#### What is SUMMER SESSIONS and How Can It Benefit You?

#### **Fees**

Summer Session Undergraduate fees are \$312 per unit (\$936 for a 3-unit class). Graduate student fees are \$375 per unit (\$1,125 for a 3-unit class). To receive credit for Summer Session classes, course fees must be paid in full before the end of the third week of classes. (See calendar on page 3). Fees for qualified Certificate students are \$352 per unit or \$1,056 for a 3-unit class.

Registration is not considered complete until we receive bank clearance for your check, or until we receive authorization for your credit card. You will receive confirmation of enrollment via e-mail, provided we have a valid e-mail address for you on record. Additionally, you should receive a confirmation letter within two weeks after we receive your registration and fees. If you choose to mail in your registration forms and fees, your confirmation of enrollment and ID card will be mailed to you.

Courses you enroll in become part of your permanent academic record at CSUDH. Summer Session students are subject to the same withdrawal, grading and academic policies as degree students.

If a student drops a class on or before May 26, 100% of the fees will be refunded (less \$10 processing fee). From May 27 to June 3, 75% of the fees will be refunded. From June 4 to June 10, 50% of the fees will be refunded. Beginning June 11, no refund will be made.

#### Refunds: Summer Session 1

#### **Refunds: Summer Session 2**

If a student drops a class on or before July 6, 100% of the fees will be refunded (less \$10 processing fee). From July 7 until July 12, 75% of the fees will be refunded. From July 13 to July 19, 50% of the fees will be refunded. Beginning July 20, no refund will be made.

Refunds are not automatic. You must file appropriate forms in the College of

Continuing and Professional Education office in order to receive a refund. Refunds take a minimum of six to eight weeks for processing. Do not put a stop-payment on a check to withdraw from a course. This results in a financial obligation to the University for the course fee, plus an additional \$25 charge, plus a \$25 late fee. If the University cancels a class, the student will receive a full refund of applicable fees or will be allowed to register in another class without payment of a late fee.

#### **Dishonored Check Policy**

Once a check has been dishonored, no personal checks will be accepted from that person for a period of at least two academic terms. This rule applies to any check returned from any financial institution for any reason. The person will be required to pay all university-related debts with a certified check, money order or traveler's check(s) including the \$25.00 returned check fee. Discrepancies not resolved before final exams may result in loss of credit for the class.

#### **Verification of Enrollment**

To verify that you have been officially enrolled in your classes, check the instructor's printed class roster which is published the fourth week of the term. Summer Sessions students will appear on the same roster as students enrolled in degree programs. If your name is not on the roster, call the College of Continuing & Professional Education Office immediately. It is the student's responsibility to initiate inquiries regarding his/her registration in a course. Discrepancies not resolved before final exams may result in loss of credit for the class.

#### **Academic Eligibility** and Credit Information

All Qualified Students are eligible to register for CSUDH Summer Sessions. This includes students attending other universities, students who are not currently enrolled in college, international students, and qualified high school students. High school students who are rising juniors and above can take lowerdivision courses with the permission of their high school counselor and principal.

#### **New or Returning Students**

You are a new student if you have not attended CSUDH previously.

You are a returning student if you:

- are an undergraduate student and ... have not enrolled for two or more ... semesters:
- are a graduate student and have not . enrolled for one semester;
- attended another academic institution since last attending CSUDH; or
- graduated from CSUDH and choose ... to begin post-graduate studies.

Returning students must reapply for admission.

Failure to pay registration fees will result in cancellation of your application and you will be required to reapply for any subsequent term.

#### Returning from an approved planned educational leave

You must submit a completed CSU application (no application fee required) to Admission and Records as official notification of your intent to return from an approved Planned Educational Leave. If you have taken courses at another institution during your leave, you must also provide official transcripts. To be eligible for Registration, your application to return must be submitted and processed prior to the Registration dates listed earlier (the deadline to submit an application to return from a Planned Leave is the first day of the academic term in which you plan to return). Please contact Admissions & Records for further questions concerning Planned Educational Leave processing at (310) 243-3645.

#### **Continuing Students**

You are considered a continuing student if you:

- attended CSUDH as a matriculated ... student in the Spring 2025 or Fall .... 2024 semester;
- are a graduate student who has ..... attended CSUDH as a matriculated ... student in the Fall 2024 semester;
- have not attended another academic institution since attending CSUDH; ... and have not applied to graduate .... from CSUDH in the Fall 2025 term.

#### **Mathematics Classes**

Students wishing to enroll in several mathematics classes will have to provide evidence of having satisfied the ELM requirements. This requirement can be satisfied by either of the following methods.

- Passing the ELM examination administered by the University Testing Office (call 310-243-3909 for information).
- Transcripts showing passing grades on college level mathematics courses. CSUDH graduates can have their records verified bu the Office of Admissions and Records.

