INCREASE IN STUDENT PREPAREDNESS

- High school GPAs of first-time freshmen have been steadily increasing.
- Average GPA for 2012 freshmen was 3.09, up from 3.02 in 2011.
- Preparation rates have also been rising.

Percent of Freshmen who needed remediation in English and/or Math has decreased:

- Fall 2009: 94.2%
- Fall 2010: 87.3%
- Fall 2011: 81.5%
- Fall 2012: 81.2%
- Fall 2013: 80.5%



Bridge Results

- The Bridge Initiative has been highly successful in preparing first-time freshmen in English and math, and bridging them for two-years
- From 2009-2013, over 95% of Bridge participants completed developmental English/math courses the summer before starting at CSUDH.
- Bridge participants have nearly tripled from 104 students in 2009 to 644 students in 2013.
- Bridge program students who begin with two semesters of math and/or English remediation required have a <u>much stronger</u> chance of persistence.
 - Over the last 4-5 years, they are generally 10-20 percentage points higher in retention.
- Bridge students are persisting at much higher rates than the control group.



- EMSA drives prospective students to the CSUDH website through print and outdoor advertising, direct mail, collateral and email marketing.
- As a result, website traffic at CSUDH.EDU has substantially increased.


