

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ANTHROPOLOGY



NEW! Uncovering the **Ancient Maya Civilization**

This course explores the Ancient Maya civilization from its beginnings in the 2nd millennium BC through the Spanish Invasion in the early 1500s AD. The Classic Maya have fascinated public and scholarly audiences the world over. As one of the few major

ancient civilizations to have emerged in a tropical jungle setting, they are often labeled as "mysterious" or "enigmatic." The Classic Maya developed intricate calendrical, architectural, and ideological

systems. This course seeks to present the true nature of Maya civilization as it is understood from the archaeological record, Classic Maya texts, and through insights from contemporary Maya communities.

Ken Seligson is an Associate Professor in the Anthropology Department at CSUDH. He has conducted archaeological research on Ancient Maya human-environment relationships in Yucatan, Mexico since 2010





NEW! Black Woman on Board: Claudia Hampton's Fight to Save Affirmative Action

Black Woman on Board examines the leadership strategies that Black women educators have employed as influential power brokers in predominantly white colleges and universities in the United States.

Dr. Nicol's recently published book tells the extraordinary story of Dr. Claudia H. Hampton, the first Black woman trustee of the California State University (CSU) system, who later became the board's first female chair. The book covers her twenty-year fight



(1974–94) to increase access to the CSU for historically marginalized and underrepresented groups. Amid a growing white backlash against the changes brought on by the Civil Rights and Black Power Movements of the 1960s, Nicol argues that Hampton employed "sly civility" to persuade fellow trustees, CSU system officials, and state lawmakers to enforce federal and state affirmative action mandates.
