ABOUT THE CSUDH MSW PROGRAM

We are dedicated to pursuing a more just, global society by advancing anti-racist social work education, research, and community-centered practice that address societal dynamics stemming from intersectional oppression. Accredited by the Council of Social Work Education (CSWE), the program requires sixty (60) units of coursework in addition to 1,028 hours of field practicum. Our graduates meet educational requirements to register as an Associate Clinical Social Worker (ASW) toward a License of Clinical Social Work (LCSW) through the California Board of Behavioral Sciences.

UNIQUE FEATURES

- Since its inception, our program has been at the forefront of integrating Critical Race Theory and Intersectionality into social work practice.
- Small, cohort-based, on-campus program offering individualized attention and a close-knit community with life-long connections.
- Our faculty are as diverse as our student body. They each have expertise; yet they understand the uniqueness of CSUDH students.

SPECIALIZATIONS

In their specialization year, students complete specialized courses that are complemented by their second internship practicum. Part-time students specialize in Community Mental Health (CMH) but may explore other interests through various tasks assigned in practicum. Full-time students choose among the following: Children, Youth, and Families (CYF), Community Capacity Building (CCB), or Community Mental Health (CMH).
