Dr. Erica D. Diminich is a Clinician-Scientist, Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology and Faculty Affiliate in the School of Public Health at California State University, Dominguez Hills in California, and Adjunct Faculty in the Program of Public Health at the Renaissance School of Medicine, Stony Brook University in New York. Dr. Diminich received her PhD in Clinical Psychology with a concentration in Research Design and Statistics, from Columbia University. She completed her clinical internship at Mount Sinai-St. Luke's Roosevelt hospital in New York City specializing in neurodegenerative diseases, neuropsychological assessments, and diagnosis. Dr. Diminich completed her postdoctoral fellowship in molecular biomarkers and psychosis at New York University Langone School of Medicine and advanced postdoctoral training in cognitive aging, social inequalities and neuroepidemiology with Dr. Sean Clouston in the Program of Public Health at Stony Brook University.

Dr. Diminich is a National Institute on Aging (NIA) Butler Williams Scholar and NIA Alzheimer's disease Resource Center for Minority Aging Research (AD-RCMAR), Research Scientist. Her research supported by the NIA and Alzheimer's Association centers on cognitive and biological aging and Alzheimer's disease and related dementia (ADRD) brain health disparities among Foreign Born Latino adults with a focus on 1) understanding the neurobiological stress response to migration related stressors on brain health and early risk of ADRD and 2) examining the feasibility and utility of blood-based biomarkers of AD for early detection of ADRD neuropathology in community based cohorts.