Official verification must be received by the Continuing Education Registration office before the student can enroll in mathematics classes. Verification may be obtained at the University Advisement Center (located in Welch Hall), or the Math Department (Natural Sciences & Mathematics Building), room A-132.

#### Course Numbering System

The course numbering system for the University is based upon three-digit numbers as follows:

000-099 Sub-collegiate courses, not for baccalaureate credit

100-199 Lower division courses, normally taken in the freshman year

200-299 Lower division courses, normally taken in the sophomore year

300-399 Upper division courses, normally taken in the junior year

400-499 Upper division courses, normally taken in the senior year 500-599 Graduate courses, normally limited to graduate students

#### Use of the I.D. Card

The I.D. Card must be carried at all times and be validated each term. A current

I.D. Card is necessary to perform certain transactions in Admissions, Records and Registration, the Library, the Business Office and other campus offices. I.D. cards for Summer Sessions students will be issued at the Continuing Education Office.

#### **Use of Social Security Number**

CSUDH provides all students with generic 9 digit student ID numbers. These ID numbers are used to identify student records, registration, and to conduct all University business. However, students are still required to provide the University with their correct social security numbers (individual taxpayer identification numbers) pursuant to the authority contained in Section 41201, Title 5, California Code of Regulations, and Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code. The University uses the social security number to identify records pertaining to the student and, if needed, to collect debts owed the University. Also, the Internal Revenue Service requires the University to file information returns that include the student's social security number and other information such as the amount paid for qualified tuition, related expenses, and interest on educational loans. That information is used to help determine whether a student, or a person claiming a student as a dependent, may take a credit or deduction to reduce federal income taxes. Students who do not have a social security number at the time of enrollment will be required to obtain a social security number and submit it to the University within sixty days. Failure to furnish a correct social security number may result in the imposition of a penalty by the Internal Revenue Service.

#### **Immigration Requirements** for Licensure

On August 27, 1996, Governor Pete Wilson issued Executive Order W-135-96 which requested that the CSU and other state agencies implement "as expeditiously as reasonably practicable" the provision of The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRAWORA) of 1996 Reconciliation Act (PRAWORA) of 1996

(P.L.104-193). The Act, also known as the Welfare Reform Act, included provisions to eliminate eligibility for federal and state public benefits for certain categories of lawful immigrants as well as benefits for all illegal immigrants.

Students who will require a professional or commercial license provided by a local, state, or federal government agency in order to engage in an occupation for which the CSU may be training them must meet the immigration requirements of the new Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act to achieve licensure. Information concerning the regulation is available from the Vice President of Student Affairs, (310) 243-3784.

#### Important Tax Credit Information

If you are enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program or are taking courses to acquire or improve job skills, you may qualify for a Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning Tax Credit. The Hope Scholarship Tax Credit is available only to students in their first two years of postsecondary education who are enrolled at least half-time in an eligible program. The tax credits are based on the amount of qualified tuition and fees, less grants and other tax-free educational assistance and the taxpayer's modified adjusted gross income. Hope credits apply to fees paid after December 31, 1997.

#### The Lifetime Learning Tax Credit

The Lifetime Learning tax credit is available to students at all educational and enrollment levels who are enrolled at an eligible educational institution. As with the Hope Scholarship tax credit, this opportunity is based on the amount of qualified tuition and fees, less grants and other tax-free educational assistance and the taxpayer's modified adjusted gross income. The Lifetime Learning credit applies to fees paid after June 30, 1998.

#### Americans with Disabilities Act

It is the policy of California State University Dominguez Hills to comply with the Section 504 Regulations [now, Americans with Disabilities Act] adopted by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Accordingly, any student at California State University Dominguez Hills who believes that there

has been a violation of the Regulations is encouraged to discuss the matter with the appropriate CSUDH college, the campus Handicapped Regulations Coordinator, and/ or the Handicapped Services Coordinator, and such persons as may be identifed by the Handicapped Regulations Coordinator in order to resolve the matter in a prompt and equitable manner.

#### **Sexual Harassment Policy**

It is the policy of California State University, Dominguez Hills, that the campus maintain a working and learning environment free from sexual harassment of its students, employees, and those who apply for student or employee status. All should be aware that California State University, Dominguez Hills is concerned and will take action to eliminate sexual harassment. Sexual harassment includes such behavior as sexual advances, request for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature directed towards an employee, student, or applicant when one or more of the following circumstances are present:

- Submission to or toleration of the conduct is an explicit or implicit term or condition of appointment, employment, admission or academic evaluation:
- Submission to rejection of such conduct is used as a basis for a personnel decision or an academic evaluation: The conduct has the purpose or effect of interfering with an employee's work performance, or creating an intimidating, hostile, offensive or otherwise adverse learning environment, or adversely affecting any student. In determining whether conduct actually constitutes sexual harassment, the circumstances surrounding the conduct will be carefully considered. However, where the facts support the allegations, all appropriate measures including disciplinary action will be taken.
