






Whether and Where CA Students Attend College






LA County: High School Senior Enrollment and UC/CSU Eligible Graduates Trends 2016-17 to 2023-24

WHY IT MATTERS



FTEs = Full-Time Equivalents




15 units = **1.0** FTE

Xiomara is taking 15 units, which equals 1 FTE.

Makenna is taking 6 units, a fraction of 1 FTE or 6/15, which equals .4 FTE.

Total FTEs 1.0 + 0.4 = 1.4 FTEs






Full-time and Part-time




CSUDH Annualized FTES 2016-2024 Chancellor's Office Target vs Actual





2023-24 Enrolled Students by Percentages






New Student Enrollment Trends The XYZ Context



In 2022-23, CSUs were organized into groups based on enrollment levels.

The groups will adjust annually based on the final resident enrollment level.

- Group X significantly below target
- Group Y below target (CSUDH)
- Group Z near target or above target





Beginning in 2024-25, FTES and associated resources will be **permanently reallocated** from universities with significant enrollment declines to universities that can grow.

The allocation of any **new and reallocated resident** FTES growth will be limited to universities **meeting or exceeding** their current funded target.




New Student Enrollment Trends First-Time Students












LA County Community Colleges Student Headcount Fall 2016-Fall 2023






CSUDH New Transfer Students: AY 2016-17 to 2024-25 Applications, Admits, And Enrolled






SoCal CSU Transfer Student Trends Fall 2016-Fall 2024









Continuing Student Enrollment Trends: Undergraduate Students




Retention and Graduation in Focus

- The enrollment pipeline is a function of both new and continuing students, modified by the mean unit load at any point in time.
- Understanding and projecting the pipeline requires a cohort-specific grasp of retention and graduation rates.
- Shocks to any part of the pipeline can be felt for years, and improvements can take just as long to be fully felt.
- Rearview mirror to understand patterns and continued impact; windshield view to understand what is approaching






CSUDH Full-Time First-Year Student 1-Yr Retention Rates Starting With Fall 2014






CSUDH Community College Transfer Student 1-Yr Retention Rates Starting With Fall 2014






CSUDH Community College Transfer Student ADT/Non-ADT 1-Year Continuation Rates Fall 2016 – Fall 2023






CSUDH Community College Transfer Student ADT/Non-ADT 2-Year Graduation Rates Fall 2016 – Fall 2022






CSUDH Community College Transfer Student Graduation 2- & 4-Year Rates Starting With Fall 2010
