

Changes to Expect

To comply with state regulations and help reduce CSUDH's impact on the environment, you will notice some new changes to our campus waste system:

INSIDE BUILDINGS

Individual campus trash bins, including in classrooms, offices, and shared study areas, have been removed and replaced with centrally located, hallway zero waste stations, which are serviced daily. *To request zero waste bins for your office/department space, place a work order request online or by calling x3587.*

OUTSIDE BUILDINGS

Larger zero waste stations can be found outside buildings throughout campus. These are also serviced daily and are perfect for disposing of bulky waste items.

OFFICES

Deskside bins are the personal responsibility of the user and are not serviced by custodial. Please take all personal waste items to a nearby zero waste station serviced daily. Use keys or scissors to flatten cardboard. *If you have waste items that may overflow the zero waste bins, place a work order request online or by calling x3587.*

OFFICE CLEAN-UPS/MOVE-OUTS

To request bins for an office clean-up/move-out and/or to remove bulk items, *place a work order request online or by calling x3587.*

HELPFUL TIP:

For zero waste or custodial service requests, contact Work Control via the online form or by calling x3587.

Other Zero Waste Initiatives

Hydration Stations

Instead of buying a single-use plastic bottle, fill up your reusable bottle at one of our hydration stations available campus-wide on every water fountain!



Toro Token & Dining Discounts

Purchase a Toro Token for a reusable container to use at Campus Dining locations. Then, exchange for another Toro Token to use for your next visit.

You can also get a 10% off discount for coffee if you bring a reusable mug!



Battery Recycling Pick-up

Battery recycling containers are available to the public at select locations. Additional containers and pick-up can be requested via campus work control.



Printer Cartridge Recycling

Toner and inkjet cartridges may be recycled through a request to campus work control. Must be placed in original packaging or box.

How to Sort Your Waste in the New Zero Waste Stations

RECYCLING



Acceptable items that can go in the **RECYCLING** bin:

- Paper, including newspaper, envelopes, magazines, etc.
- Flattened cardboard
- Plastics #1-#7, including milk jugs, water/soda bottles, etc.
- Aluminum/metal cans
- Glass bottles/food jars

TIP

Make sure all recyclables are free of food and liquid!

LANDFILL



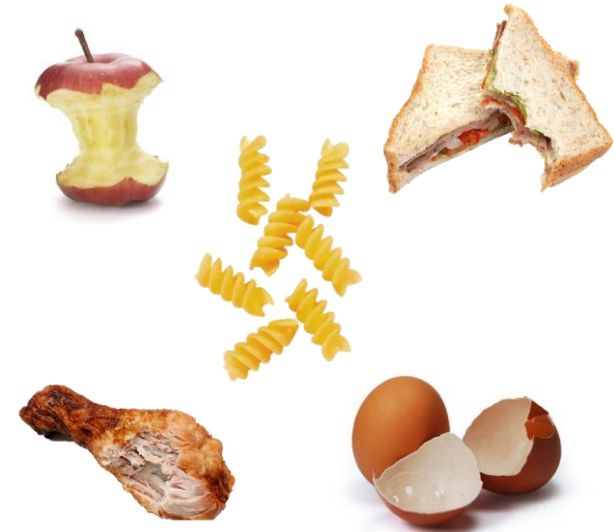
Acceptable items that can go in the **LANDFILL** bin:

- Plastic bags, wrappers, flexible packaging, etc.
- Plastic utensils and straws
- Napkins/tissues
- Styrofoam containers and packaging
- Stickers/address labels

TIP

Try switching from single-use to reusable options when possible!

COMPOST



Acceptable items that can go in the **COMPOST** bin:

- Food scraps including fruits, veggies, breads, meats, bones, eggs, etc.
- Please **NO** packaging, napkins, or compostable eatware
- You may use a CLEAR bag to dispose your food scraps

TIP

Try saving leftovers for a snack or meal later in the day!
