

APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC CHILD WELFARE STIPEND County of Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS)

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE DCFS TITLE IV-E STIPEND*

1. Nature of Stipend: The County of Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Title IV-E Stipend provides for two years of support of \$26,000 per year (\$52,000 total) for full-time students in the Master of Social Work program. This stipend and the MSW program are designed to prepare students for careers in public child welfare. Students will spend their Generalist Practice year placement at a community-based agency or organization. The Specialized Practice year placement will be at the County of Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), which is a public child welfare agency.

2. Work Requirements: Students must sign a contract agreeing to pay back this award by securing employment with the County of Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) within 120 days of graduation. Students will work at one of the DCFS regional offices within the County of Los Angeles. They must work two years for the two years of aid awarded. During this payback period, salary and benefits are received. DCFS hosts employment information sessions in the spring semester of your second year, so you can be apprised of all your options. A student may be released from the payback requirements under certain hardship conditions.

3. *Work Interruption:* A graduate who terminates employment before the payback requirement is completed must repay the full stipend. If there has been partial fulfillment of the work commitment, the amount owed will be prorated. Waivers of repayment may be made in case of permanent disability or death. If a graduate is laid off because of county budget cuts, he/she/they will not be penalized. However, he/she/they must participate in an active job search again.

4. *Payback Requirements:* Students are responsible for payback of stipends and any costs of collection under the following circumstances:

- a) failure to complete the MSW within the normative two-year period (unless a hardship extension is granted);
- b) failure to accept appropriate employment at the County of Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services;
- c) failure to qualify for any public child welfare agency employment, as a result of failing interviews, medical or psychological exams, or criminal clearance;
- d) failure to disclose a past or subsequent conviction for a felony or a crime involving harm to children; driving under the influence conviction within the last five (5) years;
- e) voluntary termination of employment before completion of the work requirement due to poor or improper conduct; and
- f) termination of employment before completion of the work requirement due to poor or improper conduct; and
- g) violation of the NASW Code of Ethics.

*Please note that the Title IV-E stipend award is contingent upon the availability of Title IV-E funds.

- (5) What is your understanding of the duties and responsibilities of a public child welfare worker?

2. Please provide no more than a one-page response to the following vignette and question.

Lopez Family: mother, father, and three children; the oldest is Eduardo, a 10-year-old male. Suspected child abuse report alleges that Eduardo was severely physically abused, because he got bad grades on his report card. When you get to the home, the mother tells you that her husband beats Eduardo, but she cannot say anything because she is afraid of him. You have previously conducted a criminal record check and found out that he was convicted of an assault charge (related to domestic violence) two years ago. As a public child welfare worker, what would be your goal here? Tell us three things you would do to address your goal.

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CLEARANCES REQUIRED FOR FIELD PLACEMENTS

DCFS student interns will be expected to meet all requirements and clearances required of public child welfare agencies. Those include:

- Submit to and pass a background clearance
- Submit to and pass physical exam
- Submit to and pass psychological exam

Individuals who have a criminal background <u>may or may not</u> be excluded from DCFS as a placement agency. In order to determine if a criminal record might prevent eligibility for a DCFS placement, please answer the following questions:

(All responses will be kept confidential and will be shared only for the purposes of determining field placement eligibility.)

1. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? (includes misdemeanor and/or felony) _____yes ____no (If your response is no, you may skip the remaining questions and sign and date form at the bottom of page.)

2. Please identify any and all convictions and provide the following information for each:

- a. What was official conviction?
- b. In what State were you arrested/convicted?
- c. Was conviction a felony or misdemeanor?
- d. When were you convicted?
- e. Results of conviction (incarceration, probation, parole)?
- f. If you were on probation or parole, when did it conclude?
- g. Have you met all the stipulations of the Court or is anything still pending?
- h. Will your conviction show up on a Live Scan or other background clearance check?

3. Please provide any additional information that you believe might prevent you from meeting the required clearances outlined above.

As previously stated, there are some convictions and other circumstances (e.g., length of time since the conviction) that will not negatively affect a student's placement in DCFS. However, failure to disclose a criminal background may impact our ability to place a student with DCFS and would thus make the student ineligible for this placement and the DCFS stipend.
