Updated (Fall 2004) RTP CRITERIA FOR FACULTY in

Digital Media Arts

Because the teaching of Digital Media Arts relies so heavily on a faculty member's expertise in technology, media production, and equipment operation, the department of **Digital Media Arts** which offers degree options in 1) **Audio Recording**, 2) **Music Technology**, and 3) **Television Arts** within the <u>Division of Performing</u>, <u>Visual</u>, and <u>Digital Media Arts</u> has created its own "RTP Criteria and performance standards" for the evaluation of faculty within the department of Digital Media Arts. These performance standards also include special criteria that the department feels are unique to the teaching of digital media arts.

EFFECTIVE TEACHING (one or any combination of the following criteria):

- 1. <u>Perceived Teaching Effectiveness</u> the faculty member demonstrates effective teaching by providing favorable PTE data from courses in his/her particular area of expertise.
- 2. <u>Student Advising</u> the faculty member is effective as a concerned advisor and mentor in bridging the gap between school and the world of professional work by: a) guiding students in the selection of appropriate courses in their major and minor; and b) guiding students in *networking* activities for contacts with professional associations, internships, employers, and extracurricular activities and events in the field.
- 3. <u>Student Success</u> the faculty member provides evidence of: a) student success such as student awards and/or honors for media work and productions; b) placement of students in internships and jobs in the industry; and c) graduates who are having successful careers in the highly-competitive media industry.

"HOLARLY / CREATIVE ACTIVITY (one or any combination of the following criteria):

- 1. <u>Scholarly Activity</u> the faculty member is active in research, publishing, judging, professional associations, and/or innovation in his/her academic discipline. For tenure or promotion, a faculty member must provide evidence of these activities at the national, regional, or local level within the probationary period or most recent period of RTP review.
- 2. <u>Creative Activity</u> the faculty member is active in writing, composing, producing, directing, engineering and/or authoring of music, video, interactive, or experimental techniques and technologies in digital media. For tenure or promotion, a faculty member must provide evidence of these activities at the national, regional, or local level within the probationary period or most recent period of RTP review.

SERVICE ACTIVITIES (one or any combination of the following criteria):

- 1. <u>University Committee Service</u> the faculty member is active on department, school, and/or university-level committees which can also include work with the faculty union at the local or state level.
- 2. <u>Community Service</u> the faculty member is active in civic, nonprofit, educational, and/or corporate outreach efforts which promote the department's programs and the University.
- 3. <u>Media Support for Campus Events</u> the faculty member coordinates student assistance and/or provides personal production expertise in the areas of music, video, audio, and/or internet to support special events and media needs of the campus.
 - <u>Facility Design, Installation, and Maintenance</u> the faculty member is actively involved in: a) designing and updating the program's production facilities to effectively serve student learning needs; b) researching and procuring new hardware and software to keep department facilities up to date; c) integrating and installing new equipment into existing systems and facilities; and d) maintaining and repairing equipment and facilities in a timely manner in order to minimize "down time" for courses and student production work.

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
