If a Fire Occurs

DO

- Report the fire. ALL FIRES regardless of size must be reported immediately by calling 911 or 310-243-3333
- Remove anyone in the immediate area, and close all doors as you leave.
- Activate the nearest fire alarm pull station.
- Use stairs to evacuate from upper floors. Exit calmly, keep to your right and continue going until you are safely outside.
- Attempt to extinguish the fire, only if safe to do so.
- Remain calm, help is on the way.

DON'T

- X Don't use elevators.
- X Don't randomly break windows. Falling glass creates a serious threat to passersby and rescuers below.



- X Don't exit until you have felt the top of the exit door. If the door is hot, or if excessive smoke prevents your exit, keep the door closed.
- Don't go back for your personal belongings if ordered to leave the building.
- X Don't panic.

Fire Prevention tips for your work area

Be Prepared • Know the exit rou

- Know the exit routes from your office, floor and building. Study these in advance.
- Know the location of fire extinguishers and how to use them.
- Keep a flashlight in your desk, check the batteries quarterly.
- Always know the location of the nearest fire exit and fire alarm pull station.
- Post emergency numbers next to your phones.
- Report any unsafe conditions to the EH&S Hotline 310-243**-3000.**
- ALL CAMPUS FIRES must be reported to 911 or 310-243-3333.

Fire Prevention Safety Tips

- 1. Keep walkways and exits clear.
- 2. Keep fire doors closed when not in use (never prop them open).
- 3. Store supplies and equipment in appropriate locations and limit the quantities of stored flammable materials. All storage must be in compliance with CA Fire Code and applicable regulations.
- 4. Use microwaves and toaster ovens in authorized locations only.
- 5. Eliminate the use of unauthorized personal appliances, such as hot plates, microwaves, refrigerators or space heaters.
- **6.** Report fire hazards immediately to the EHS Hotline 310-243**-3000**

If You Become Trapped During a Fire...

- Call the Campus Police at 911 or 310-243-3333 and tell them your exact location and your situation. They will notify the Fire Department.
- Place a blanket or similar article along the bottom of the door to keep out smoke. If possible, wet the material first.
- Retreat. Close as many doors between you and the fire as possible.
- Hang a light colored material out the window to attract the attention of rescue teams below. DO NOT JUMP. DO NOT BREAK THE WINDOW.

Remember P.A.S.S. When Using a Fire Extinguisher

P ull the pin that unlocks the lever (Some models may have the base of the fire. another lever-release mechanism)

S queeze handle firmly.

S weep the nozzle back and forthas you advance.
