Program Description

The Human Services major at CSUDH is a single subject major (no minor required) that prepares students who earn the B.A. degree for employment in a variety of professional service careers. It is like a degree in social work, and it is a great major for people who want meaningful jobs helping others and serving their communities. The program also offers a concentration in Mental Health Recovery for those interested.

This interdisciplinary program includes:

Supervised work in the field of human services through a series of fieldwork courses.
