Food Support

- Time Out LA: List of restaurants offering free meals to evacuees.
- <u>AUSD Meal Distribution (Grab & Go Food Locations)</u>: From 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Jan. 10, Los Angeles Unified has 16 sites to provide meals for students. District families may stop by and walk into any of these locations to receive two meals per student. This will only be available for Los Angeles Unified students A student does not need to be present for families to pick up the meals.

- <u>SAVE | California Fire Foundation</u> The SAVE card is a \$250 gift card given to *eligible survivors of fire and natural disasters by firefighters on scene who are enrolled in the SAVE program. This allows survivors to purchase necessities such as food, clothing, gas, medicine, or a place to stay the night in the immediate aftermath of a house fire.
- <u>Salvation Army</u>

The Salvation Army provides grants to those displaced by fires and financial assistance for immediate and long-term needs of fire victims. It also operates shelters and provides emergency housing for those fleeing fires.

Loan Support

As the devastating wildfires continue to impact our Los Angeles community, Jewish Free Loan Association (JFLA) is
here to provide critical financial support to those in need. Our hearts go out to all those affected by this disaster, and
we stand ready to help you in this time of crisis. JFLA offers zero-interest, zero-fee emergency loans of up to \$15,000
to <u>eligible applicants</u>. These loans can be used for essential expenses such as: Don't have a guarantor? JFLA
understands that not everyone has access to a guarantor. That is why we are also offering a limited number of loans
without guarantors of up to \$2,000 to people affected by the wildfires. These will go out on a first-come first-serve
