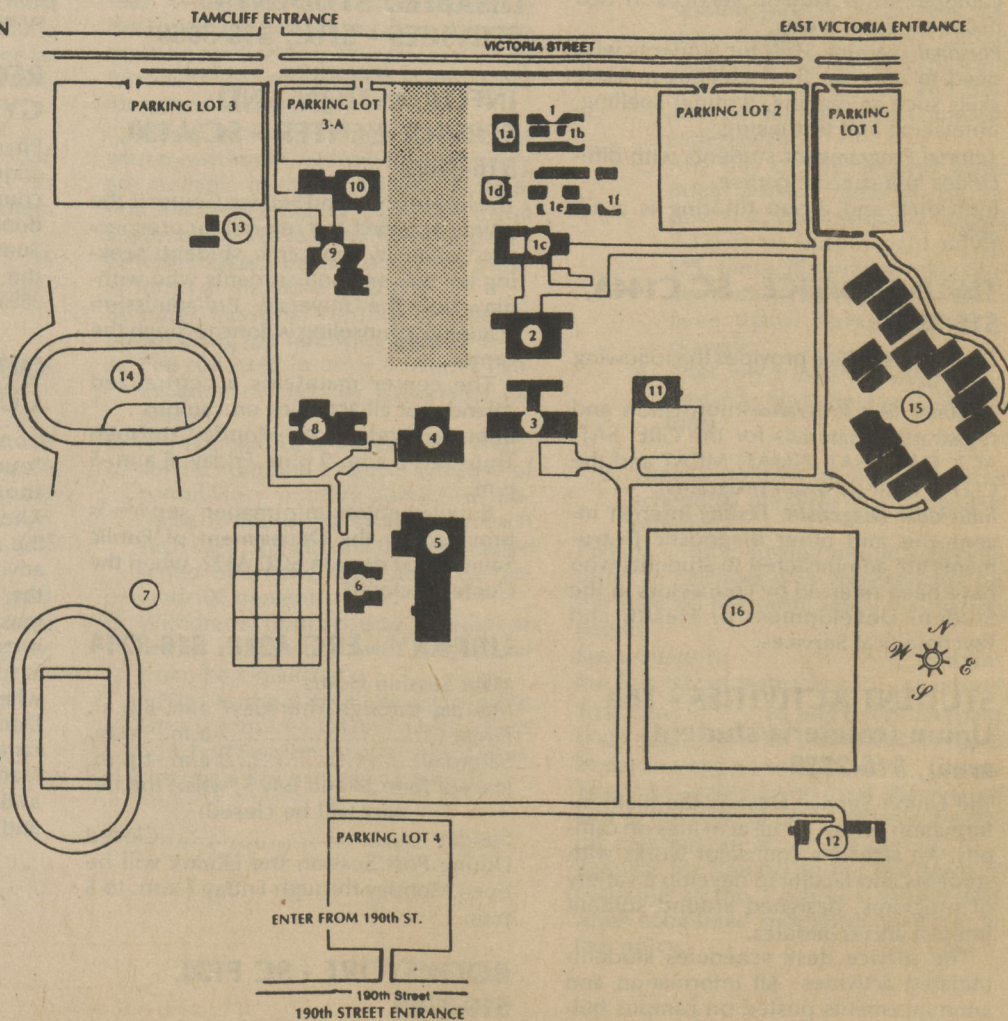


GEOGRAPHICAL BUILDING LOCATION
